## Fadnavis slams Rahul Gandhi over voter list

**Mumbai, June 24 (UNI)** Responding to the fresh barrage of charges by Leader of the Opposition in Lok Sabha, Rahul Gandhi, regarding voter list manipulation in the state, Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis on Tuesday argued that Congress won at more than two dozen places where the voter turnout increased by over eight percent. "...juth bole kauwakate, kale kauwese dariyo..." it's understood that the pain of Maharashtra's crushing defeat is growing day by day. But how long will you keep shooting arrows in the air?" he said in a post on X, while responding to the charges as he reels out facts and figures. According to him, there are more than 25 constituencies in Maharashtra where voter turnout increased by over eight percent between the Lok Sabha and Assembly elections, and Congress won in many of those places. "In the West Nagpur constituency, adjacent to my South-West region, voter turnout increased by seven percent (27,065) and Congress candidate Vikas Thakre won the election. In North Nagpur also, voter turnout increased by seven percent (29,348) and Nitin Raut of Congress won. In Pune district's Wadgaon Sheri, voter turnout increased by 10 percent (50,911) and Bapusaheb Pathare from the Sharad Pawar faction won. In Malad West, voter turnout increased by 11 percent (38,625), and your Congress party's Aslam Shaikh won. In Mumbai, voter turnout increased by nine percent (46,041) and Jitendra Awhad from the Sharad Pawar faction won," Fadnavis said. "Even if not with allied parties, it would have been better if you had spoken to your own party's long-time associates like Aslam Shaikh, Vikas Thakre and Nitin Raut before this tweet. At least the Congress wouldn't have performed so poorly due to lack of communication," he added.

## Operation Sindhu: More flights bring back Indians evacuated from Iran and Israel

**New Delhi, June 24 (UNI)** Amid the Middle East conflict, Operation Sindhu saw more Indians evacuated from Iran and Israel arriving in New Delhi, along with some Sri Lankan and Nepalese nationals. So far, 2,576 Indians have been evacuated from Iran, while 594 Indians have been brought back from Israel. The MEA spokesperson gave information in posts on X: On the latest evacuation from Iran, he posted that Minister of State for External Affairs Pabitra Margherita received the latest batch of 281 Indians, three Sri Lankan nationals and two Nepalese, evacuated from Iran, in Delhi.

## Maha government goes completely paperless, distributes iPads to ministers

**Mumbai 24 June:** In a significant move to digitalise India, the Maharashtra government on Tuesday decided to go completely paperless. All the ministers were given iPads to help them perform their routine official tasks efficiently. Food and Civil Supplies Minister Chhagan Bhujbal told UNI that cabinet agendas, notes and minutes of previous meetings will now be shared via email with ministers and the Chief Minister. These documents can be accessed directly on the provided iPads. The ministers were then given a briefing on how to use the iPad effectively by the state's Information Technology Department. Each minister received login credentials, including passwords for the devices and their official email accounts. Presentations (PPTs) made during cabinet meetings, as well as records of past cabinet decisions, will also be available through



their emails. To implement an e-cabinet system, the state government had decided to distribute iPads to the ministers for 1.6 crore. However, earlier, the government had cancelled

the work order to buy 50 Apple iPads after the supplier said that the iPad was not immediately available. RTI Activist Vijay Kumbhar had also criticised this move.

## I never contested cooperative society election while in govt: Sharad Pawar criticises Ajit

**Baramati (Pune), June 24 (UNI)** Nationalist Congress Party (NCP-SP) Supremo Sharad Pawar on Tuesday criticised Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar for contesting the Malegaon sugar factory election and said that people holding high government positions should stay away from cooperative society polls. "I have never contested cooperative society elections while in government in my 40 years of career," said the veteran leader. Pawar was talking to reporters in Baramati in the backdrop of Ajit Pawar's Nilkantheshwar panel winning a clear victory in the Malegaon Cooperative sugar factory election. Ajit Pawar is himself one of the contestants in the sugar factory election. "In my 40-year career, I have not



contested any cooperative election while holding a government office. If the opposition faces any problem, how can a person in government who is the head of a factory give justice to the opposition", the senior Pawar said

## Raut slams Fadnavis, Shinde

**Mumbai, June 24 (UNI)** Shiv Sena (UBT) leader and MP Sanjay Raut on Tuesday lashed out at state Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis and his deputy Eknath Shinde over alleged neglect of the Marathi language and their bid to promote Hindi language, accusing them of being enemies of Maharashtra. Fadnavis is the Chief Minister of this Marathi state and he should first work to improve poor condition of the Marathi schools, he said. Criticising further, Raut said that Fadnavis should see how the Marathi language can gain strength and how the Marathi people can live with dignity in Marathi soil. The Sena (UBT) leader cautioned the Chief Minister to take care that he does not become a slave of industrialist Gautam Adani and Lodha Builders. There is no need for Maharashtra to take Hindi seriously, he asserted and said that people of Maharashtra and Mumbai know Hindi. "If there was enmity between Maharashtra and Hindi, would Hindi films, literature and schools be running in the state," he questioned.



## India welcomes reported ceasefire between Israel, Iran, says willing to play role in peace efforts

**New Delhi, June 24 (UNI)** India on Tuesday welcomed the reports of ceasefire between Israel and Iran and the role played by US and Qatar in bringing it about, reiterating that there is no alternative to dialogue and diplomacy to resolve multiple conflicts in the region. A spokesman of the External Affairs Ministry said India stands ready to play its part in these efforts and hopes that all concerned parties will work towards sustained peace and stability. "We welcome reports of a ceasefire between Iran and Israel and the role played by the US and Qatar in bringing it about," the spokesman said while expressing 'deep concern' at the prospects for overall and sustained regional security and stability. The spokesman said India has been following developments overnight relating to the conflict between Iran and Israel, including the US action against Iran's nuclear facilities and



Iranian retaliation against US military bases in Qatar and remains deeply concerned about the prospects for overall and sustained regional security and stability. "India stands ready to play its part in these efforts and hopes that all concerned parties will work towards sustained peace and stability," the spokesman added.

## Shrinete slams Modi Govt over US travel advisory on India

**New Delhi, June 24 (UNI)** Congress spokesperson Supriya Shrinete on Tuesday slammed the Narendra Modi government over the recently issued "US travel advisory" that warns American citizens, especially women, against travelling alone in India, citing incidents of rape, violence and the potential for terror attacks. "It is deeply ironic and damaging that such an advisory has been issued for India, a nation



striving for global leadership. This has far-reaching implications on our international standing," Ms Shrinete said while addressing a press conference here. She said

that no similar advisory has been issued for Pakistan—a country "widely acknowledged as a terror hub" that shelters internationally designated terrorists like Masood Azhar, Hafiz Saeed, and Dawood Ibrahim. The senior Congress leader also criticised the reported invitation extended to Pakistan's Field Marshal Asim Munir for a dinner with US President Donald Trump.

