### India evacuates its students out of Tehran, urges other Indians to move out as well

**New Delhi, June 17 (UNI)** Amid the increased bombardment by Israel, India said today it has moved Indian students out of the Iranian capital, and advised other Indians who can to move out of the city as well. In a statement, the Ministry of External Affairs said: "Indian students in Tehran have been moved out of the city for reasons of safety, through arrangements made by the Embassy." "Other residents who are self-sufficient in terms of transport have also been advised to move out of the city in view of the developing situation." "Separately, some Indians have been facilitated to leave Iran through the border with Armenia." "The Embassy remains continuously in touch with the community with a view to extending all feasible assistance. It added that it will continue to issue further advisories given the fluid situation. Israel and Iran have been trading airstrikes for the past few days, after Tel Aviv launched a massive attack on Tehran last week, killing its highest military officials and senior nuclear scientists. There are around 1,300 Indian students, mostly from Kashmir, in Tehran.

### Opposition blasts ruling coalition over infrastructure failures

**Mumbai, June 17 (UNI)** Shiv Sena (UBT) launched a vehement critique of Maharashtra's Mahayuti government through its editorial mouthpiece 'Saamana' on Tuesday, condemning last week's fatal bridge collapse in Pune that claimed the lives of four tourists and injured 51 others as "culpable homicide" stemming from administrative negligence. The editorial asserted that the tragedy resulted directly from authorities' failure to repair the dilapidated Indrayani River bridge despite allocated funds. "People with cruel hearts are ruling Maharashtra," stated the Thackeray faction, dismissing Chief Minister Eknath Shinde's condolences, compensation announcements (Rs 5 lakh per deceased victim), and promised inquiry, as "a sham" and "crocodile tears". Specifically targeting Disaster Management Minister Girish Mahajan — described as the CM's "close associate" — the editorial questioned: "Why put a price of 5 lakh on lives lost to government negligence? Why did these people die? Who will answer?" It revealed that while Rs 8 crore was approved for bridge reconstruction, the funds allocated "remained on paper" as state coffers were allegedly drained by "politically beneficial schemes."

## G7 Summit: Improved ties, energy & tech among PM's top priorities

### PM receives warm welcome from Indian diaspora

**Brampton 17 June:** Prime Minister Narendra Modi's arrival in Canada for the G7 Summit has been warmly welcomed by members of the Indo-Canadian community, who hope the visit will mark a turning point in strained India-Canada relations. Sumit Singh, a Brampton-based Indo-Canadian business tycoon, expressed optimism about the visit. "I wholeheartedly welcome Prime Minister Modi to Canada," he said. "I appreciate Prime Minister Mark Carney's invitation to Mr. Modi. This is a positive step and I hope it leads to the restoration of normalcy in India-Canada relations." Prime Minister Narendra Modi arrived here to attend the G7 Summit at Kananaskis, his first visit to Canada in a decade, with discussions with world leaders to be focussed on crucial global issues, including energy security,



technology and innovation. "At the Summit, the Prime Minister will exchange views with leaders of G-7 countries, other invited outreach countries and Heads of International Organisations on crucial global issues, including energy security, technology and innovation, particularly the AI-energy nexus and Quantum-related issues," the Ministry of External Affairs earlier said. Prime Minister Modi will also hold several bilateral meetings on the sidelines of the Summit, coming over a month after India's Operation Sindoor that had targeted terror infrastructure in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir in retaliation for the April 22 Pahalgaon attacks.

### Sambhaji Brigade demands high-level probe in Kundmala bridge collapse

**Pune, June 17 (UNI)** The Sambhaji Brigade demanded that the Maharashtra government should hold a high-level inquiry into the Kundmala bridge accident and suspend inactive officers immediately. Brigade state spokesperson Santosh Shinde said that innocent people are losing their lives due to the government's mismanagement. "No matter how many years or days you complain, the government will not come to its senses until people die," he said and sought an explanation as to why a new bridge on the Indrayani river was not built despite approval of Rs five crore for the same.

## Service chiefs' Chintan conclave begins, focus on Op Sindoor & Army

**New Delhi, June 17 (UNI)** The two-day Chiefs' Chintan, a structured interaction, between the Chief of the Army Staff (COAS), General Upendra Dwivedi, and former Chiefs of the Army Staff (CsOAS) commenced here on Tuesday. Held in the aftermath of Operation Sindoor, the conclave is aimed to provide a platform to leverage the institutional knowledge and experience of the former Army chiefs, a Defence Ministry statement said. General Dwivedi welcomed the former chiefs and stressed the importance of their continued engagement in shaping the ongoing transformation and future direction of the Indian Army. A key highlight of the event was a comprehensive operational briefing on



Operation Sindoor, including the synergised conduct of operations with the Indian Air Force and Navy. The operation's execution, strategic impact and jointmanship model were presented in detail to provide contextual understanding and invite insights from the former chiefs. The former chiefs were also briefed on the induction of niche technologies and modernisation initiatives aimed at enhancing operational capabilities.

### Pune collector directs all agencies to work together to prevent accidents in future

**Pune, June 17 (UNI)** Following tragic collapse of the Kanthmala bridge over the Indrayani River in the district, which resulted in four deaths and 51 injuries, district collector and chairman of the District Disaster Management Authority, Jitendra Dudi, on Tuesday directed officials to follow set guidelines issued by the district administration during the disaster. Speaking at a meeting held to review the works of the District Disaster Management Authority at the collector's office here, he lamented about the loss of four lives in Kundamala tragedy.

### Maritime security tops Maha govt priorities: Minister Nitesh Rane

**Mumbai, June 17 (UNI)** Maharashtra Minister for Fisheries and Ports Nitesh Rane on Tuesday said that maritime security is a top priority for the state government. He said that to further strengthen maritime security, the government has deployed new high-speed patrol boats. During the inspection of one such patrol boat at Bhaucha Dhakka (also called as Ferry Wharf), he further said that these boats will not only enhance coastal security but also help prevent illegal fishing and protect fishermen. The new patrol boats are equipped with advanced technology, including radar, transponder, and rapid



response systems. Each boat has a capacity of 15 people, including marine police, and is powered by two 250 HP Suzuki engines, enabling a speed of 30 nautical miles. A total of 15 such boats will be deployed, with five already

operational. The minister also mentioned the government's plan to launch the Water Metro project in Mumbai by December 2026, which will provide a convenient and time-saving transportation option for citizens.

## Will BJP now give mafia don Dawood Ibrahim also a chance to join? asks Maha Congress chief

**Mumbai, June 17 (UNI)** Maharashtra Pradesh Congress Committee president Harshvardhan Sapkal today lashed out at the Bharatiya Janata Party, asking whether it was now going to give notorious don Dawood Ibrahim a chance to join the party, with Sudhakar Badgujar, who is allegedly linked to Dawood, having joined the BJP. "The Bharatiya Janata Party considers itself the biggest party in the world, but the party that pretends to be powerful is giving admission to anyone. Till now, the BJP has given admission to only those whom it accused of corruption and also gave them ministerial posts. Now the BJP has given admission to that person who was linked to the mafia Dawood Ibrahim. Will the BJP now give entry to Dawood?" Sapkal said here



today. The Congress state president said that it is the BJP's prerogative to give entry to whomsoever it wants, but the BJP has no idea what it is doing while talking about Hindutva. BJP MLA Nitesh Rane had levelled a serious allegation in the legislature that Sudhakar Badgujar of Nashik had thrown a party for Dawood's goon Salim Kutta. He had also shown photos of Badgujar dancing at the party in the assembly and demanded action. But now Badgujar has accepted Hindutva and the BJP has said that he is welcome (into the party fold). Does this mean that if Dawood will accept Hindutva then he will get entry tomorrow? BJP calls itself a 'party with difference' but today this party is full of goons, crooks and corrupt people, he alleged.

