

First-ever stampede deaths at Gundicha Temple in the History of Puri Rath Yatra

Puri, June 29 (UNI) In a tragic incident during the Rath Yatra festivities, three devotees lost their lives and seven others were injured in a stampede-like situation in front of the chariots near the Gundicha temple at Saradhabali during the early hours of today. This marks the first such stampede-related deaths recorded at the Gundicha temple in the annals of Puri Rath Yatra history. In the past, devotees have died in stampede in the Puri Rath Yatra during 2008, 2012 and 2015 but not never such stampede had occurred near the Gundicha temple, the nine day sojourn



of the trinity of the Sri Jagannath temple. While the state and district administrations attributed the tragedy to an overwhelming crowd of devotees seeking darshan

Issue warning of initiating hunger strike in case of non-compliance with demands

ARNI / NAGPUR POST: Due to encroachment on the main road in Godve Layout, which falls under Arni Municipal Council, it has become difficult to drive. Due to this, the citizens of Sisodia, Mahure, Chintawar Layout, Samarth Nagar, Green Park have been troubled. Yavatmal Govt Tribal Boys and Girls Hostel students' agitation successful

Pandharkawada 29 June (NAGPUR POST/TC): The Maharashtra government has approved an increase in the DBT scheme implemented in the government tribal boys and girls hostels at the district level throughout Maharashtra. In 2017, the food provision system in tribal hostels was abolished and a scheme called DBT was implemented by the state government in 2017-2018. Due to this scheme, the amount of food and subsistence allowance was deposited directly in the students' accounts as a result of which the students had to make their ends meet through private mess. Over time, after crossing 8 years, this dearness allowance started decreasing and this started causing financial crisis on the students. There was no increase of a single rupee in this scheme for the last 8 years. As a result of this, there was a shortage of money as far as the students in the hostels were concerned. As a result of which the students had to eat outside by setting up private messes. In this, the DBT was also inadequate, due to which the financial expenses of the students had increased and they were on the verge of malnutrition due to not getting enough food. However, over this issue, the students of Tribal Boys and Girls Hostel, Yavatmal, staged a protest demonstration in 2023 at the Tribal Development Department Project Office, Pandharkawada, and then again on 16 December 2024 at PO Office, Pandharkawada, thereafter a 9-day sit-in agitation was carried out by the students, in the aftermath of which the Tribal Development Minister visited the protest site and assured that this demand would be fulfilled by 28 February 2025. However, since this demand was not fulfilled by 28 February 2025, the students were distressed due to repeated lip service and lack of concrete action. They therefore took the next drastic step. Two students from the



Tribal Boys Hostel, Yavatmal, first visited the tribal settlements in 10 districts of Maharashtra and organised a protest demonstration in each district and then a protest demonstration was held for the third time on 4 March 2025 in their own district, Yavatmal. The demand for DBT increase in the hostel was conveyed to the Minister for Tribal Development, Chief Minister, and 26 tribal legislators. The government had to take cognisance of this movement as it became a statewide agitation. The Maharashtra Cabinet has approved the demand for increase in the DBT scheme implemented in the hostel on 24 June 2025. In this way, the struggle of the students of the Government Tribal Boys and Girls Hostel, Yavatmal has borne fruit. Districts visited: Yavatmal, Amravati, Akola, Dhule, Jalgaon, Nashik, Pune, Sambhajinagar, and Chandrapur. Initially, under the leadership of two students, Deogadkar and Digambar Kodape, all the students in the hostel, prominently Kartik Gedam, Mahindra Atram, Nandkishor Gedam, Swapnil Neware, Ganesh Gaikwad, Kapil Meshram, Srushti Yedme, Raveena Tekam, Manasi Wathode, Ritika Urvate, Vitika Chandekar, Sakshi Gedam, Kishore Chichkar, Vitthal Thakre participated in the demonstration.

4 Tragic deaths reported across Amravati district

Amravati 29 June (NAGPUR POST/DC): Amravati district witnessed four unfortunate deaths on June 26 in separate incidents, including two drownings and two suicides. In Lohgaon (Mangrul Chavala), Pravin Bhaskar Kale (35) accidentally drowned in a well. In Pala (Morshi), Manjibai Dhurve (77) was found drowned in the Malu river. Two

suicides were reported in Warud taluka. Vijay Malode (49) of Hanumannagar hanged himself in his cattle shed. Ashok Dhole (56) of Wadegaon was found dead at his residence. Reasons for the suicides remain unknown. All incidents have been registered as accidental deaths. The community has expressed deep grief, and police are conducting further investigations.