## England opens unbroken at Day 5 lunch, India toil

**Leeds, June 24 (UNI)** England made a strong statement in their pursuit of a challenging target of 471, reaching 117 for no loss at lunch on Day 5 of the ongoing Test, with openers Zak Crawley and Ben Duckett laying a solid foundation under overcast conditions. Despite the gloomy skies and early movement, Indian pacers Jasprit Bumrah and Mohammed Siraj kept things tight in the first hour, but the breakthrough eluded them. Prasidh Krishna showed flashes of promise but struggled with consistency in his line. Shardul Thakur bowled just three overs, while Ravindra Jadeja found little assistance from the surface and did not extract much turn. Duckett took advantage of Krishna's erratic lengths, cruising to a fluent half-century off 66 balls, peppered with



eight boundaries. Crawley, meanwhile, played the supporting role with a more cautious approach, defending straight and timing his drives neatly. India repeatedly asked for a ball change and were finally granted one three overs before lunch. Bumrah immediately returned and

generated a half-chance that went down, adding to India's frustration. There was a brief moment of success for India when Crawley was adjudged LBW on 15.4, but the decision was overturned on review. With England resuming the day on 21 for no loss, their openers have added 96 runs in the first session, clearly dominating proceedings. As the pitch eases further and the sun threatens to peek through, the upcoming afternoon session may tilt further in the batsmen's favour. With Duckett on 64 and Crawley on 42, and all ten wickets intact, England will look to shift gears post-lunch.

## MahaNirmithi to set up 1,071 MW solar power projects in Maharashtra

**Mumbai, June 24 (UNI)** To promote sustainable development in the state, 1,071 MW solar power projects will be commissioned by MahaNirmithi under the Chief Minister Solar Energy Project 2.0 soon, thereby benefiting three lakh farmers in the state, said Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis here on Tuesday. MahaNirmithi, which is the second largest state-owned generation company in the country after National Thermal Power Company (NTPC), is launching renewable energy projects, which will help reduce carbon emissions by providing electricity at lower rates to electricity consumers, he said. The Chief Minister further said that the state government aims to increase agricultural productivity by reducing dependence on conventional energy, reducing carbon emissions and providing uninterrupted power supply to farmers for irrigation during the day. The Mukhyamantri Saur Krishi Vahini Yojana 2.0 is an ambitious scheme of the Maharashtra government to reduce the cost of servicing agricultural consumers and to develop farmers economically through sustainable energy, he said and informed that under this scheme, agricultural pumps are being connected to solar projects. The target of solarisation of about 30 percent of the feeders by 2025 has been set as 'Mission 2025', under which decentralised solar projects of 0.5 MW to 25 MW capacity are being set up within a radius of 5-10 km from the distribution substation with agricultural load to provide electricity to farmers during the day, Fadnavis added.

## HC dismisses plea challenging BJP MLA Rajendra Gavit on ground of polygamy

**Mumbai, June 24 (UNI)** The Bombay High Court has dismissed a petition challenging the election of BJP MLA Rajendra Gavit from Palghar, ruling that polygamy particularly when permitted by tribal customs does not amount to electoral misconduct if disclosed transparently in the nomination affidavit. Justice Sandeep Marne, delivering the order on Monday, observed that Gavit, a member of the tribal Bhil community, had made an "honest and voluntary



disclosure" of both his spouses in the election affidavit, including their PAN details and the status of their income tax returns. The HC disposed of the petition filed by social activist Sudhir Jain, a voter from Palghar, who sought to declare Gavit's election null and void. Jain contended that the inclusion

of Rupali Gavit's name as Gavit's wife rendered the affidavit false, claiming the second marriage was invalid under the Hindu Marriage Act. However, the court observed that Gavit's tribal status allows such a marriage and pointed out that there was no provision under the election rules barring voluntary disclosures of this nature. It stated that candidates from communities or religions that permit polygamy should not be barred from contesting elections on this ground.

## Father, son die of electrocution in Jamkhed

**Ahilyanagar, June 24 (UNI)** A 42-year-old man and his son died after electrocution in Shikare Vast in Jamkhed taluka of the district on Monday evening. According to police, the deceased were identified as Kakasaheb Daulat Shikare (42) & Ganesh Kakasaheb Shikare (15). Kakasaheb Shikare, a member of Balghan GP in Shikare Vasti of Jamkhed, and his son Ganesh had gone to apply fertiliser to farms. At this time, both died from electrocution from MSEB overhead wires that were already broken at that place.

## Indian Railways to hike passenger fares from July 1

**New Delhi, June 24 (UNI)** The Indian Railways is likely to increase the fares of its long-distance passengers from July 1. The Indian Railways has decided to increase the fares of Mail Express trains by 1 paise per km for sleeper class and 2 paise per km for AC classes from July 1. According to sources, there will be no increase in the rate of general unreserved class tickets for distance up to 500 km, while for distance beyond 500 km, the fare rate is proposed to be increased by half paise per km. Similarly, there will be no increase in the rates of suburban and monthly or quarterly season tickets. It is noteworthy that the passenger fares of the railway were last increased in the year 2014. The increase in fares was affected by 14.2 per cent and 6.5 per cent in all classes of passenger fares with effect from June 25 that year. In the year 2019, the passengers in the unreserved class in Mail Express trains were increased by 2 paise per kilometer. The fare for sleeper class has been increased by 2 paise and for first class by 2 paise. The fare for second class trains was increased by 01 paise per km and for sleeper class by 01 paise. While the fare of the first class was increased by 1 paise. The fare was increased by a uniform 0.4 paise per kilometer in all AC classes. This increase came into effect from January 2020.