## State cabinet takes 10 major decisions



**Mumbai, June 17 (UNI)** The Mahayuti (BJP alliance) government, headed by Chief Minister Devendra Fadnis, on Tuesday took 10 major decisions in the Cabinet meeting held here, including approval of the Maharashtra Agriculture-Artificial Intelligence (MahaAgri-AI) Policy and waiver in stamp duty on lease agreement between the Special Purpose

Vehicle (SPV) and other agencies in Dharavi Redevelopment Project. The government gave its nod for transfer of 52 hectares land at Jambutke village in Nashik district to Maharashtra Industrial Development Corporation for Tribal Industrial Cluster. With setting up of this cluster, budding entrepreneurs from the tribal community will get encouragement, besides generating employment and boosting economic development. The government gave relief in stamp duty on land required for the joint project of MMRDA and M/s Raigad Pen Growth Centre Ltd. This is the first major project in the state through public-private partnership and the growth centre will attract foreign investment. The government also decided to waive off stamp duty on transfer of land required for Maharashtra National Law University in Mumbai at Mauje Pahadi Goregaon. The university will get a self-owned building. Educational facilities will be available for thousands of students. The Cabinet also gave its sanction for waiver in stamp duty on lease agreement between the special purpose vehicle (SPV) and other agencies in Dharavi Redevelopment Project. Since it is a big project for the public interest, the rehabilitation and redevelopment plan will gain momentum. The implementation of the plan will be done in a smooth manner. The Cabinet also took a decision to set up Automatic Weather Stations (AWS) at the Gram Panchayat level under the WINDS (Weather Information Network Data System) project of the central government. For this, it has been decided to extend the deadline of the Mahavath project. The AWS is expected to provide accurate weather information to all the villages in the state. It is an important project for farmers to get weather-based agricultural advice and guidance.

### Congress accuses Govt of delaying caste census, calls it political diversion

**New Delhi, June 17 (UNI)** The Congress on Tuesday slammed the Modi government for what it called a deliberate "delay in conducting a caste census", accusing it of politicising the issue to divert public attention — much like the women's reservation bill. Congress general secretary Sachin Pilot, while addressing a press conference here, said that the demand for a caste census, led prominently by Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi, has long been a priority for the Congress, and the government has only "yielded to this pressure in principle, not in action". "The Modi government is simply managing headlines, not genuinely addressing the issue," Pilot said, adding that the formal notification lacks any mention of a "caste-based enumeration". "The government has claimed that the caste census will begin in 2027, but concerns are growing due to the glaring budgetary shortfall. Only Rs 574 crore has been allocated, whereas such a massive exercise requires at least Rs 8,000 to 10,000 crore," Pilot alleged.



### SC stays demolition of Thane dargah for 7 days

**New Delhi, June 17 (UNI)** The Supreme Court intervened in an ongoing legal tussle over the demolition of a religious structure in Thane, Maharashtra, by ordering a temporary halt to any further action for seven days. The order provides the Pardeshi Baba Trust, which manages the structure, time to move the Bombay High Court with a recall plea against its earlier demolition directive. A bench of justices Sandeep Mehta and Prasanna B. Varale passed the order while hearing a petition challenging the decision to demolish portions of a dargah that had expanded from an initial 160 sq. ft. to over 17,600 sq. ft.

### Indian Army contingent departs for France to participate in exercise Shakti

**New Delhi, June 17 (UNI)** An Indian Army contingent departed on Tuesday to participate in the 8th edition of the biennial India-France joint military exercise, Shakti scheduled to be held from June 18 to July 1, at Camp Larzac, La Cavalerie, in France. The Indian contingent comprising of 90 personnel is being represented primarily by a Battalion of the Jammu and Kashmir Rifles besides personnel from other arms and services. The French contingent comprising of 90 personnel will be represented by the 13th Foreign Legion Half-Brigade (13th DBLE), a Defence Ministry statement said. Exercise Shakti is a biennial training engagement between the Indian and French Armies, aimed at enhancing interoperability, operational coordination, and military to military connect. This edition will focus on joint operations in a sub-conventional environment under Chapter VII of the United Nations Charter, with training being conducted in semi-urban terrain. The exercise will provide a platform for both contingents to rehearse and refine tactical drills, share best practices in Tactics, Techniques and Procedures (TTPs), train on new generation equipment (contemporary military technologies) and strengthen physical endurance. It will also foster esprit-de-corps, mutual respect and professional camaraderie between the two armies.

### Ahmedabad crash: Tearful farewell to Capt Sabharwal in Mumbai

**Mumbai, June 17 (UNI)** The last rites of Sumeet Sabharwal, Captain of Air India flight 171 en route to London's Gatwick airport which crashed in Ahmedabad shortly after takeoff on June 12 killing 241 on board were performed in Mumbai on Tuesday with his grief-stricken father bidding a tearful farewell to his son before the cremation. The last rites were performed at an electric crematorium in suburban Chakala, Andheri East, in the presence of family members. A large number of people gathered near Sabharwal's residence to pay their final respects and condolences to the grieving family. Local MLAs Dilip Mama Lande, businessman Niranjan Hiranandani were



among those who attended the last rites. A pall of grief descended over Jal Vayu Vihar in Powai, a residential complex primarily inhabited by retired Air Force officers and aviation personnel. Captain Sabharwal, remembered as

a committed and skilled pilot, lost his life in the tragic incident that has shaken the aviation community. Emotional scenes unfolded as his body arrived, wrapped in the national flag — a poignant reminder of duty and sacrifice.



## Bombay HC reserves verdict on plea challenging Devendra Fadnavis' assembly poll win

**Nagpur 17 June:** In a development that could carry significant political implications, the Nagpur Bench of the Bombay High Court has reserved its judgment on an election petition filed by Congress leader Prafulla Gudadhe Patil challenging the election of Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis from the South-West Nagpur constituency. Gudadhe Patil, who was defeated by Fadnavis in the last Assembly elections, has accused the CM of violating provisions of the Representation of the People Act. Along with Gudadhe's petition, the High Court also heard similar petitions filed by Congress candidates Girish Pandav, Satish Warjurkar, Santosh Rawat, and Subhash Dhote,

all of which were taken up together by Justice Praveen Patil. However, the proceedings took a procedural turn early on, as the High Court had to issue notices due to the non-appearance of the petitioners in person — a requirement under election laws. This lapse raised questions over the maintainability of the petitions, with the respondents seeking outright dismissal on technical grounds, particularly citing Section 81(1) of the Representation of the People Act, which governs the format and filing of election petitions. During an intense two-hour-long hearing, the counsels for the respondents, including senior advocate Sunil Manohar and Adv Uday Dable, argued that the

petitions were procedurally defective and did not merit judicial consideration. They pressed for dismissal at the threshold. Countering this, petitioners' lawyers Adv Mahmood Pracha and Adv Pavan Dahat strongly defended the validity of the petitions and accused the respondents of attempting to derail the legal process through technical objections. They submitted detailed written arguments to bolster their case.