Dhamangaon lacks HSRP centre, citizens facing inconvenience

Dhamangaon Railway 29 June (NAGPUR POST/TC): Despite the presence of over 10 thousand registered vehicles in Dhamangaon taluka—including two-wheelers, three-wheelers, four-wheelers, and heavy vehicles—there is still no local facility for installing High Security Registration Plates (HSRP). The absence of this essential service has become a growing concern for residents, who are compelled to travel nearly 70 kilometres to Amravati city to comply with the mandatory regulation.

What is HSRP and Why It Matters

The High Security Registration Plate is a tamper-proof aluminium plate with advanced features like laser-etched codes and retro-reflective film. Mandated by the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH), Government of India, HSRPs aim to boost road safety, deter vehicle-related crimes, and enhance traffic monitoring systems. These plates make it easier for law enforcement to track vehicles in cases of theft, accidents, or violations and are essential for integration with automated traffic systems.

A Daily Struggle for Dhamangaon Residents

In the absence of a local HSRP centre, vehicle owners from Dhamangaon must travel to Amravati, resulting in significant loss of time and money. For many—especially farmers, daily wage workers, and small business owners—this journey can disrupt their

entire day and pose a serious financial burden.

"A single trip to Amravati cost me nearly a full day's earnings," said Sachchidanand Kale, a local farmer. "We have thousands of vehicles here—why should we suffer because of administrative neglect?"

Leaders and Organisations Voice Discontent

Pradeep Mundhada, President of the City Congress Committee, strongly criticised the situation:

"It is unacceptable that a taluka with over 10,000 registered vehicles lacks a basic HSRP facility. People are forced to make long and costly trips to Amravati. It's unfair and inefficient." Several social organisations and public representatives have sent appeals to the district administration, demanding the immediate establishment of a permanent HSRP centre in Dhamangaon Railway.

A District-Wide Concern

This issue extends beyond Dhamangaon. Across Amravati district, taluka towns such as Achalpur, Morshi, Chandur Bazaar, Anjangaon Surji, Warud, Dharni, and Chikhaldara also lack HSRP centres. Residents in these areas face similar inconvenience and hardship due to the over-centralisation of transport services in the district headquarters. There is a widespread demand that each taluka headquarter be equipped with a local HSRP facility, ensuring equitable access for all

citizens—urban and rural alike.

Environmental and Economic Fallout

The policy's intent—to improve safety—is being undermined by its flawed implementation in rural regions. Repeated long-distance travel for vehicle-related services not only burdens the average citizen but also contributes to increased fuel usage and carbon emissions. "This policy, though well-intended, becomes a burden when basic infrastructure isn't decentralised," noted local advocate Chetan Pardakhe.

*A Clear and Urgent Demand

*Residents, activists, and local leaders are united in their call for action:

*Establish an authorised HSRP centre in Dhamangaon Railway without delay.

*Implement similar facilities in all talukas of Amravati district.

*Ensure fair and equal execution of central policies across both urban and rural populations.

Time for Decisive Action

The HSRP initiative represents a significant move towards safer roads and better governance. However, unless implemented equitably, especially in underserved rural areas, the intended benefits remain out of reach for thousands. The administration must act swiftly to bridge this gap and deliver much-needed relief to vehicle owners across Amravati district.

Heavy downpour disrupts life across Akola



Akola 29 June: Torrential rains disrupted life in several parts of Akola district leading to waterlogging and property damage. As per a press note issued by the district administration, the average rainfall across the district was 19.70mm, though several areas experienced significantly heavy rainfall. Patur tehsil recorded the highest rainfall, with Alegaon village in Mandal division receiving 145.30 mm. The tehsil's overall average stood at 68mm. Other affected regions include Channi and Sasti villages, both recording 66.50mm, and Nimba village in Murtijapur tehsil, which received 66.30mm. The downpour led to water accumulation in multiple villages. The District Disaster Management Team acted swiftly to rescue 12 people safely. According to preliminary reports, 12 permanent houses have been damaged due to the rain. Authorities have appealed to citizens to remain alert during the ongoing rainfall, especially in low-lying areas, and follow all official advisories. The administration continues to monitor the situation closely.

Man abducted in front of wife; one held, six at large

Umarkhed 29 June: In a shocking incident near Haddada Phata on Friday, a man was abducted in broad daylight in front of his wife. The couple, residents of Manekeshwar, were heading to a hospital on a motorcycle when they were attacked by seven men. The assailants assaulted the couple and forcibly took the husband away with the intent to kill. The abducted man has been identified as Vikas Patange (22) of Manekeshwar. A month ago, during the market committee elections, he had a dispute with one of the accused and lodged a police complaint. On Friday, citing that old issue, the group stopped the couple, beat them, and took Vikas away, threatening to kill him. Based on a complaint by his wife, Pallavi Patange, police have registered a case against Parmeshwar Mane, Sushil Mane, Akshay Mane, Ganjan Mane, Shivaji Mane, Sandeep Mane, and Swapnil Mane, all from Chatari, Umarkhed. One of the accused has been arrested, and three police teams are searching for the others.