## Father son duo arrested for running sex racket



**Nagpur 24 June:** In a major crackdown, the Social Security Branch (SSB) of the Crime Branch on Monday busted a sex racket being run by a father-son duo at OYO Green Guest House, located behind Jayanti Nagari 07 in Dattadham Nagar, Besa Road, under the jurisdiction of Hudkeshwar Police Station. Two victimized women were rescued during the operation. The accused have been identified as Prajwal Sachin Tule (22) and his father Sachin Gangadhar Tule (47), both residents of Dattadham Nagar, Besa Road. Police sources confirmed that the duo is reportedly close aides of notorious gangster Santosh Ambekar and have a history of serious criminal offences, including murder and attempted murder cases registered against them. The raid was conducted based on a tip-off received by the Crime Branch. A team led by Police Inspector Gajanan Gulhane carried out the operation between 4:20 PM and 8:30 PM on Monday. The team included Head Constables Prakash Mathankar, Vivek Adhav, WHC Anup Yadav, NPC Sheshrao Raut, and Police Constables Kunal Masram, Sameer Sheikh, and Kunal Bokhade. During the operation, police found the two women being forced into prostitution. They were rescued and sent for medical examination. Authorities seized two mobile phones valued at Rs 40 thousand, a packet of condoms worth Rs 10, and Rs 2,600 in cash, totaling a seizure of Rs 42,610. A case has been registered at Hudkeshwar Police Station under Sections 143(2)(3) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) and Sections 3, 4, and 5 of the Prevention of Immoral Traffic Act (PITA), 1956. The rescued women and seized materials have been handed over to the Hudkeshwar Police for further legal proceedings. The bust has once again exposed how organized criminal elements are exploiting women through illegal activities under the guise of hospitality. Investigations are ongoing to determine the full extent of the racket and identify other potential accomplices.

## Ex-driver sets two trucks on fire over financial dispute with owner

**Nagpur 24 June:** In a shocking incident near the Dainik Bhaskar office on the Ashok Chowk—Baidhyanath Chowk Road on Monday, two parked trucks caught fire, with both cabins completely destroyed, resulting in losses worth lakhs of rupees. Preliminary investigation suggests that the fire was intentionally set using petrol, allegedly by a former truck driver over a financial dispute.



The incident occurred on Monday afternoon, prompting an immediate response from the Fire Department, which deployed two fire tenders to bring the blaze under control. No injuries were reported, but the truck cabins were reduced to ashes. Acting swiftly, the Imamwada Police detained

the accused, Akash Tekam (40), a resident of Beltarodi, who earlier worked as a driver and loader on the trucks. The trucks were owned by Sidappa, who had recently terminated Tekam's employment due to his alleged substance abuse. According to truck

owner Sidappa, he had fired Tekam around 10 days ago due to his addiction issues. "He used to call me only when he was intoxicated. I told him to settle accounts once he was sober," said Sidappa. He further added that Tekam had already started working elsewhere

and was not in further contact. Police suspect that Tekam poured petrol into bottles and intentionally set the vehicles ablaze as an act of revenge. He was spotted near the scene shortly before the fire broke out. The Imamwada Police are interrogating him to ascertain the full motive and source of the petrol. Senior Police Inspector Rahul Shire of Imamwada Police Station was present at the scene with his team. Authorities halted traffic from Ashok Chowk to Baidhyanath Chowk to facilitate the movement of fire tenders, helping prevent the fire from spreading further. The Imamwada Police have registered a case and are investigating the incident under relevant sections of arson and criminal damage.

## Triple seat bike on wrong side collides with pickup on Nagpur-Amravati Highway; 1 dead, 2 critical

**Nagpur 24 June:** In a tragic mishap on Monday afternoon, a triple-seat motorcycle riding on the wrong side of the Nagpur-Amravati National Highway collided head-on with a Bolero pickup truck near Bharatnagar, under Wadi Police Station limits. The accident left one man dead on the spot and two others critically injured. The deceased has been identified as Uttamkumar Mangalaram Thakur (35), a resident of Ambazari and an employee of the Ordnance Factory, Nagpur. His two injured friends, Satish Lakda (28) and Fulchand Ikka (32), were riding with him on a motorcycle (MH-31/EX-1246) towards Waddhamna from Athwa Mile, in clear violation of traffic norms—triple-seat and wrong-way driving. Eyewitness accounts suggest that the bike rider was allegedly under the influence of alcohol, which may have contributed to the accident. Around 12 pm, a Bolero pickup truck (MH-49/BZ-0093) heading towards Wadi from Waddhamna rammed the motorcycle head-on. The collision was so intense that Uttamkumar died instantly, while the other two sustained serious



injuries and were rushed to a nearby hospital. The pickup driver fled the scene after the incident. Wadi Police have registered a case and launched a manhunt to trace the absconding driver. Authorities are also probing the role of drunk and negligent driving by the motorcycle rider. A panchnama was conducted at the site and further investigation is underway.

## Nagpur Bharosa Cell counsels 98% family disputes since 2017

**Nagpur 24 June:** In a major boost to police-led family counselling services, the Bharosa Cell in Nagpur has successfully counsels 98% of the family dispute cases it received since its establishment in 2017. Notably, around 40% of couples chose to reunite and continue their married life following counselling, said Commissioner of Police Dr. Ravinder Kumar Singal on Monday, June 23, during the inauguration of the Cell's newly constructed building on Katol Road, near the Police Headquarters. Despite limited resources and increasing domestic conflicts, the Nagpur Police's Bharosa Cell has emerged as a vital institution for conflict

resolution and marital counselling. Dr. Singal emphasized how domestic disputes, if unresolved, often escalate into violence or legal cases. He added that the newly inaugurated building—built on officially allotted police land—will soon feature a children's play area, making it more family-friendly. Joint Commissioner of Police Ravinchandra Reddy noted that the Bharosa Cell was previously operating from a rented space in Subhash Nagar, which many citizens found inconvenient. This led to plans for two more Bharosa Cells in the city. However, due to manpower limitations, the plan couldn't be executed. "With the new centrally located building,

the Bharosa Cell is now more accessible to the public and better equipped to serve families in distress," he said. Additional Commissioner of Police Vasant Pardeshi highlighted how the Bharosa Cell helps couples avoid long court procedures through effective counselling. He added, "The rain that graced the inauguration event seemed symbolic of the Cell's goodwill and tireless efforts to keep families together." Senior police officials including DCP Lohit Matani, Rahul Makhnkar, Shweta Khedkar, Ashwini Patil, and other high-ranking officers from the Nagpur Police Department were present at the inauguration event.