With both sides having placed their arguments on record, Justice Praveen Patil has reserved the verdict, leaving the political circles of Nagpur and beyond on edge as they await the High Court's decision on a matter that could ripple far beyond the courtroom.

## Lower procurement halted in Achalpur as NAFED portal closes early, farmers distressed

**Pathrot 17 June (NAGPUR POST/TC):** Hundreds of jowar farmers in Achalpur taluka were left stranded after the NAFED procurement portal closed prematurely.

Out of 1,300 applicants, only 339 farmers could register at the Achalpur Buy-Sell Union before the June 15 deadline.

Farmers, already reeling from unseasonal rains, are now forced to sell crops to private traders at low rates. Local officials cited technical issues and lack of storage space as reasons for the delay.

Farmer organizations are now demanding an extension of the registration window.

## NMC imposes Rs 1 crore fine on three contractors for poor road restoration under AMRUT 2.0

**Nagpur 17 June:** In a no-nonsense move, Nagpur Municipal Corporation (NMC) has come down heavily on three negligent contractors by imposing a hefty penalty of Rs 1 crore for delivering shoddy road restoration work under the Central Government-funded AMRUT 2.0 scheme. The penalised firms — M/s Laxmi Civil Engineering Services Limited, M/s Kalthia Engineering and Construction Infrastructure Pvt. Ltd., and M/s P Das Infrastructure Pvt. Ltd. — were found blatantly violating tender conditions by failing to restore roads to their original condition after laying trunk sewage pipelines. Municipal Commissioner and Administrator Dr. Abhijeet Chaudhari, taking strong exception to the habitual corner-cutting by contractors, initiated the penalty after repeated warnings and on-ground evidence of gross non-compliance. Officials from the Public Health Engineering Department (PHED) had earlier issued multiple reminders to these contractors, urging them to follow norms and ensure proper levelling and tarring of roads post excavation.

## Shalarth ID scam: Nagpur police zero in on 30 school owners as SIT expands probe

**Nagpur 17 June:** The arrest of Dilip Dhote, Chairman and Director of Vitthal-Rukhmini Primary Multipurpose Educational Institute, has intensified the crackdown in the multi-crore Shalarth ID scam. As the investigation deepens, the Special Investigation Team (SIT) led by Assistant Commissioner of Police Sunita Meshram has identified at least 30 school owners allegedly involved in illegally appointing teachers through forged documentation. Dhote is the first school owner to be arrested in the case, marking a turning point in the probe that is now expected to tighten the noose around other educational institutions suspected of similar fraud. The SIT alleges that these schools submitted fake teacher approval proposals to obtain Shalarth IDs, enabling them to siphon off government funds by drawing salaries and arrears for non-existent or unqualified teachers. The scam, believed to have been running since 2012, has already seen the arrest of 16 individuals, including education officials. Investigators claim that over 1,000 bogus appointments were made across Nagpur district, with only 350 verified

as legitimate. The rest remain under scrutiny. Meanwhile, the alleged mastermind of the racket, Nilesh Waghmare, a Pay Unit Superintendent, continues to evade arrest. Waghmare was suspended following the exposure of the scam and has since gone underground. His anticipatory bail plea was rejected by both the district sessions court and the High Court.

Despite switching SIM cards frequently and communicating via WhatsApp with family members, police sources say they are closing in on him. According to SIT sources, Waghmare and complicit school owners allegedly received substantial kickbacks in lump sums. These bribes were linked to the illegal processing of teacher appointments and salary disbursements, some of which were backdated to inflate the payout amounts. The financial loss is estimated to be in crores. The fallout is already being felt across the education sector. Teachers appointed using forged credentials now face imminent dismissal, while several school principals and administrators are reportedly under the police scanner. Further



complications arise from the incomplete records. A probe led by School Education Director Mahesh Palkar has found inconsistencies in the appointment of at least 1,056 teachers. Alarming records for over 640 of them are missing or unverifiable. Investigators suspect these appointments were strategically made by school owners who showed inflated staff numbers on paper while redirecting the so-called teachers to other schools. The education department is under pressure to submit a foolproof report within the next two days, with officials planning to coordinate their findings with Nagpur police. The case has sent shockwaves through the education sector, raising concerns over systemic lapses and long-running collusion between institutions and officials.

## There would have been no water problem in Pusad

**PUSAD / NAGPUR POST:** The water supply to Pusad city was cut off for 5 days due to the storm that hit last week. Since repairs could not be done for another two-three days, former Water Supply Chairman Raju Dudhe had told the chief officer to start the old pump house scheme at the water purification center. At that time, the scheme was started in just 15 minutes, and the people of Pusad got water.

Pusad citizens had been suffering without water for 5 days. There was an unprecedented water shortage in the city and women were roaming the streets with pots to fetch water. Citizens could not experience this situation even during the drought. If the administration had listened to me on time, they would not have had to face a serious problem. This water supply would have started four days earlier. The river Poos is low and there is no storage capacity in the dam. Therefore, to prevent the raw water pump from running out of water and the tank from filling up on time and the tap from being delayed, it is necessary to block the dam half at least until the power supply at the Poos Dam is restored. In order to prevent



this situation from arising even when there is water and electricity, an additional DP (transformer) is required at the water purification center and the Poos Dam. Otherwise, a serious situation can arise even when there is water and electricity. The administration needs to pay attention to this serious matter. It is necessary to keep the old pump house scheme operational for emergencies. Since the direct pipeline scheme from Poos Dam to the water purification is 15 km away, problems can arise at any time due to air, water and natural disasters. The administration needs to take measures keeping these serious matters in mind. Otherwise, the same thing will happen again, said former Water Supply Chairman Raju Dudhe.

## Rs 5.60 lakh products stolen from Reliance Smart Bazaar, Nagpur

**Nagpur 17 June:** A major theft has been reported at the Reliance Smart Bazaar in Landmark Building, Ramdaspath. Manager Mangesh Vinayak Telkunte (44), a resident of Navin Subhedar Layout, Nagpur, lodged a complaint at Sitabuldi Police Station. According to the complaint, between February 15 and April 30, 2025, a total of 6,431 products worth Rs 5,68,410 were stolen. The accused, Pundalik Thakre, an associate of SAS Developers and a resident of Yogeshwar Nagar, Dighori, was seen in CCTV footage leaving with the stolen goods hidden in his clothes. The internal audit of a grocery store revealed the shocking case of systematic shoplifting.

The store's internal stock audit flagged

significant inventory discrepancies, prompting a detailed review of CCTV footage. The footage reportedly captured Thakre, who works with a firm operating from the same building, entering the store on multiple occasions and concealing products inside his clothing. The thefts were carried out in small quantities across several visits, making the losses difficult to detect daily. The stolen goods were primarily fast-moving consumer items such as spices, sauces, and packaged condiments, likely chosen for their compact size and ease of concealment. Based on the evidence submitted by the store's management, Sitabuldi police registered a case under relevant sections and have launched a search to trace the accused.