Student injured as part of ceiling collapses in ZP school during class amid heavy rains



Washim 29 June: In yet another glaring example of the deteriorating condition of Zilla Parishad schools in Maharashtra, a Class 7 student sustained serious injuries after a portion of plaster from the classroom ceiling collapsed during a lecture in Washim district. The incident occurred on Friday at the government-run school in Bhatumra village, amid extreme weather conditions in Washim and other regions of Vidarbha. Disturbing visuals from the classroom have reportedly surfaced on the internet showing shattered plaster chunks scattered across the floor and school bags on the benches covered in debris. The images have sparked outrage among locals and on social media, calling attention to the poor maintenance of government school buildings. According to reports, the incident took place while a class was in session. Suddenly, a section of plaster from the slab in one corner of the classroom gave way and crashed onto a bench where a student named Shivaji

Umale was seated. The debris struck the student on the head, leaving him injured. He was immediately rushed to a nearby hospital for treatment, reported news agencies. While his condition is now stable, the event has triggered panic among other students and concern among parents regarding the safety of the school building. Shockingly, the building of the school was constructed only a decade ago. Despite its relatively recent construction, it is already showing signs of major wear and tear, raising questions about construction quality and maintenance oversight. Meanwhile, several parts of the Vidarbha region have been receiving heavy rains since past few days. Flood-like situation was experienced in Buldhana, Washim and Yavatmal districts, leaving many roads blocked. The torrential rain that started in Vidarbha continued till late on Thursday and till Friday, causing rivers and drains to flood in Buldhana, Washim and Yavatmal districts.

Fake cotton seeds worth lakhs seized

Amravati 29 June: As the Kharif season begins, the Agriculture Department has cracked down on the sale of fake cotton seeds across the district. In 10 separate raids conducted between May and June 20, seed packets worth several lakhs were seized. Complaints have been filed at local police stations, and links to a smuggling network based in Gujarat are suspected. The first raid on May 8 in Gadga Nagar led to the seizure of 100 HTBT cotton seed packets worth 1.25 lakh. Subsequent raids in Yevda and Anjangaon Surji resulted in more seizures, including 174 packets worth Rs 2.44 lakh. Additional actions were taken in areas under Pathrot, Daryapur, Paratwada, Benapur, and Dattapur police stations.

National Statistics Day: Statistics is the Grammar of Science

India observes National Statistics Day on June 29 each year to honor the significant achievements of Professor Prasanta Chandra Mahalanobis, who is regarded as the "Father of Indian Statistics." This day is significant for the country since it marks the anniversary of Prof. Mahalanobis' birth and emphasizes the role statistics play in socioeconomic planning and the advancement of the country. To commemorate the groundbreaking work of (late) Professor Prasanta Chandra Mahalanobis in the fields of economic planning and statistics, National Statistics Day 2025 will be celebrated for the 19th time on June 29. The day serves as a chance to emphasize how data and statistical analysis influence India's evidence-based governance and public policy.



In India, National Statistics Day was first observed in 2007 after a Gazette announcement on June 5, 2007, designated June 29, the anniversary of PC Mahalanobis' birth, as Statistics Day. To increase awareness of the value of statistics in nation-building, it was designated as a Special Day of National Importance. The importance of statistical research in developing successful government programs, tracking socioeconomic indicators, and assessing national progress led to the decision to designate a day to Statistics.

Honoring the statistical genius PC Mahalanobis, who not only established the Indian Statistical Institute (ISI) in 1931 but also transformed economic planning in India, is the main reason India celebrates National Statistics Day. He played a key role in developing statistical techniques for effective data gathering and analysis, particularly in population and agricultural research.

Conversely, it seeks to raise public awareness, particularly among young people, of the value of statistics in daily life and their contribution to the advancement of the country.

Statistics are important in daily life because they assist people comprehend the different aspects that can affect their lives. Statistics are more than just numbers; they also highlight significant global trends. Statistics are frequently utilized to ascertain the opinions and sentiments of the general public regarding particular subjects. Because they enable people to make well-informed decisions, statistics are significant. Statistics are gathered by governments, organizations, and corporations to monitor development, assess performance, analyze issues, and set priorities. Through statistical analysis, statistics help the country determine the budget, understand the larger picture, and choose the best course of action. Making judgments based on data, making predictions, and making scientific discoveries all depend heavily on statistical analysis. We can gain a deeper understanding of a subject by using statistics.