## Missing deaf mute children found safe after 5 hour police search in Wathoda

**Nagpur 24 June:** In a heartwarming rescue operation, two deaf-mute children who went missing from Bidgaon in Wathoda were found safe after a five-hour joint search by the Wathoda Police and alert local residents. The operation, which ended around 2:30 am on Sunday, brought massive relief to their anxious family and the city's police force. The missing children, aged five and six, had recently arrived from Bihar to stay with their relatives in Bidgaon, under Wathoda police limits, just 15 days prior. On Saturday evening around 5:00 pm, the cousins last saw the two kids playing outside their home. When the children failed to return after a long time, the family began searching. After their efforts yielded no result, they panicked and informed

the Wathoda Police Station. Responding swiftly, Wathoda police circulated the children's physical descriptions and photographs to the city police control room and nearby police stations. Commissioner of Police Dr. Ravinder Kumar Singal personally arrived at the scene along with senior officers. Multiple teams—including beat marshals and the Crime Branch—were deployed to track the children. Police vans patrolled the neighborhood, broadcasting messages and seeking public assistance. Locals actively joined the search, demonstrating strong community cooperation. During the search, a local resident informed the police about seeing the children near a railway bridge and a



reservoir. Officers were immediately sent to check the area. While police feared the worst and searched the reservoir, no signs of the children were found there. Eventually, around 2:30 am, the children were spotted walking near the railway tracks close to Chhatrapur Farm, about 3 kilometers from their home. Police, assisted by residents, brought the children safely to the station and reunited them with their family. According to

the police, the children had unknowingly wandered off too far while playing and lost their way. Being mute and deaf, they were unable to ask for help and kept walking in the wrong direction. The successful rescue operation was led by PI Harish Borade and PSI Madhav Gundekar, along with their team. Locals Sachin Dhomne, Prajwal Wasnik, and Guddu Shevne were also instrumental in helping the police trace the missing children.

## Faculty Development Program on Arthasastra and Nitisastra concludes at SCMS



**Nagpur 24 June:** A significant stride in the integration of Bharatiya knowledge systems into modern academic discourse was marked by the successful completion of a two-day Faculty Development Program (FDP) on Indian Knowledge Systems: With Special Focus on Arthasastra and Nitisastra at Symbiosis Centre for Management Studies (SCMS), Nagpur. ## NMC election in 2026? New govt notification sparks speculation



**Nagpur 24 June:** Municipal corporations across Maharashtra—including major ones like Mumbai, Nagpur, and Pune—have been under administrative rule for the past three years. Citizens have long been awaiting the formation of a new elected body, but that wait may be extended even further. A new notification by the state government regarding ward delimitation has fueled speculation that the civic elections may be pushed to early 2026. The Urban Development Department has now extended the deadline for submitting the final ward delimitation report from September 4 to September 6, 2025. Given the timeline for subsequent

processes—including reservation allocations and the preparation of the final voters' list—the likelihood of municipal elections taking place within 2025 has diminished. **Key Deadlines in the New Notification:**  
■ June 11–16, 2025: Arrangement of enumeration groups  
■ June 17–July 24, 2025: Preparation of draft ward structure  
■ August 1–5, 2025: Submission of draft to the Urban Development Department  
■ July 6–11, 2025: Proposal of draft ward structure to the Election Commission  
■ Late July: Publication of draft ward

structure; public objections suggestions invited  
■ August 29–September 8, 2025: Hearings on objections  
■ September 9–15, 2025: Submission of final ward structure to the Urban Development Department  
■ September 16–22, 2025: Final submission to the State Election Commission  
■ October 3–6, 2025: Final ward structure to be published

Once the ward structure is finalized, the process of determining reservation for OBC, SC, and ST categories will begin. This is expected to take around 8 days. Following that, the compilation of the final voter list will require another 6 to 8 weeks. Considering this timeline, the civic elections—originally expected in late 2025—are now all but certain to take place in early 2026. The delay has sparked debates in political and civic circles, as many had anticipated polls within the 2025 calendar year. The official timeline, however, paints a different picture—reinforcing the notion that Nagpur Municipal Corporation (NMC) elections are likely headed for 2026.

## PI Kanchan Pandey joins Sindewahi police station



**Sindewahi 24 June (NAGPUR POST/TC):** At Sindewahi Police station Vijay Rathod was working as PI. New smart meters will stay post-paid, not prepaid: MSEDCL clears air

**Nagpur 24 June:** Maharashtra's power consumers can breathe easy — there's no prepaid recharges system coming with the new smart meters. Amid widespread confusion and rumours, MSEDCL Director (Operations and Projects) Sachin Talewar categorically clarified that the smart meters being rolled out across the state will remain strictly postpaid, just like the traditional ones. Speaking during a regional review meeting at Vidyut Bhavan, Nagpur, on Saturday, Talewar said, "There is no shift to prepaid billing. Consumers will receive electricity bills as usual, with the standard 15-day advance disconnection notice applicable in case of payment default." The smart meters, however, come with upgraded technology, allowing consumers to track their real-time power consumption via mobile apps, helping promote transparency and efficient energy use. During the review meeting, attended by senior officials from Nagpur, Gondia, Chandrapur, Amravati, and Akola divisions, Talewar expressed serious concern over rising arrears. He directed field teams to ensure 100% recovery of pending dues by June-end and to plug loopholes contributing to abnormal losses. Issues like inaccurate consumer mapping, irregular load shifting, and multiplier factor errors were flagged. Talewar called for immediate rectification to prevent revenue leakage. He also ordered a verification drive to curb cases of multiple electricity connections registered at the same address — a common tactic in billing disputes and theft cases. As Maharashtra accelerates solar adoption under state and central schemes, Talewar instructed that all system-strengthening work — including upgrades of substations, feeder separation, and solar village model implementation — must be completed on priority to avoid future bottlenecks. He stressed the importance of quality, adequate manpower, and material supply for these projects. Progress on the CM's Solar Agricultural Feeder Scheme, demand-based solar pump installations, daytime power for farmers, and the PM's Surya Ghar Free Electricity Scheme were reviewed. The meeting was attended by Chief Engineers Suhas Rangari, Dilip Dode, Harish Gajbe, Rajesh Naik; Superintending Engineers Amit Paranjpe, Mangesh Vaidya, Sanjeev Wakade, Anil Wakode, Deepak Devhate; along with Executive Engineers from Nagpur city.

Issues of obstacles in flight path comes to light at proposed Gadchiroli airport site

Authorities initiate search for alternative location

**Gadchiroli 24 June:** Too many obstacles in the flight path and prospects of further vertical growth in Gadchiroli city, given the development push, has prompted the state govt to look for an alternative site for its plan to build an airport in the Maoist-affected district. The Maharashtra Airport Development Company (MADC) had planned the airport close to Gadchiroli city. The initial site covered four villages: Murkhada, Pulkhal, Kanori and Mudhja. MADC was appointed as the agency to acquire 229 acres of land for the project after the initial study was completed. The study revealed that there were a number of obstacles in the flight path, including building of an educational institute, a high-tension line, and a power plant chimney. If a flight path avoiding the obstacles was fixed at the same site, it would have increased the project cost by at least Rs150 crore, said sources. Rather, it is now decided to look for an alternative site. The city is expected to grow in the coming days, and the structures that come up may further obstruct the operations, said a source who is part of the project. A senior official in the district administration confirmed the development. MADC has intimated that a fresh site needs to be searched for the proposed airport. Now, a site slightly away from the city is being considered.