## Traffic cops take action on 4215 riders flouting norms



**Nagpur 17 June:** Traffic cops took action against a total of 4215 riders under various sections of the Motor Vehicles Act and collected a total fine of Rs 2.26 lakh from the erring riders. Under the Bombay Liquor Prohibition Act, 7 suspects have been arrested in 7 cases and material worth Rs 9.5 thousand was seized from their possession. The Traffic Department has called upon the citizens to keep all the documents related to the vehicle with them while driving. Citizens and commuters have also been advised to abide by traffic rules, failing which fines and other penal action can be imposed upon them.

About 47% of Indian firms say cost of doing business has gone up amid global uncertainty: Assocham survey

New Delhi 17 June: Amid global uncertainties, about half of the Indian firms surveyed by Industry Body Assocham said that the overall Cost of Doing Business (CoDB) has risen moderately. "With global uncertainties, respondents reported that the overall Cost of Doing Business (CoDB) has risen moderately (with roughly 47 per cent indicating a moderate increase and about 37 per cent noting a significant uptick)," the industry body said. The firms say that key cost drivers such as infrastructure spending, high financing costs, and skilled labour expenses have emerged as recurring challenges, impacting their business operations. Among the other reforms suggested are ESG requirements, strict control on Chinese electronic imports, and government support in technological lag.

The industry body added that research & development, reducing export finance costs, improving Rupee trade competitiveness, enhancing logistics efficiency, and ESG related requirements are some of the factors that will help India to attain the goal of becoming a USD 5 trillion economy by 2030. On highlighting the difficulties faced by the Indian firms, the industry body added that large firms with an annual turnover more than Rs 250 crore reported logistics and transportation, infrastructure cost, skilled labour, and cost of finance as major challenges. Other firms with annual turnover equal to or less than Rs 250 crore reported that skilled labour, infrastructure cost of finance, compliance and cascading effect of taxes and duties are major challenges. "Indian industry shows potential to contribute to India's economic growth. However, tapping into this potential will require targeted policy efforts, infrastructure development, and other related initiatives."

Rani of Jhansi

The Rani of Jhansi[a] (born Manikarnika Tambe; 1828 or 1835 – 18 June 1858), also known as Rani Lakshmi Bai, was one of the leading figures of the Indian Rebellion of 1857. The queen consort of the princely state of Jhansi from 1843 to 1853, she assumed its leadership after the outbreak of conflict and fought several battles against the British. Her life and deeds are celebrated in modern India and she remains a potent symbol of Indian nationalism.

Born into a Marathi family in Varanasi, Manikarnika Tambe was married to the raja of Jhansi, Gangadhar Rao, at a young age, taking the name Rani Lakshmi Bai. The couple had one son but he died young, and so when Gangadhar Rao was on his deathbed in 1853, he adopted a young relative to be his successor. The British East India Company, the overlord of Jhansi, refused to recognise this succession and annexed Jhansi under the Doctrine of Lapse, ignoring the Rani's vigorous protests to the Governor-General Lord Dalhousie. In May 1857, the Indian troops stationed at Jhansi mutinied and massacred most of the British in the town; the Rani's complicity and participation in these events was and remains contested. She took over rulership of Jhansi and recruited an army to see off incursions from neighbouring states. Although her relations with the British were initially neutral, they decided to treat her as an enemy: Major General Hugh Rose attacked and captured Jhansi in March and April 1858. The Rani escaped the siege on horseback and joined other rebel leaders at Kalpi, where Rose defeated them on 22 May. The rebels fled to Gwalior Fort, where they made their last stand; the Rani died there in battle. After the rebellion, the Rani's name and actions became closely associated with nationalist movements in India. Her legend, influenced by Hindu mythology, became hugely influential because of its universal applicability. She was regarded as a great heroine by the Indian independence movement and remains revered in modern India, although Dalit communities tend to view her negatively. Rani Lakshmi Bai has been extensively depicted in artwork, cinema, and literature, most notably in the 1930 poem "Jhansi Ki Rani" and Vrindavan Lal Verma's 1946 novel Jhansi Ki Rani Lakshmi Bai. Little is known for certain about the Rani's life before 1857, because there was then no need to record details about an as-yet ordinary young girl.



Hope floats for a thaw in India-Canada relations

Prime Minister Narendra Modi set foot on Canadian soil on Monday to attend the G7 Summit in Alberta, just over a decade since his last visit to Canada in April 2015, then at the invitation of PM Stephen Harper. Much has changed in the intervening years — beginning with Harper's electoral defeat in October 2015 and the ascent of Justin Trudeau, the rising political traction of Khalistani narratives in Canada, Trudeau's disastrous visit to India in 2018 and the subsequent attempts to portray India as a malign actor, culminating with the public accusation that "agents of the Indian government" were behind the June 2023 murder of Khalistani activist Hardeep Singh Nijjar. The allegation led to the expulsion of High Commissioners, the suspension of visa services and a deep freeze in diplomatic engagement between the two countries. The G7 invite is thus an attempt to mend fences, and set in motion a quiet reset of relations at the highest level, without the optics or political risks of a standalone bilateral visit. This effort is being driven by what may be called the three Ts — Trudeau, Trump and Trade. The first T — Trudeau — represents the source of much of the animus. Rarely, if ever, has India's Ministry of External Affairs publicly rebuked the sitting leader of a Western democracy as harshly as it did Trudeau, not only for his allegations over Nijjar but also for his repeated forays into Indian domestic politics — such as his support for the farmers' protests. Trudeau's decision to step down from politics has effectively removed a persistent irritant and the symbolic face of the pro-Khalistani tilt in Canadian governance. The second T — Trump — refers to the geopolitical earthquake caused by Donald Trump's dramatic return to the US presidency and his renewed pressure on America's closest neighbours. Trump's threats of tariffs, renegotiation of trade deals and open musings about absorbing Canada as America's "51st state" upended the Canadian political landscape. The result: a decisive victory for former Bank of Canada and Bank of England governor Mark Carney, who became Prime Minister with a near-majority in Parliament. His main challenger, Conservative leader Pierre Poilievre, was seen as too ideologically close to Trump. Meanwhile, Jagmeet Singh — leader of the third-largest party, the NDP, and a vocal supporter of Khalistani causes — suffered a major setback, diminishing yet another source of friction in India-Canada relations. The third T — Trade — represents the compelling strategic rationale for Canada to rebuild bridges with India. Trump's economic nationalism has made it imperative for Canada to diversify its trade relationships, particularly given that 97 per cent of Canadian oil and 75.9 per cent of Canada's domestic exports are effectively hostage to the US market. India, with its massive and growing consumer base, expanding middle class and appetite for energy, technology and infrastructure investment, offers an obvious counterbalance. Canadian Pension Funds have invested more than \$75 billion in India, reflecting confidence in India's long-term economic prospects and serving as a steady ballast for the relationship during the diplomatic chill. The Khalistani issue remains the elephant in the room.