Born on June 29, 1893, Professor Prasanta Chandra Mahalanobis is a well-known Indian statistician who helped create India's industrialization plan for the Second Five-Year Plan and is credited with creating the ground-breaking idea of Mahalanobis distance. In addition to becoming a fellow of the Royal Society, he was awarded the Padma Vibhushan in 1968 and the Officer of the Order of the British Empire in 1942. His groundbreaking contributions to the use of statistical methods have had a long-lasting impact on national planning, economics, and statistics.

Every few kilometres reveal a new dialect, a fresh cuisine, or an unfamiliar tradition. With over 40 UNESCO World Heritage Sites and a civilisational legacy spanning millennia, India possesses a magnetic pull for global travellers. But this immense potential is undercut by a persistent and tragic truth: public spaces, especially those meant for leisure and tourism, remain fraught with danger. In a country that markets itself to the world as "Incredible India," violence, apathy, and moral policing corrode the

foundations of safety, freedom, and credibility. The recent horror at Pahalgaon underscores this crisis. The serene Kashmiri meadows, long a haven for families and couples, was transformed into a site of carnage on April 22, 2025, when armed terrorists opened fire on tourists. Such incidents don't just claim lives; they erode the fragile trust that underpins India's tourism economy. Domestic and international travellers alike are left to think: can India truly guarantee their safety? The question gained further urgency following the gang rape of a 20-year-old student at Odisha's Gopalpur beach last weekend. What should have been a day of leisure turned into a

harrowing ordeal when a group of men brutally assaulted the young woman and tied up her male companion. This was not an isolated act of violence; it was a damning indictment of structural failures in law enforcement, political accountability, and social consciousness, converting places of beauty into monuments of fear. Gopalpur is only the latest in a distressing pattern. From the 2013 gang rape of a Swiss tourist in Madhya Pradesh to the 2018 rape and murder of a Latvian woman in Kerala, from the molestation of a Lithuanian tourist in Agra to the gang rape of an Israeli traveller in Hampi this year — the list is long and growing.

Pancham's timeless symphony



Mumbai 29 June: Rahul Dev Burman, fondly known as Pancham, was a legendary composer whose 28-year career began with Teesri Manzil (1966) and ended with 1942: A Love Story (1994). Son of iconic composer S D Burman, he trained in classical music under maestros like Ustad Ali Akbar Khan and Samta Prasad. Though his early work, including Chhote Nawab and Bhoot Bungla, received modest attention, Teesri Manzil catapulted him to fame with hits like O haseena and Aaja aaja.

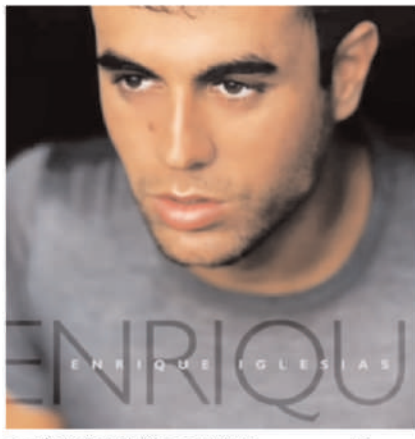
He delivered timeless music for films such as Padosan, Kati Patang, Sholay, Amar Prem and Hare Rama Hare Krishna, often collaborating with Kishore Kumar and Asha Bhosle — his

later wife. Bhosle credited him with transforming her vocal style through jazz, new rhythms and experimentation. His partnership with lyricist Gulzar produced lyrical gems in Ijaazat, Masoom and Aandhi. Known as a "music scientist," Burman drew inspiration from everyday sounds, blending Indian classical music with global influences.

Lyricist Javed Akhtar admired his instant compositions, such as Ek ladki kodekha and Chehra hai ya chand. Despite a dip in the 1980s, Burman's posthumous success with 1942: A Love Story reaffirmed his legacy. He died in 1994, aged 54, leaving behind music that only grew more revered over time.

'Bailamos' singer Enrique Iglesias adds second Mumbai concert due to high demand

Mumbai 29 June: Popular Spanish singer Enrique Iglesias, who is returning to perform in India after 13 years, has added second show in Mumbai following the high demand. Mumbai 29 June: Bollywood actor Varun Dhawan slammed the insensitive media coverage following the death of Shefali Jariwala. Dhawan penned a note on his Instagram handle on Sunday, questioning the need for covering "someone's grief". The 38-year-old actor didn't specify any name in the post.