Flood drill for natural disaster management conducted in Gondia



**Gadchiroli 24 June:** Officials at Kornighat Bagh River in Gondia taluka conducted a flood management drill in the region, helping residents with search and rescue efforts during potential flooding situations. The exercise was demonstrated using various tools to highlight the practice. The rescue team implemented prompt actions to protect people in crisis like situations. Trainings and workshops are being arranged throughout the district under the supervision of District Collector Prajit Nair. The practice exercise occurred on the Bagh River in Gondia, recognized for traversing the district's eastern section and merging with the Wainganga River. It serves as an important water source for irrigation and various uses, with the Sirpur Dam situated close to Deori forming a reservoir that supports water delivery. There have also been unfortunate events, like the drowning of three women during a ceremony at Korni Ghat. The mock drill follows the drowning of three women from the Turkur family while bathing in the Bagh River on June 8. Meenakshi Santosh Baghel (39), Neetu Shatrudhan Baghel (35), and Mirabai Ishulal Turkur (50), who live in Nagpur, were performing pindadaan at Korni Ghat. The event happened when Neetu lost her footing, causing Meenakshi and Mirabai to try to save her, leading to all three drowning. There is no established connection between the mock drill and the tragic event that occurred on June 8. Weather update for Gondia indicated overcast weather at 31°C, 0% chance of rain, 66% humidity, and wind at 21 km/h. Daily temperatures vary between 24°C and 33°C, falling to 25°C at night. Saturday and Sunday are predicted to have rain, with daytime temperatures reaching 33°C to 32°C and nighttime lows near 26°C. Rain is also forecasted for Monday, with temperatures remaining consistent. Light rain persists from Tuesday through Friday, with a minor drop to 27°C by the following Friday. In general, diverse weather patterns indicate rain.

Tiger strolling on highway brings traffic to halt

tranquilised after thousands gather for glimpse

**Gadchiroli 24 June:** Traffic on a state highway passing through a village in Maharashtra's Gondia district came to a standstill for over half an hour after a tiger was seen taking a stroll there, prompting thousands of curious onlookers to throng the spot to catch a glimpse of the majestic feline. The drama ended after the tiger was finally tranquillised by the forest department personnel from a nearby spot. The incident occurred around 10 am on the highway between Sakhrithola and Anjora in Amgaon taluka. It took more than two hours for the forest team to tranquillise and rescue the big cat as it had a tough time controlling the large crowd. An official said the tiger had earlier been spotted near human settlements located on the peripheries of Yermada, Wadad, Togaon,

Robbers use threat to loot man at knife-point, arrested

**Nagpur 24 June:** In a shocking incident near Ganga-Jamuna under the jurisdiction of Lakadganj Police, two accused allegedly threatened a man by accusing him of selling ganja and then robbed him at knife-point. The accused were later apprehended by Crime Branch Unit 3, and a total of Rs 1.06 lakh worth of stolen property, including the getaway vehicle, was seized. The incident occurred around 11:40 pm on June 22, when the complainant, Ramesh Vishnu Devangan (34), a resident of Plot No. 59, Kawardh, was traveling in his Hyundai car (MH 49 CL 6463) along with Rs 55,000 for recovery-related work. He was accompanied by his friend Sachin Rathod (37), a resident of Mhalgi Nagar. When they halted near the road leading to Balaji Mandir in Ganga-Jamuna, two unidentified men on an Activa approached Devangan. One of the accused confronted him,



saying, "Do you supply ganja? I'll have you arrested." The duo then brandished a knife and forcefully snatched Rs 4,500 cash from the complainant before fleeing the spot. Based on the complaint, Lakadganj Police registered a case under Sections 309(4) and 3(5) of

the BNS. Taking parallel action, officers and personnel from Crime Branch Unit 3, under the guidance of senior officials, initiated a technical investigation. Acting swiftly, they laid a trap and apprehended the accused — Himanshu Namdev

HC junks PILs opposing nod for capacity expansion at Surjagarh iron ore mines

**Gadchiroli 24 June:** The Bombay High Court has dismissed two public interest litigations (PILs) challenging the Centre's grant of permission to capacity expansion at Surjagarh iron ore mines of Lloyds Metals and Energy Ltd in Maharashtra's Gadchiroli district, saying they were devoid of merit. The PILs, filed by a Raipur resident, alleged the entire process of Environmental Clearance granted by the Union Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change (MoEF&CC) for expansion of mining capacity at Surjagarh from 3 MTPA to 10 MTPA and further Term of Reference (ToR) towards expansion from 10 MTPA to 26 MTPA, was illegal. The pleas were filed by Raipur resident Samarjeet Chatterjee in the HC's Nagpur bench. A division bench of Justices Nitin Sambre and Abhay Mantri, in its order of May 9 which was uploaded on Friday, observed that due procedure based on ToR (for capacity expansion) was followed and added both PILs were devoid of merit. The petitioner had also alleged that a public hearing for environmental clearance was conducted at a place far away from the project site in Gadchiroli, a Naxal-affected

district in eastern Maharashtra. On this, the court observed, "The fact remains that in compliance with the Environmental Impact Assessment notification dated May 29, 2006, as amended on December 1, 2009, a public hearing was conducted at the district headquarters, which is perhaps properly secured in view of the Naxal menace." Counsels for the respondents submitted the petitioner has no locus standi in the matter, and since he never attended the hearing conducted by the collector at the district headquarters, he lost the opportunity to question the legality of orders impugned in these PILs. They submitted that the initial Environmental Clearance (EC) was granted in 2005-06 after the hearing conducted by the collector at the very same place. The said hearing was never questioned by the

petitioner for the last 20 years, thereby raising doubts about his intention. The counsels noted the EC for 10 MTPA was issued by MoEF&CC in strict compliance with provisions of the EIA notification dated May 29, 2006, and the SOP (standard operating procedure) issued by the

Ministry. Though the hearing was conducted at Gadchiroli district headquarters on recommendation of the police department as the project site fell within a Naxal-affected area, all local residents were given due opportunity to present their say on the mining project, they argued.