While Canada's Indian diaspora is 2.2 million strong, politically active with 28 MPs in a House of 343, and overwhelmingly law-abiding, a fringe minority of Khalistani sympathisers has managed to hijack the narrative — starting with the tragic bombing of Air India's Kanishka Flight 182 in June 1985, which claimed 329 lives and remains the deadliest terrorist attack on Canadian soil. India has long believed that Canada fails to give sufficient weight to its legitimate security concerns, particularly when Indian diplomats are targeted or intimidated under the guise of protected speech. For its part, Canada views the killing of a Canadian citizen on Canadian soil as a grave breach of sovereignty. India has strongly denied any involvement, calling the charges "absurd and motivated". With four Indian nationals now on trial for Nijjar's murder, New Delhi is prepared to let the Canadian legal process run its course. The continuation of the law enforcement and security dialogue offers an institutional forum to address such concerns through established channels. That is why Prime Minister Mark Carney does not need to hold his nose while engaging with the leader of the world's largest democracy. He has a clear template to emulate: that of the United States. Washington, confronted with allegations about a plot to assassinate Khalistani figure Gurbaj Singh Pannun, did not allow the episode to derail the broader trajectory of its relationship with India. Instead, it pursued the matter through judicial forums while continuing to deepen cooperation on trade, technology and defence. Canada would do well to take a similarly pragmatic approach — firm where needed, but forward-looking where possible. A concrete starting point for restoring economic momentum is the revival of negotiations on the stalled India-Canada Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA) and the Bilateral Investment Promotion and Protection Agreement (BIPPA). India's growing interest in bilateral trade agreements — evident in recent deals with UAE, Australia and UK — signals a readiness to engage constructively. For Canada, re-engagement on these fronts would not only signal goodwill but also unlock tangible opportunities across key sectors such as energy, education, agriculture, critical minerals, clean technology and artificial intelligence.

Beyond economics, India and Canada share foundational values: multiculturalism, democracy and a commitment to the rules-based international order.

## Ajni bridge danger grows: Delays, neglect and daily risk for thousands

Nagpur 17 June: The collapse of a bridge over the Indrayani River near Kundmala village in Pune's Mawal tehsil on Sunday afternoon led to casualties and injuries, once again raising serious concerns about ageing infrastructure across Maharashtra. Attention has now shifted to Nagpur's 125-year-old Ajni railway bridge, which remains in daily use despite its dangerously deteriorated state. Built in 1900 during the British era, the bridge was officially declared past its lifespan nearly two decades ago by the original British construction company. However, it continues to carry thousands of vehicles every day, including heavy trucks and container carriers, accelerating its wear and tear. According to a local daily report, the surface of the Ajni bridge has become increasingly dangerous, with frequent accidents involving two-wheelers and regular collisions due to the lack of proper dividers. Over the years, authorities have tried various temporary fixes from pipe dividers and green netting to cement blocks. Height barriers were also placed at both ends to stop heavy vehicles. But these measures have proved ineffective. Trucks often damage or bypass the barriers. One end of the bridge now has no barrier at all, and the other is only partially blocked, allowing heavy vehicles to pass through especially at night putting further stress on the already fragile structure. With no major repairs planned and the alternative cable-stayed bridge still nowhere near completion, Ajni bridge continues to pose a serious risk. If a tragedy were to happen, it wouldn't be an accident it would be the result of long-standing administrative neglect. In April 2023, work began on a new 200-metre-long, six-lane cable-stayed bridge meant to replace the ageing Ajni bridge. The Rs 333-crore project required the demolition of 25-30 shops in Ajni Colony and was originally scheduled for completion by the end of 2024. However, as of June 2025, there is little visible progress neither the pylon pillar has been built, nor the girder installed. At the current pace,



completing the bridge within the next two years seems highly unlikely. Infrastructure safety concerns are not new to Central Railway. Back on November 27, 2022, a portion of the foot overbridge at Ballarshah railway station collapsed, claiming the life of one woman and injuring seven others. Yet, despite that tragedy, both Central Railway and Maharashtra appear to have taken little meaningful action to address the risks posed by other ageing structures, including the Ajni bridge. Satish Yadav, a member of the Zonal Railway Users Consultative Committee (ZRUCC) of Central Railway, has expressed serious concern over the ongoing use of the deteriorating Ajni bridge. He criticised the sluggish progress on the construction of the replacement bridge and warned that a tragedy similar to the recent Mawal collapse could occur in Nagpur as well. Yadav's statement raises pressing questions about accountability and the urgency of infrastructure safety.

**Past Warnings Ignored: Ajni Bridge Repair Orders Date Back Years**  
Back in September 2023, during the UPA regime, then Minister of State for Railways Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury visited Nagpur and inspected the Ajni bridge. Disturbed by its deteriorated condition, he ordered immediate repairs. Although minor fixes were carried out, the bridge has continued to remain operational despite having long exceeded its safe service life highlighting a long-standing neglect of safety warnings.

## Chandrapur burglar arrested in Nagpur, linked to 5 incidents

Nagpur 17 June: In a significant breakthrough, Nagpur's Dhantoli Police have arrested a serial house-breaker from Chandrapur, successfully cracking five burglary cases registered across different police jurisdictions in the city, including Dhantoli, Sonagaon, and Ajni. The investigation began after a complaint was filed by Sheetal Naresh Chittalwar (24), a resident of Flat No. 201, Samyak Apartment, Vikas Nagar, Nagpur. Between 9 am on June 8 and 10:30 am on June 9, while the complainant was visiting her uncle's home in Chandrapur with her family, unidentified miscreants broke the lock on her main door and stole Rs 22 thousand in cash from her bedroom cupboard. A case was registered under Sections 305, 331(3), and 331(4) of the BNS at Dhantoli Police Station. During the investigation, officers noticed a pattern in six house-breaking cases reported within a week in the Dhantoli



area. Over the course of three days, police carried out technical surveillance and gathered specific intelligence pointing towards a suspect from Chandrapur. Following a targeted operation, the accused—identified as Ashish Srinivas Reddy malla (25), a resident of Rayatwari Colony, Dispensary Chowk, Bypass Road, Chandrapur—was taken into custody. During interrogation, he confessed to the burglary at Chittalwar's residence and

four other break-ins: two more in Dhantoli, and one each in the Sonagaon and Ajni police jurisdictions. From the accused's possession, police recovered Rs 15,000 in cash, 4 gold rings weighing 32 grams, \$200 in US currency, Euro 100, and one iron rod. The total value of the recovered stolen property is estimated at Rs 2.33 lakh. Further investigation is underway to trace other accomplices and verify links to similar unsolved cases.

## Monsoon advances in Vidarbha after a long delay, yellow alert issued for region

Nagpur 17 June: After nearly three weeks of stagnant conditions, the Southwest Monsoon has finally advanced into parts of Vidarbha, bringing much-needed relief from the persistent heat. According to the Regional Meteorological Centre, the monsoon has crossed Amravati district and is expected to cover the remaining areas of Vidarbha over the next two to three days, with conditions now favourable for further progress. The monsoon had earlier touched Aheri and Sironcha in Gadchiroli district and the border areas of Chandrapur on May 28. However, its advancement stalled due to the lack of conducive weather. After a prolonged 19-day pause, fresh movement of rain-bearing clouds has revived monsoon activity in the region — a welcome development for residents who had been grappling with intense heat and humidity. In the past 24 hours, rainfall was recorded in



several districts, with Gondia receiving 29.4 mm, Amravati 23.3 mm, and Buldhana 4 mm. Other districts experienced little to no rainfall. As the system gathers momentum, the weather department has issued a yellow alert for Nagpur and other districts in Vidarbha, warning of thunderstorms, lightning, gusty winds, and rainfall between Tuesday and Friday.