"Again one more passing of a soul being insensitively covered by the media. I just don't understand why do you have to cover someone's grief everyone looks so uncomfortable with this how is this benefiting anyone... My request to my friends in the media this isn't the way someone would want their final journey covered," he wrote. His post comes a day

after Jariwala's death news. Jariwala was rushed to the hospital by her husband, Parag Tyagi, on Friday night, but was declared dead on arrival. She was 42. Following, many clips surfaced on social media, which resulted in paparazzi getting criticised for mobbing Jariwala's closed ones during the tragic time.

One clip included her mother, Sunita Jariwala, breaking down, as she arrived for her daughter's final rites.

Another video featured Tyagi holding his hands in front of the photographers as he walked towards Cooper Hospital, where Jariwala's body was taken for post-mortem.

'Sardaar Ji 3': Diljit Dosanjh banks on art, Punjabi cinema on jokes

Mumbai 29 June: Saturday evening, Cineworld Wandsworth, London. My daughter had flown in from Toronto, and the first thing she did was book us for "Sardaar Ji 3". Screen 12 wasn't filled with Sikh families, as you might expect. Instead, most seats were taken by Pakistani Punjabis. The controversy around Hania Aamir's casting had sparked a buzz across the diaspora, especially among those with roots in West Punjab.

Let's get the obvious out of the way: Diljit Dosanjh doesn't need an introduction. The man who made Coashella dance now stands at the peak of global Punjabi stardom — an artist whose every move feels instinctively fresh. In "Sardaar Ji 3", he does what he does best: making audiences watch him, his laugh, his effortless switch from comic timing to an action-hero's simmering glare. But while Diljit keeps evolving, the cinema around him remains trapped.

Punjabi films, unlike other Indian entertainment daring to experiment on OTT or the big screen, still see comedy as their last refuge. "Sardaar Ji 3" is no exception: a horror-comedy

that leans heavily on Diljit's charisma rather than cinematic craft. Flashback to 1981.

"Chann Pardesi" — Raj Babbar, Rama Vij, Om Puri, Amrith Puri, Kulbhushan Kharbanda — gave us layered storytelling, memorable performances, and a plot that could stand anywhere, in any language. Decades later, "Jodi" starring Diljit and Nimrat Khaira briefly reignited hope. It drew from Punjab's rich folk duet tradition, showing that our stories can move beyond jokes and slapstick, into love, music, and tragedy. Watching "Jodi" back then felt like Parag looking in the mirror — seeing its own complexities and contradictions. "Sardaar Ji 3", in contrast, feels like Punjab ducking that mirror altogether. Yes, the film has reportedly smashed box-office records in Pakistan. That's worth noting. But it also opened abroad only — not in India — because of the political backlash over Hania Aamir's casting. Diljit has addressed it candidly: the film was shot before tensions flared, and the producers chose an overseas-only release to avoid fanning flames.

Inside the hall in London, Hania's presence was met with cheers. Pakistani Punjabis saw a reflection of themselves on the big screen, a story that, at least superficially, crosses Radcliffe's line. But cinema isn't just measured by packed or half-packed halls. It's measured by how far it dares to go. And Punjabi cinema — even when led by an artist as adventurous as Diljit — still hesitates.



Two separate crackdowns in Akola district save 5 cattle from illegal slaughter

Police seize vehicles and meat worth over Rs 4.37 Lakh

Akola 29 June (NAGPUR POST/DC): In a major success under the "Operation Prahar" initiative launched to curb illegal activities in Akola district, police teams from Barshitakli and Murtizapur have rescued five bovines from illegal slaughter and arrested key accused in separate cases. These swift and effective actions were carried out under the guidance of Superintendent of Police Archit Chandak.

Case 1: Two Bulls Rescued in Barshitakli

On June 29, Barshitakli Police received a tip-off about two bulls tied in a brutal manner for illegal slaughter at a house in Qureshipura. Acting promptly, a police team, along with two independent witnesses, raided the location at around 5:45 am. They found two bulls tied with short ropes in a cruel condition and approximately 10 kg of beef. The animals, along with the seized meat—altogether valued at Rs 77,000—were taken into custody. The bulls were handed over to Adarsh Goseva Sansthan in Mhaipur for care and rehabilitation, while the meat was sent for forensic examination. Legal action has been initiated under Sections 5, 5A, 5B, and 9 of the Maharashtra Animal Preservation Act, 1976, along



with Section 11 of the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act and Section 325 of the BNS. This operation was conducted under the direction of Police Inspector Pravin Dhumal, with assistance from PSI Suhas Gosavi, and constables Amol Hake, Pravin Mahaske, and Vishakha Ghayal.