## Adani Airports secures USD 1 billion financing from Global Investors for Mumbai International Airport

## Industry leaders unite behind Tata Chairman's 'Exemplary' response to AI171 tragedy

**Mumbai 24 June:** As investigations continue into the June 12 Air India Flight AI171 crash that claimed 275 lives, an unprecedented show of support from industry leaders has emerged for Tata Sons Chairman N. Chandrasekaran's handling of the tragedy, with many calling his response a benchmark for crisis leadership. "I just deeply regret that this whole accident happened... and I feel very sorry," Chandrasekaran told a TV interview, his voice heavy with emotion. The chairman's raw honesty and refusal to deflect responsibility have drawn widespread acclaim from aviation experts and business leaders alike. Captain Kishore Chinta, a veteran investigator formerly with India's Aircraft Accident Investigation Bureau, emphasised the exceptional nature of the incident. "This represents the rarest of the rare scenarios in aviation. To my knowledge, nothing quite like this has ever happened," Chinta told the BBC, underlining the unprecedented challenges facing the airline's leadership. In a particularly striking moment, Chandrasekaran invoked his legendary predecessors with remarkable humility. "I am no JRD, I am no RNT (Ratan Naval Tata). But we all are driven by these values and hope we will conduct ourselves with the character and determination so that everyone can be proud of us."

# World Vitiligo Day



The World Vitiligo Day, observed on June 25, is an initiative aimed to build global awareness about vitiligo. Vitiligo occurs in 1–2% of the population worldwide; a change of color in the skin creating a variety of patterns on the skin from the loss of pigment. Vitiligo is often called a disease instead of a disorder and that can have a significant negative social and/or psychological impact on patients, in part because of numerous misconceptions still present in large parts of the world.

The idea of a World Vitiligo Day was first nursed by Steve Haragadon, the founder of the Vitiligo Friends network, and then developed and finalized by Ogo Maduewesi, a Nigerian vitiligo patient who is the founder and Executive Director of the Vitiligo Support and Awareness Foundation (VITSAF). In her words, "World Vitiligo Day is a day to create extensive awareness on vitiligo and a day dedicated to all living with vitiligo globally". The first World Vitiligo Day (also defined as "Vitiligo Awareness Day" or "Vitiligo Purple Fun day", from the color chosen as Vitiligo Awareness Color) was observed on June 25, 2011. The choice of June 25 as World Vitiligo Day is a memorial to musical artist Michael Jackson, who suffered from vitiligo from the early 1980s until his death, which occurred on June 25, 2009. The main event of the first World Vitiligo Day occurred at Silverbird Galleria's Arttrium in Lagos, Nigeria, with the participation of several volunteers with different experiences (dermatologists, motivational speakers, dancers, artists, comedians, patients), united by the common will of spreading knowledge and awareness about vitiligo. Simultaneously, other events took place in other parts of the world, organized by local associations. In 2012, Vitiligo Research Foundation (VRF), a non-profit organization aiming to fund and fast-track medical research, as well as connect investigators, care providers, patients and philanthropists, to accelerate vitiligo research and relieve the suffering of patients, registered the Web domain name [25june.org](http://25june.org) and joined VITSAF and cooperating organizations to increase the efficacy of their efforts in favor of global vitiligo awareness.

## 50 years after Emergency, our democracy still fragile

Remembering is somewhat easy, not forgetting much more difficult. Remembering involves recalling. In the case of the Emergency that was declared on June 25, 1975, just 50 years back, one can resurrect much of what happened in the following 21 months in considerable detail. The events are well chronicled and, above all, etched in the memory of those who lived through that period. The more challenging task is 'not forgetting', for it entails learning from that experience so that we are not "condemned to repeat" the same mistakes. Hence, the most important question for us today is — what have we learnt, and even more importantly, what can we learn from the experience of the Emergency? Looking back at those tumultuous months, perhaps the most important lesson for us is that there is a distinction between the letter of the law and the spirit of the law, and it is the latter that can nurture democratic life. In 1975, the Allahabad High Court set aside Prime Minister Indira Gandhi's Lok Sabha election victory on the grounds of electoral malpractices. Although the Supreme Court stayed that verdict, the opposition within the House and outside asked for her resignation on moral grounds. They questioned her moral legitimacy to rule and govern, invoking as it were, an appeal to the conscience (and not merely to the letter of the law) to do the right thing. Mrs Gandhi prioritised political judgement over the moral one and we know the consequences of that decision. In the hustle and bustle of electoral competitive politics, the moral frequently loses out to the practical-political, and every time that happens democracy takes a step back. How can we bring the 'moral' back into political life? The Emergency has left us with this difficult question, and even today we are no closer to answering it. However, what that period in our history has shown is that democracy stays on track when governments take note of the concerns raised by the Opposition. When they dismiss them, as Mrs Gandhi did then, democracy is at risk. Our Constitution has provisions for declaring state and national emergency along with clauses for 'preventive detention'.



declared under the existing constitutional provisions. The suspension of civil liberties and political rights, mass arrests of Opposition leaders, journalists and other dissenting voices under MISA (Maintenance of Internal Security Act) that allowed indefinite preventive detention, search and seizure without warrant, muzzling of the freedom of the press, postponement of elections to central and state legislative bodies, and with it, the concentration of power in the hands of the central executive, was made possible by the invocation of Article 352.

This, more than anything else, has made us aware that our democracy is fragile and our rights vulnerable. We cannot take either for granted. In 1975, even the Supreme Court ruled that writ petitions challenging the legality of detention could not be considered by the court during the period of the Emergency. Hence, without continuous vigilance by citizens and all institutions, we may always remain vulnerable. A few lessons have been learnt. In 1978, the 44th Amendment of the Constitution stipulated that Articles 20 and 21 (dealing with personal liberty) could not be suspended even during a declared Emergency.

Since then, the Supreme Court has also made some course correction. Reflecting on its own (in)action during the Emergency, it has extended and strengthened the right to liberty. In 2017, a Constitutional Bench ruled that the right to life and liberty is inalienable and its limitation must be in accordance with a procedure that is fair, just and reasonable. All these important changes in the institutional framework are a product of not forgetting the Emergency. However, much more still needs to be done. When legal

scholars note that the rules for granting bail remain flexible, open to considerable interpretation, at times presuming guilt rather than innocence, then the task of protecting the citizen's democratic rights remains unfinished and warrants urgent attention. No democracy is perfect. Each has its own weaknesses. In parliamentary democracies, elections often give one party the majority of the seats, and this allows it to shape laws and policies. Mrs Gandhi advised the President to declare the Emergency without a formal meeting and endorsement by the full Cabinet, saying that the threat of internal disturbances warranted immediate action. In hindsight, we can only underline the need for strengthening processes of formal consultation in an environment where different points of view are likely to be expressed. It did not happen in 1975 and democracy got derailed.