Therefore, the concerned department's authorities should give orders to the contractors to repair these roads swiftly. The Integrated Child Development Department should implement effective plans for ensuring a malnutrition-free district. The process of construction of all Anganwadis in the district should be completed quickly.

Although free sand is available to Gharkul scheme beneficiaries, the cost of transportation of sand from

sand ghats is very high, the administration should pay attention to this issue. Bharat Sanchar Nigam Limited authorities should accelerate the work of tower construction so as to maintain the range of mobile phones and ensure enhanced connectivity.

The work of setting up the third railway line to be laid between Warora and Majri railway station should be carried out only on the land given for acquisition, and should not be carried out on additional land. ## One dead, 5 injured after slurry leak at Ankit Pulp and Boards Pharma Unit in Bhilgaon



**Nagpur 17 June:** A tragic industrial mishap occurred at Ankit Pulp and Boards, a pharmaceutical manufacturing company located in Bhilgaon under the jurisdiction of New Kamptee police, resulting in the death of one worker and injuries to five others here, on Tuesday, June 17.

The incident took place after slurry leaked from a Glass Lined Reactor (GLR) inside the factory. One worker died on the spot, while another is reported to be in critical condition. Four others sustained injuries and were rushed to a nearby hospital for treatment. ## Security breach on Samruddhi Mahamarg

### Robbery, stone pelting incidents raise alarm

**Nagpur 17 June:** Touted as a symbol of progress and modern infrastructure, the Samruddhi Mahamarg — Maharashtra's flagship expressway connecting Nagpur to Mumbai — is now drawing fire not for its speed or scale, but for the shocking surge in criminal attacks on commuters. Stone-pelting, looting, and police inaction are turning this supposed "expressway of prosperity" into a dangerous nightmare for travellers. While ministers in the State Government continue to pat themselves on the back for the project, ground realities tell a starkly different story. Videos and testimonies posted by terrified citizens on social media are painting a chilling picture — that of gangsters lying in wait, pelting stones at high-speed vehicles, forcing them to stop, and robbing unsuspecting families at will, especially near the tunnels around Bhokardan, between Chhatrapati Sambhaji Nagar and Nagpur. One such user posted three alarming videos on social media platform X, alleging that the stretch has become a hotspot for criminal gangs. He claimed that there is no visible police presence, no emergency assistance,



and no deterrent to prevent these attacks. His post quickly gained traction, with other users tagging top officials and demanding immediate intervention. The gravity of the situation escalated further with the earlier incident involving Palghar-based doctor, who was ambushed on May 2 near Buldhana while returning home with his family. A gang of four stopped his car, brutally assaulted him in front of his wife and children, and looted them at knifepoint. His wife pleaded with the attackers to stop hitting her husband, offering everything they had in exchange for mercy. "We are still haunted by that night," the doctor later told a local daily, narrating the trauma and fear that continues to grip his family. Ironically, the Samruddhi Mahamarg — officially the Hindu Hrudaysamrat Balasaheb Thackeray Maharashtra Samruddhi Mahamarg — was envisioned as a world-class expressway promising

safety, speed, and convenience. But in reality, large stretches remain underdeveloped, CCTV coverage is patchy, and police patrolling is grossly inadequate — creating a perfect storm for criminal elements to operate with impunity. These repeated incidents are now triggering a wave of public outrage. Citizens are questioning whether the state government is more interested in optics than actual safety. If this is Maharashtra's model infrastructure project, they ask, what message does it send about governance and law enforcement in the rest of the state? The police, reportedly jolted into action following the viral videos, have now registered cases and initiated an investigation. But for many, the damage has already been done — both to public trust and to the dream of a safe, seamless ride through Maharashtra. Until systemic security lapses are addressed, and visible, round-the-clock policing becomes the norm, the Samruddhi Mahamarg risks becoming less a game-changer, and more a high-speed corridor of fear.

## Nagpur's Divya dethrones China's World No.1 Yifan in Blitz Chess thriller

**Nagpur 17 June:** In a chessboard clash that felt like a scene straight out of a grandmaster's dream, Nagpur's rising star Divya Deshmukh delivered a jaw-dropping upset, defeating World No. 1 Hou Yifan of China in a high-stakes semifinal blitz match at the World Team Blitz Chess Championship in London on Monday. Representing Hexamind Chess Club, the 18-year-old Indian sensation squared off against the Chinese titan, who played for WRC Chess Team. In a thrilling 74-move battle reminiscent of the recent Carlsen-Gukesh classical showdown, Divya outplayed Yifan in the rook vs bishop endgame, forcing the world champion to resign after a rare blunder. For Divya, it was a moment of disbelief and pure emotion — her first-ever win against the world's top-ranked woman player. As Yifan graciously offered a handshake and exited the stage with a smile, Divya closed her eyes in quiet triumph, soaking in the enormity of her achievement before swiftly refocusing for the next round. The victory wasn't just a flash of brilliance — it was part of a stellar campaign. In the blitz format, Divya racked up six wins, one draw, and just one loss out of eight games, clocking an elite performance rating of 2606 — far above her blitz Elo of 2343. She later dominated the third-place playoff, helping her team defeat Uzbekistan 3.5–2.5 in both rounds to claim team bronze. But the blitz glory followed an equally strong run in the rapid format, where Divya's consistency — five wins, six draws, and just one loss — secured team silver and an individual bronze on Board 6, with a robust performance rating of 2420.



**Nagpur 17 June:** In a shocking incident, Atul Patil, a Gram Panchayat member from Pipla in Saoner, was brutally stabbed to death in the early hours of Tuesday, June 16. According to sources, the murder occurred between 2 am and 3 am. The accused has been identified as Himanshu Kumbhalkar. He is currently absconding. Following the incident, Patil's body was shifted to Mayo Hospital for post-mortem. The motive behind the murder is yet to be ascertained. Saoner Police have launched a manhunt to trace the accused, and an investigation is underway.

## Bawankule orders urgent road repairs and river cleansing ahead of monsoon



**Nagpur 17 June:** As the monsoon nears, Maharashtra Revenue and Guardian Minister Chandrashekhar Bawankule has instructed the Nagpur Municipal Corporation (NMC) to immediately begin repairing city roads damaged during the summer. The directive came during a review meeting held at the NMC headquarters. Bawankule stressed the urgency of road repairs across major routes, including those managed by the Nagpur Improvement Trust (NIT). He asked civic officials to prepare a detailed project report for the re-carpeting work and assured that the state government would provide the necessary funding. In addition to roadworks, the minister expressed serious concern over the lack of desilting in riverbeds and nallahs, particularly in areas outside the city limits managed by the Nagpur Metropolitan Region

Development Authority (NMRDA). He ordered the NMRDA to complete all desilting and cleaning operations by 30 June to avoid waterlogging and flooding. Local MLAs Nitin Raut, Krishna Khopde, and Vikas Thakre raised similar concerns and urged for immediate cleaning of water bodies to prevent urban flooding. Responding to this, Bawankule directed the NMC to organise planning meetings with MLAs at the zone level within ten days to ensure effective coordination. The minister warned that any delay or negligence in pre-monsoon preparedness would not be tolerated and that accountability would be fixed for any lapses. With heavy rainfall expected soon, the directive aims to ensure that Nagpur is adequately prepared to avoid potential monsoon-related disruptions.