Case 2: One Cow and Two Oxen Rescued in Murtizapur

Later the same morning, at around 6:30 am, a separate police team from Murtizapur City Police Station intercepted a Tata Ace vehicle

Two accused—Javed Khan Ansar Khan (28) and Mohammad Nasir Mohammad Zakir (32), both residents of Pathanpura, Old Vasti, Murtizapur—have been booked under IPC Section 325 and relevant provisions of the Maharashtra Animal Preservation Act (amended 2015) and Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 1960. This action was executed under the leadership of Police Inspector Ajit Jadhav and supervision of SDPO Anmol Mittal, with active involvement from PSI Ganesh Suryawanshi, PSI Nitin Rathod, and other officers including constables Suresh Pande, Sachin Dandale, Prabhakar Nage, Sachin Dubey, Gajanan Khedkar, Dnyaneshwar Rane, Jeevan Ambhore, Pandharinath Pole, Haridas Solanke, and Satish Chate.

Firm warning issued to illegal cattle traffickers
Superintendent of Police Archit Chandak reiterated his commitment to eradicating such illegal practices, stating that strict action will continue against those involved in the trafficking and slaughter of bovines in violation of the law. Both cases highlight the growing vigilance of Akola Police and their unwavering stance against animal cruelty and unlawful slaughter, sending a strong message across the district.

The animals, estimated to be worth Rs 60 thousand, were rescued and immediately sent to Pundlik Maharaj Gaurakshan Sanstha for treatment and shelter. The vehicle, valued at Rs 3 lakh, was also seized, bringing the total confiscated property in this case to Rs 3.6 lakh.

Nagpur 29 June: Faced with years of neglect and bureaucratic buck-passing over the maintenance of waterlogged underbridges, Union minister for road transport and highways and Nagpur MP Nitin Gadkari directed the Nagpur Municipal Corporation (NMC) to immediately take over Manish Nagar and Somalwada RuBs from MahaMetro. Both structures have drawn criticism from motorists, particularly the Manish Nagar RuB, which gets flooded even with a brief drizzle. The

intervention comes as citizens grow increasingly frustrated over near-daily waterlogging across key RuBs in the city. The NMC, which long refused to assume responsibility for the MahaMetro-constructed RuBs, has now relented under Gadkari's orders. "On the lines of Narendera Nagar RuB constructed by state PWD, the NMC will now maintain both Manish Nagar and Somalwada RuBs," confirmed chief engineer Manoj Talewar, adding that the takeover process has begun.

Murder of ASI Abdul Kalam solved within 6 hours

LCB unit 1 nabs accused swiftly

Amravati 29 June (NAGPUR POST/DC): The Amravati City Crime Branch Unit 01 successfully solved the suspected accident case involving ASI Abdul Kalam, which later turned out to be a premeditated murder. Within six hours of the incident, the police arrested the key accused involved in the heinous crime. On the evening of June 28, a report was received about a road accident involving ASI Abdul Kalam near Navsari area on Walgaon Road under the jurisdiction of Gadge Nagar Police Station. Upon receiving this information, officers and personnel from Crime Branch Unit 01 immediately rushed to the spot and found both a two-wheeler and a four-wheeler in a severely damaged state. The injured officer had already been shifted to Best Hospital and was later transferred to Irwin Hospital due to the severity of his injuries. Preliminary investigation and interactions with people gathered at the scene and hospital led to suspicions that the incident was not an accident but a case of deliberate assault. Further probing revealed that the damaged vehicle belonged to Ahasanuddeen, a resident of Arafat Colony, and that his son, Jihanuddeen, had allegedly plotted to kill ASI Abdul Kalam. Acting on confidential information, it was uncovered that Jihan, along with his associates, had not only orchestrated a staged accident but had also stabbed the officer with a knife. Given the seriousness and sensitive nature of the case, Commissioner of Police Arvind Chawariya, along with other senior officers, visited the scene and directed immediate action. Following these directives, Crime Branch Unit 01 launched an intensive

investigation. Three separate teams were formed and tasked with gathering intelligence, analyzing technical data, and reviewing CCTV footage. Based on the gathered information, the team tracked and apprehended the main accused from Mardi Road. During interrogation, they identified themselves as:

1. Jihanuddeen Ahasanuddeen, 22, resident of Arafat Colony, behind Apna Bakery, Nagpur Gate Police Station limits
2. Awaiz Khan Ayub Khan, 23, resident of Mobeenpura, Daryapur, District Amravati
3. Fazil Khan Sabir Khan, 23, resident of Arafat Colony, who is currently undergoing treatment at a private hospital in the Walgaon Road area.