The Emergency did not merely suspend democratic rights. The policies during this period — from compulsory sterilisation to reporting dissent — were successfully and energetically pursued by innumerable officials at various levels. Writing about the extermination of Jews, Hannah Arendt argued that horrific acts of terror and violence were carried out by individuals who saw themselves as following orders. Bureaucratic structures promote this form of thoughtlessness and 'banality of evil'. We could question that analysis and say that individuals always have a choice. When the Emergency was declared, some resigned from their positions and refused to endorse the government's diktat. But expecting such heroic action from most people is unrealistic. Usually, the costs of critically assessing one's actions, or the attraction of promised rewards, take their toll. These vulnerabilities can only be addressed by creating a system in which each institution is held responsible and accountable for its actions and individuals within them protected by norms of collective action. The scars left by the Emergency are many. We cannot erase the past completely, but we do have an option, and an opportunity, to learn from it and shape a stronger democratic future.

District Collector Vanmathi C. presented the financial report, stating that Rs 374.43 crore had been sanctioned last year under the three schemes, of which Rs 374.43 crore was utilized — a 99.99% expenditure rate. For the current year, a total of Rs 412.70 crore has been approved: Rs 350 crore under the general plan, Rs 44 crore under the SC sub-plan, and Rs 18.70 crore under the

tribal sub-plan. Dr. Bhojar emphasized that departments must prepare proposals in consultation with elected representatives, secure administrative approvals, and focus on meaningful development. Department heads were instructed to ensure high-quality execution of all works. Raising concern over the condition of public grounds used for various programs in Wardha city, the minister ordered that cleanliness and proper restoration must be ensured post-events. He warned that contractor payments should be withheld until such cleaning is satisfactorily

completed. During the meeting, MLA Rajesh Bakane highlighted complaints regarding 'Varun' brand soybean seeds being of substandard quality, which could potentially cause significant losses to farmers. Dr. Bhojar ordered the Agriculture Department to investigate the stock and quality of these seeds in the district and initiate a prompt inquiry. The minister declared that students selected through taluka and district-level science exhibitions will be taken to Raman Science Centre in Nagpur. Additionally, 51 child scientists selected at the district level will be sent on an educational visit to the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) center in Bengaluru, aiming to foster scientific curiosity and excellence among students. Further, several key suggestions were presented by MPs and MLAs during the meeting. These included ensuring the availability of essential

Police have arrested the accused and a case has been registered at Chandrapur City Police Station under Section 103 (1) of the BNS. Further investigation into the case is being conducted under the leadership of Additional Superintendent of Police Rina Janbandhu, Naomi Satam, SDPO in charge, Sub-Division Chandrapur, PI Nishikant Ramteke. API Rajendra Sonavane and his team from Chandrapur city police are probing the case.

## Bachchu Kadu warns government against provoking violent agitation

### Demands immediate loan waiver implementation, announces 'Shetkari Nyay Yatra' from July 5



**Amravati 24 June (NAGPUR POST/DC):** "Do not compel us to resort to violent protests," warned Prahar Janshakti Party President and former Minister of State, Bachchu Kadu, as he issued a stern message to the government during a press interaction. He reiterated that while they have trusted the promises made by the state, the government must not push them toward aggressive agitation. "If the government has any conspiracy in mind, it will have to face the consequences," Kadu asserted. Criticizing the government's delay in announcing a concrete date for farm loan waivers, Kadu questioned, "Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnis has said the loan waiver will happen at the right time — but what better time than now, when over 1,000 farmers have committed suicide in the past six months?"

Does the government want more deaths?" He appealed to the government to announce the exact date of the loan waiver during the upcoming three-day assembly session.

**'Shetkari Nyay Yatra' to Commence from July 5**

A 138-kilometre-long march titled "Saatbara Kora Kora Yatra" will begin on July 5 under the leadership of Bachchu Kadu, demanding justice for neglected communities such as farmers, farm labourers, widows, the disabled, unemployed youth, gram panchayat workers, shepherds, fisherfolk, and backward classes. The march will commence from Papal village, the birthplace of Dr. Panjabrao Deshmukh, and conclude at Chilgavhan — the village of Sahebrao Karpe, the first farmer reported to have died by suicide. The route includes key stops at Umbarada Bazaar, Bodegaon, Darwha, Tiwari, Tupatkhal, Kali Daulat, and Gunj. Over the course of seven days, participants will cover 138 kilometers. Bachchu Kadu clarified that the yatra is not about a single political figure but a people's movement for the rights of the working and farming communities. The key demands include:

- \* Immediate halt to forced loan recoveries
- \* Implementation of farm loan waiver
- \* Enactment of policies to prevent farmer suicides
- \* Employment and welfare schemes for widows and the disabled
- \* Expansion of MNREGA from sowing to harvesting and increase in daily wages

\* Education and self-employment opportunities for youth

\* Public meetings and community dialogues will be held at every stop to understand local issues and rally support.

**'Sindur Yatra' from Ramayana to Constitution – A Symbolic Protest Against Farmer Suicides**

In another initiative, Prahar leader Bachchu Kadu will lead the 'Sindur Yatra' from August 5 to 9. The journey will begin from the sacred Shri Ram Mandir in Nagpur and culminate at the historic Deekshabhoomi in Nagpur on Kranti Din (August 9). The symbolic march aims to raise awareness about the alarming rate of farmer suicides caused by mounting debt. Kadu emphasized that these deaths often lead to widows losing not just their husbands but their marital identity — including their sindur and mangalsutra. The yatra will highlight the confluence of devotion (Ramayana) and constitutional rights (Constitution). Organizers stated that this campaign will include public awareness programs, farmer dialogues, and formal appeals for robust policy interventions to prevent farmer suicides.



## 'Roads in bad condition due to AMRUT 2.0 scheme, work should be stalled till repairs'

BJP delegation demands in memorandum submitted to CMC commissioner

**Chandrapur 24 June:** Under the AMRUT 2.0 scheme, roads have been dug on a large scale in various parts of the city in order to lay water supply and sewage pipelines. ## Army orders 450 Nagastra-1 suicide drones from Nagpur’s Solar Industries