## Illegal sale of govt rice busted in Nagpur

### Stockpile worth Rs 14 lakh seized, case registered

**Nagpur 17 June:** Acting on a tip-off received around 9 pm on Monday, June 16, Nagpur Supply Department officials led by Circle Officer Sagar Suresh Bavare raided a tin shed opposite Shubh Kirana & General Store in the Taj Nagar-Tukdoji Putla area. During the inspection, they found that rice was being loaded into an Eicher truck bearing registration number MH 40 CM 0235. Officials summoned panch witnesses before proceeding with further action. When questioned, workers loading the rice claimed the stock belonged to Mohammad Wasim Mohammad Rafiq, who was temporarily away. Upon his arrival, Wasim was asked to present purchase documents and licenses for the approximately 200 rice sacks found in the shed and truck. He failed to provide any documentation, stating he would submit them later. Upon inspection, the rice was



found to contain fortified grains — the kind supplied by the government to enhance nutrition among public distribution beneficiaries. Suspecting misuse of government stock, the officials collected samples and seized the rice and the vehicle. A total of goods worth Rs 14 lakh were seized. Based on findings, a case has been registered at Ajni Police Station under Sections 3 and 7 of the Essential

Commodities Act, 1955. The operation was conducted under the guidance of Food Grain Distribution Officer Vinod Kale and executed by Circle Officer Sagar Suresh Bavare, Dipali Bansod, and Vaibhav Khairkar. The Supply Department has appealed to citizens to report any illegal sale or hoarding of government-supplied fortified rice, which is meant solely for nutritional distribution to eligible beneficiaries.

## Bomb threat forces emergency landing of Kochi-Delhi flight at Nagpur airport



**Nagpur 17 June:** An IndiGo Kochi-to-Delhi flight was forced to make an emergency landing at Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar International Airport in Nagpur on Tuesday, June 16, after a bomb threat was reported mid-air. According to preliminary information, the airline authorities received a threat claiming that a bomb had been planted on the aircraft. Following standard protocol, the flight was diverted and landed safely at Nagpur Airport.

The Bomb Detection and Disposal Squad (BDDS) immediately reached the spot and initiated a thorough search operation. All passengers were safely evacuated, and the aircraft was isolated for inspection. Airport security, Central Industrial Security Force (CISF), and local police are currently on high alert and are investigating the source of the threat. Further details are awaited.

## Nagpur fire tragedies expose rampant violations in commercial hubs

**Nagpur 17 June:** A series of devastating fires in the densely populated Mahal-tiwari-Gandhibagh commercial zones has once again exposed the dangerous state of fire safety in Nagpur. The latest tragedy at Jaikamal Complex in Mahal claimed two lives and injured two others, reigniting concerns over illegal constructions and administrative negligence that continue to put lives and crores worth of property at risk. On Sunday, a residential flat turned into an illegal

godown caught fire due to welding work. The flames quickly spread due to the unauthorized storage of firecrackers and electrical goods. The blaze resulted in the deaths of flat owner Girish Khatri (37) and his employee Pratik Dhote, while a welder, Gunwant Serpurkar (45), sustained serious burns and is under observation at GMCH. Kotwali police have booked Khatri and his brother for causing death due to negligence. This fire is part of

a troubling pattern. In August 2024, a 17-year-old girl died in a blaze at a perfume godown in Itwari, and in May, a major fire broke out at Rohaldas Sons clothing store in Gandhibagh. That incident highlighted how rooftop structures illegally built over solar frames — with sealed tin sheds and no ventilation — are being misused as godowns, turning commercial spaces into firetraps. According to the Nagpur Municipal Corporation's Fire and

Emergency Department, the Mahal-tiwari-Gandhibagh area has reported at least 72 fire incidents between 2019 and 2024. Many multi-storey commercial buildings lack no objection certificates (NOCs) from the fire department and are not equipped with basic firefighting equipment. Worse, several double up as godowns and homes — making them even more hazardous. The congested lanes, traffic chaos, and unregulated modifications to

heritage buildings make firefighting operations extremely challenging. While lives continue to be lost and businesses suffer repeated financial losses, there appears to be little proactive action from civic authorities. Experts and residents alike are now demanding an urgent city-wide safety audit, immediate crackdown on unauthorized constructions, and stricter enforcement of fire safety regulations before another disaster strikes.



## Thunderstorm shatters farmer's dreams in Savna

**Mahagaon 17 June (NAGPUR POST/TC):** For Pandurang Sudhakar Vilayate, a young farmer from Savna village in Mahagaon taluka, June 11 will be remembered as the darkest day of his life. Last year, his father ended his life by jumping into a well, unable to bear the burden of mounting debt. After this tragic incident, Pandurang took on the responsibility of supporting his family and resolving their financial crisis. Determined not to let his father's fate become his own, Pandurang embraced modern agricultural methods. He installed a drip irrigation system in his farm and planted 3,000 tissue-cultured banana saplings over three acres of land. With dreams of repaying debts and securing a better future for his family, Pandurang, along with his family members, poured heart and soul into the banana plantation. His efforts began to bear fruit. The banana crop thrived, and good market prices promised financial



relief. For the first time in a long while, Pandurang smiled with hope. The day when the family's debt would be cleared seemed just around the corner. But nature had other plans. On June 11, a devastating cyclone struck, turning all of Pandurang's dreams into dust. Within moments, the thriving banana plantation was flattened. Years of struggle, hopes of a debt-free life, and the entire financial investment — all were destroyed in a single blow. The estimated loss is

between Rs 8 to Rs 10 lakh, and not even the initial investment can be recovered from the damaged crop. Overwhelmed with grief, Pandurang was seen weeping uncontrollably while surveying the ruined field. More than a week has passed, yet not a single government officer or public representative has visited the site. Even the subsidy for the drip irrigation system has only been partially disbursed. With no direction and no support, Pandurang now finds himself mentally shattered, unsure of

what to do next. He is pleading for help — any form of assistance that could help him get back on his feet. His emotional ordeal was shared with senior farmer Govindrao Deshmukh from Savna, who personally visited the farm, consoled Pandurang, and assured him of all possible help through government channels.

He also encouraged Pandurang to remain strong and resume farming with renewed determination. Govindrao Deshmukh has issued an appeal to social workers, non-profit organizations, and public representatives to come forward and support Pandurang in this critical time.