The two accused in custody were handed over to Gadge Nagar Police Station for further investigation. The Crime Branch's swift action in resolving this highly sensitive and serious case was executed under the guidance of Commissioner of Police Arvind Chawariya, Deputy Commissioner of Police (Headquarters) Kalpana Baravkar, DCP Zone 1 Sagar Patil, ACP (Crime) Shivaji Bachate, and ACP Arun Patil. The operation was spearheaded by Senior Police Inspector Gorakhnath Jadhav and his team comprising PSI Manish Wakode, API Prakash Zhopate, Feroz Khan, Satish Deshmukh, Sachin Bahale, Prashant Mohod, Alimuddin Khatib, and police personnel Nazimuddin Sayed, Vikas Guddu, Ranjit Gawande, Sachin Bhoyar, Suraj Chavan, Nikhil Gedam, drivers Ashok Khangar and Kishor Khengare. From the Cyber Police Station, API Aniket Kasar, and staff Nikhil Mahure and Aniket Wankhade also contributed to the investigation.

Directives regarding PMFBY 2025-26 issued

Pandharkawada 29 June (NAGPUR POST/TC):

Government directives have been issued concerning Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana for Kharif Season 2025. As per the government directive issued on June 24 the company Agriculture Insurance Company of India (Bharatiya Krishi Bima Company) has been approved from the point of view of implementing the improved PMFBY in the state for Yavatmal district as per the government decision dated June 24 2025. Under this scheme, the insurance premium to be paid by farmers is 2% for the Kharif season, 1.5% for the Rabi season, 5% for cash crops

- * Insurance amount covered for jowar crop 33000 farmer share (hectare): 82.50
- * Insurance amount covered for moong crop 28000 farmer share (hectare): 70.00
- * Insurance Covered Amount for Urid Crop 25000 Farmer Share (hectare) 62.50
- * Insurance Covered Amount for Tur Crop 47000-Farmer Share (hectare) 470
- * Insurance Covered

Amount for Soybean Crop 58000 Farmer Share (hectare) 1160 * Insurance Covered Amount for Cotton Crop 60000 Farmer Share (hectare) 750-

It will be implemented as per 80:110 cup and cap model. The government has decided to implement the concerned scheme in the state based on production based revised Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana for Kharif season 2025 and Rabi season 2025-26 for one year by including the insurance area component for notified crops in the notified area. As per this directive, the liability for compensation will be on the concerned insurance company. It is voluntary for borrower and non-borrower farmers and not mandatory. If there is a lease agreement, it must be registered. The risk levels are 70 percent for all crops. Farmer Identification No. (Farmer ID) is mandatory for availing benefit. E-crop



Inspection is mandatory for ensuring eligibility to avail benefit of compensation related schemes. As per this scheme, compensation will be paid only on the basis of crop harvesting experiment / technical production, assuming the reduction compared to the threshold production. Compensation will be determined on the basis of the average production in the insurance notified area at the end of the season. If bogus insurance or insurance is paid by altering the revenue documents, a case will be registered and the person concerned will be blacklisted for 5 years. Bharat Petroleum pump lease should not be extended: Bhutada

POST:A controversy has arisen regarding the lease period of the current Bharat Petroleum petrol pump at Gandhi Chowk in the city. 'Bharatiya Janata Party District Coordinator Nitin Bhutada has made a clear demand to the sub-divisional officer not to extend the lease period of this pump. The statement said that the petrol pump in question is a very crowded and important square for traffic in the city and heavy traffic there creates obstacles. This often creates traffic jams in the city. All two-wheelers, four-wheelers and goods vehicles coming from the east have to pass through Shivaji Maharaj Chowk. Since two major roads converge on that road, there is constant traffic jam. Therefore, the Bharat Petroleum pump located in the central part of the city is creating an obstacle. Therefore, it



would not be appropriate to extend the lease period of this pump, the statement also said. This pump is becoming a problem for the equestrian statue of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj which is currently being built and the beautification work being done around it. In this context, Nitin Bhutada has requested the administration to immediately cancel the lease of this petrol pump without extending it, in view of the city's transport system and for the safety of the citizens.

Rainwater accumulation and traffic chaos at School of Scholars, Warud

Warud 29 June (NAGPUR POST/TC): Following heavy rainfall on June 26 at around 3:30 PM, the playground of School of Scholars in Warud was waterlogged, causing severe inconvenience to students and parents. Children had to wade through water to return home, resulting in their shoes and socks being completely soaked. The situation worsened after school hours when a massive traffic jam developed in the area, delaying students' return home. Parents expressed strong dissatisfaction with the school administration, accusing the vice-principal of evading responsibility when approached for a solution. Parents alleged that the school fees have increased significantly each year, the quality of facilities has remained unchanged. Some also claimed the school charges interest on late fee payments. A formal complaint has been filed with the education officer. If no improvement is seen soon, parents, led by Narendra (Bablu) Pawde and Nilesh Thakre, have threatened a protest under the banner "Lock the School".