**Nagpur 24 June:** The Indian Army has placed an order for 450 Nagastra 1R loitering munitions, commonly described as suicide drones with Nagpur-based Solar Industries, marking a notable step in India’s move towards indigenously-produced military technology, as reported by media. The order was secured under the Army’s emergency procurement powers, following a 2024 contract for 480 Nagastra units. An initial batch of 120 drones was delivered in June 2024 after pre-delivery inspections, according to defence officials. Equipped with GPS-guided targeting and capable of operating at altitudes over 4,500 m, the electrically powered Nagastra 1R can loiter for up to an hour and strike targets within a 15 km man-in-loop range, or up to 30 km in autonomous mode. Unique among such systems, this drone features a parachute recovery mechanism for aborted missions, allowing for reuse. Manufactured with over 75 per cent indigenous components, the Nagastra 1R has been deployed operationally against low-end threats like platoons of infiltrators, providing silent, cost-effective precision-strike capability. The procurement supports India’s broader Make in India defence initiative, reducing reliance on foreign suppliers, while enhancing tactical flexibility, especially along border areas with insurgent activity. Deliveries



of the new batch are expected in phases. The suicide drone joins other recent domestic orders and falls within India’s growing strategy of equipping infantry and artillery units with loitering munitions, as the defence ecosystem shifts toward drone-intensive warfare. The Nagastra-1R is a cost-effective system with full re-usability of launcher systems. The advanced loitering munition system comes with a 3600 gimbal camera with the option of putting thermal camera option for night operations. The systems have a proprietary encryption for both video and telemetry communication and come with a high precision targeting system with 2 metres CEP and over 75 per cent indigenous content. The systems have been tested at various locations, including Ladakh and Babina near Jhansi in Uttar Pradesh, said the sources.

the gold chain from his neck and the ring from his finger. At that moment, one of the impostors suddenly snatched the jewellery and fled the spot. Dashrath shouted for help and nearby citizens quickly gathered. One of them immediately informed the Ajni Police Station. A police team rushed to the spot and recorded Dashrath’s statement. Based on his complaint, police have registered a case under relevant sections of Bharatiya Nyay Sanhita related to cheating and impersonation. The area’s CCTV footage is being checked to identify the suspects. A search operation is underway to trace the accused, said a police officer.

## Nagpur sets example with rapid legal action in women’s safety case



**Nagpur 24 June:** In a rare show of speed and efficiency, the Sadar Police in Nagpur filed a chargesheet within just 15 hours of registering a molestation case. The accused, a 47-year-old man, allegedly molested a woman and threatened her with the release of a private video if she reported the incident. The case was registered under the new provisions of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS). Upon receiving the complaint, the police acted swiftly, arresting the accused and launching an immediate investigation. The team, led by Senior Inspector Manish Thakre, included PSI Sadiya Somankar, Nilesh Ghogare, and several other officers who worked through the night to gather statements, collect digital and medical evidence, and compile the chargesheet. According to officials, the swift action was taken to ensure justice and send a strong message against crimes targeting women. The chargesheet was filed with the magistrate’s court within 15 hours of the complaint, marking one of the fastest investigations in a molestation case in the city. This is not the first time Nagpur Police have acted promptly. Similar rapid chargesheet filings have been done recently by Belarodi and New Kamptee Police, who submitted chargesheets within 13 and 19 hours respectively in separate cases. Police officials stated that such prompt actions are helping reduce crime and build public trust. They also credited the quick filing of chargesheets with contributing to a noticeable decline in rape and molestation cases across Nagpur. The accused remains in custody as legal proceedings move forward.

## Nagpur Division resolves decade long water logging at LHS near LC gate No. 41 with permanent drainage solution

**Nagpur 24 June:** In a major relief to road users and nearby villagers, Central Railway’s Nagpur Division has resolved a long-standing water logging problem at the Limited Height Subway (LHS) near LC Gate No. 41 by executing a permanent drainage solution. The project was completed on 27th May 2025, just in time for the onset of monsoon, ensuring all-weather connectivity and safety. The LHS was commissioned in 2015 following the closure of LC Gate No. 41. However, in the absence of natural drainage, it remained prone to heavy water accumulation during rains—often disrupting traffic and requiring diesel-operated pumps every year to clear the sump. Despite repeated



temporary efforts, the issue

and coordination, a 600-mm

persisted for nearly a decade. In 2023, the engineering team of Nagpur Division identified a natural stream located on private agricultural land, with a lower bed level suitable for gravity-based drainage. After careful planning

RCC pipeline was laid using trenchless pipe-pushing technology to avoid damage to the agricultural land. The new pipeline system now permanently drains water from the LHS sump to the stream, with inspection chambers for easy maintenance. This smart and sustainable solution has eliminated the need for recurring pumping operations. It ensures uninterrupted road access throughout the year, particularly during monsoons, benefiting commuters, school buses, and emergency services. With this project, Nagpur Division has once again demonstrated its commitment to public welfare and sustainable engineering, and long-term infrastructure planning.

## Mahadeo Land Developers scam: Investors to receive refunds from June 30, HC informed

**Nagpur 24 June:** In a significant development in the long-pending Mahadeo Land Developers fraud case, the Nagpur Bench of the Bombay High Court has been informed that the process of refunding money to investors will commence from June 30, 2025. The official liquidator, appointed to oversee the recovery and disbursement of funds, provided this update during a recent hearing. The case pertains to Mahadeo Land Developers, which had promised attractive monthly incentives to investors in exchange for fixed deposits under its schemes. However, the company failed to honour

these promises, prompting Sanjay Nimbalkar and 47 other investors to approach the High Court seeking relief. During the hearing, the official liquidator informed the court that so far, 49 properties belonging to the company have been auctioned. Out of these, 31 properties remain unsold, while the auction process has generated Rs 2.59 crore. In addition, the company has received Rs 6.70 crore from other sales, of which Rs 5 crore has been deposited in the dividend account for distribution to creditors. The court has now directed the liquidator to submit a detailed report regarding the refund

process by July 4, 2025. The Income Tax Department had earlier staked a claim for preferential payment under Section 530 of the Companies Act, 1956. However, the liquidator’s legal counsel informed the court that there is no valid preferential claim made by the department as per the provisions of the Act. The High Court has ordered that this decision be formally communicated to the Income Tax Department through their representative. The liquidator’s counsel further informed the court that efforts are underway to sell the remaining 31 properties.

Advertisements will soon be published in newspapers to invite buyers, following due process under the Companies Act, 1956. The court has also directed that a complete list of properties already sold be placed on record. According to the liquidator, 2,931 claims from investors have been received to date. Of these, 2,021 claims have been verified and settled. The remaining claims are under scrutiny, as many are based on photocopied documents. Investors have been instructed to submit original documents for verification to ensure eligibility for refunds. It may be recalled

that in 2011, Mahadeo Land Developers director Pramod Agrawal masterminded a massive investment scam, duping over 3,000 to 4,000 people, including daily wage earners, to the tune of Rs 500 crore through fraudulent schemes under Mahadeo Land Developers and the Kalama Society. Agrawal lured innocent investors with promises of land and hefty returns, only to defraud them of their hard-earned savings. The recent court developments have rekindled hope among the victims, who have waited over a decade for justice and the recovery of their investments.

## Porwal win U-15 football title

**Nagpur 24 June:** In this thrilling match that went till the tie-breaker, both the teams could not score any goal till the stipulated time in the match.