**I visited the farm myself and witnessed the extent of devastation. It is beyond words. Pandurang has suffered irreparable loss. I sincerely urge all citizens and social organizations to step forward and help him rebuild his life, said Govindrao Deshmukh, Savna resident.**

## Eight accused arrested for attempted murder in Umarchhed

Joint operation carried out by LCB Yavatmal and Umarchhed Police

**Yavatmal 17 June (NAGPUR POST/DC):** In a significant breakthrough, a joint operation conducted by the Local Crime Branch (LCB) Yavatmal and Umarchhed Police led to the arrest of eight accused involved in an attempted murder case registered at Umarchhed Police Station. The incident occurred on June 8, 2025, when the complainant, Sheikh Arif Sheikh Nisar (24), a resident of the weekly market area in Umarchhed, and his brother were allegedly attacked by a group of armed individuals.

The main accused — 1) Sheikh Tamir Sheikh Sameer and 2) Mujju Shah Javed Shah — along with 8 to 10 unidentified accomplices, reportedly assaulted the victims with swords and sticks in an attempt to kill them. Based on this, a case was registered at Umarchhed Police Station under IPC Sections 103(1), 189(2), 189(4), 191(2), 191(3), 190 (BNS), along with Section 135 of the Maharashtra Police Act and Sections 4 and 25 of the Indian Arms Act. Another FIR (No. 444/2025) was later registered on June 15 under



similar charges. Recognizing the gravity of the crime and the potential threat to law and order, Superintendent of Police Yavatmal, Mr. Kumar Chintha (IPS), instructed the officers of the LCB Yavatmal and Umarchhed Police Station to form two dedicated teams to apprehend the accused swiftly.

On June 17, acting on a tip-off that some of the suspects were hiding under a bridge along the Nagpur-Nanded Highway near Dhanaki, the joint teams swiftly moved into action. Demonstrating police coordination and tactical precision, they successfully apprehended seven of the accused from the location.

Subsequently, the eighth accused was detained from his residence.

**The arrested individuals have been identified as:**

1. Parvez Khan Salim Khan alias Lala (34),
2. Sheikh Tamir alias Sameer Sheikh (20),
3. Sheikh Azeem alias Ichoda Sheikh Pasha (24),

6. Syed Arif Syed Yusuf (22),
7. Fauzoddin alias Gausu Mujoddin Qazi (25),
8. Sheikh Mubeen alias Munna Sheikh Rauf (25) — all residents of Umarchhed and surrounding areas.

During interrogation, the accused reportedly confessed to their involvement in the crime. The entire operation was executed under the guidance of Superintendent of Police Yavatmal Kumar Chintha (IPS), Additional SP Piyush Jagtap (DySP), SDPO Hanuman Gaikwad, Inspector Satish Chavhan (LCB Yavatmal), Inspector Shankar Panchal (Umarchhed Police Station). Key personnel involved in the successful arrest operation included API Sheeraj Pansi, API Nilesh Dhadar, PSI Sharad Lohkare, PSI Sagar Ingle, along with police staff Munna Ade, Santosh Bhorge, Tejab Rankhamb, Subhash Jadhav, Kunal Mundokar, Ramesh Rathod, Sunil Pandagle, and Rajesh Jadhav of the LCB. The Umarchhed Police team included officers Madhukar Pawar, Sangshil Tembhre, Prafulla Bhuse, and Nivritti Mahalanar. Authorities praised the coordinated effort and swift response, which helped prevent potential escalation of violence in the area.

## Notorious cattle thief Mohammad Roshan Sheikh Musa detained under MPDA for 1 year

**Akola 17 June (NAGPUR POST/DC):** In a major crackdown on habitual offenders, the Akola police have detained a notorious cattle thief and history-sheeter, Mohammad Roshan Sheikh Musa (21), under the Maharashtra Prevention of Dangerous Activities (MPDA) Act for one year. A resident of Kaggipura Masjid, Machhi Market, Akola, Roshan Sheikh has been involved in several serious crimes in the past, including cattle theft, causing grievous hurt, destruction of evidence, theft, cruelty towards animals, illegal possession of arms and weapons, conspiracy, violation of externment orders, creating public disorder, criminal intimidation, and more.

Despite multiple preventive actions and his previous externment from the Akola district, Sheikh continued his criminal activities. As a result, the Superintendent of Police, Akola, Mr. Archit Chandak, submitted a proposal to detain the accused under the MPDA Act. After verifying the legal provisions and receiving confidential intelligence, District Magistrate Mr. Ajit Kumbhar confirmed that the accused posed a significant threat to public safety. Consequently, an order was passed on May 6, 2025, to detain him in the Akola District Jail for a period of one year. After learning about the detention order, Sheikh absconded. However, he was apprehended on June 17, 2025, and the detention order



was executed, officially beginning his one-year custody term from the date of his arrest. The action was carried out under the guidance of Superintendent of Police Archit Chandak, with the efforts of Additional SP Abhay Dongre, Sub-

Divisional Police Officer Satish Kulkarni, and the Local Crime Branch team led by Inspector Shankar Shelke. The operational team included PSI Majid Pathan, police constables Dnyaneshwar Sairise, Uday Ishwariprasad Shukla, as well

as Ramdas Peth Police Station personnel including PI Manoj Bahure, Shirish Khandare, constables Sheikh Hasan, Shyam Mohale, and Madhuri Hingankar. Superintendent Chandak warned that strict legal action, including MPDA and other prevailing laws, will be taken against habitual offenders who defy law and order, especially during the upcoming Zilla Parishad, Municipal elections, and festive season, to ensure peace and public safety in the district.

## Much awaited stream deepening & straightening works begin in Pusad taluka

**Pusad 17 June (NAGPUR POST/TC):** After months of persistent efforts, nala (stream) deepening and straightening works have finally commenced in several villages of Pusad taluka. This development marks a partial but significant victory for local farmers who had suffered severe crop damage due to last year's heavy floods. Approximately nine months ago, extreme rainfall caused major damage to agricultural land situated along the banks of various nalas in the taluka. Despite repeated attempts to draw the government's attention to the issue, no concrete action was taken. Frustrated by inaction, leaders of the Nationalist Congress Party (Sharad Pawar faction), along with affected farmers, had recently warned of an agitation during a press conference held 15 days ago. Responding to this pressure, the administration has now initiated the long-awaited nala deepening and straightening operations. "Although delayed, this development is a testament to the farmers' united struggle," said Sharad Maind, State General Secretary of the NCP (Sharad Pawar), in a statement to the Nagpur Post. The villages affected include Sandwa, Mandwa, Bori (M), Borgadi, Bori, and Kopra, where last year's floods had caused extensive damage to nearby farmlands, leaving many farmers in distress. Since then, Sharad Maind has led a continuous campaign involving several protests, demanding deepening and widening of nalas and the construction of flood-protection walls. Former MP and current MLA Bhavana Gawli facilitated two meetings between the farmers and then Chief Minister Eknath Shinde. During these meetings,



the Chief Minister had instructed the then District Collector to take prompt action. However, due to the upcoming Assembly elections, the work was delayed, and even after the elections, the matter remained neglected. On June 1, 2025, Sharad Maind once again raised the issue during a press conference and warned of launching an agitation. Media coverage of the issue compelled the administration to act, and the work finally began. On-site inspections of the work in progress were conducted today, during which several community leaders and farmers were present.