Generator boiler parts stolen from MIDC company, two arrested

Amravati 29 June (NAGPUR POST/DC): In a theft incident that has raised concerns among local industrialists, generator boiler parts, motors, iron stands, and other steel materials were stolen from VHM Company in the MIDC area of Nandgaon Peth, Amravati. The theft came to light on the morning of June 27. Acting on a complaint from security officer Sureshanand Sharma, police arrested two suspects: Mohammad Ashiq Sheikh and Mohammad Azhar Mohammad, both residents of Mahuli Jahagir. Stolen material worth Rs 2.45 lakh and a tempo were recovered from their possession. Despite security personnel being present, the theft occurred during the night, exposing lapses in security arrangements. Investigation is underway under senior police guidance.

Illegal wine bar busted at 'Chulha Hotel', 24 detained

Amravati 29 June (NAGPUR POST/DC): Acting on a tip-off, Crime Branch Unit 2 raided 'Chulha Hotel and Restaurant' on Badnera Old Bypass Road for operating a wine bar without a permit. The raid, led by PI Sandeep Chavan on orders from Police Commissioner Arvind Chawaria, resulted in the detention of 24 drinkers and the arrest of the hotel manager. The hotel owner remains absconding. During the raid, the police found liquor bottles placed openly on tables. The establishment lacked any permit for alcohol service. Items worth Rs 4,055, including bottles and glassware, were seized. Manager Shrikrishna Sambhare was arrested. Owner Rameshwar Adhau and premises owner Jangid are currently absconding. A case under the Maharashtra Prohibition Act has been registered. Police have warned that strict action, including license cancellation, will be taken against establishments serving alcohol without proper permissions.

Farmers stage hunger strike agitation in Wani-Belkheda over police inaction on cattle theft incidents



Chandur Bazar 29 June (NAGPUR

POST/TC): Farmers from Wani-Belkheda village in Chandur Bazar taluka have launched an indefinite hunger strike to protest against the alleged inaction of Brahmanwada Thadi Police Station in addressing a series of livestock thefts. The protest began on June 27 in front of the Gram Panchayat office, with aggrieved farmers demanding immediate police action and justice. Over the past several months, the village has witnessed an alarming rise in livestock thefts, affecting 21 economically weak farming families. A total of 85 animals, including bullocks, cows, goats, and buffaloes, along with various agricultural tools and equipment, have been reported stolen. Despite repeated complaints, villagers allege that the police have neither investigated the cases seriously nor taken any action. One such incident occurred on May 1, 2025, when eight goats worth Rs 1.5 lakh were stolen from the goat farm of farmer Mukesh Alone. No progress has been made in this or earlier cases, villagers claim. Frustrated by the police's indifference, villagers approached Member of Parliament Anil Bonde, who in turn instructed the Amravati

Rural Superintendent of Police to take swift action. However, no investigation or results have followed, and even the MP's intervention appears to have been disregarded. "The police assured us they would act within 10 days, but it has now been over a month with no investigation or arrests. Meanwhile, our losses continue to mount and the thieves roam free," said Mukesh Alone, who is leading the protest alongside fellow villagers Ashish Patil, Mukesh Patil, and Gunvant Alone. Villagers fear that continued thefts and police negligence will lead to an escalation in crimes and further demoralization of already distressed farmers. They warned that farmers, pushed to the brink, might be driven to extreme measures. Even after three days of continuous hunger strike, the protestors have refused to end their demonstration. "We will not back down until our demands are fulfilled. Even if we lose our lives here, we will not end the strike without justice," declared the protesting farmers. The villagers have called for urgent and effective action by the authorities, demanding that those responsible be held accountable and that stolen livestock be recovered.

No opposition to Shiv Smarak: Sardar

NAGPUR POST:Dilip Sardar, director of Bharat Petroleum dealer Purushottam & Company, gave detailed information about the petrol pump in a press conference held at the government rest house. The first petrol pump in Umarkhed was started by the 'Burma Cell' company in 1952, later in 1976 Indian Oil and in 2005 Hindustan Petroleum pumps started. ASI Abdul Kalam murdered, incident staged as road mishap

(NAGPUR POST/DC): Assistant Police Sub-Inspector Abdul Kalam Abdul Kadir (56), posted at Walgaon Police Station, was brutally murdered on the evening of June 28. The attackers attempted to pass the murder off as a road accident. While commuting on his moped to the police

station, Kalam was struck by a black car near Navsari Crossing. He was dragged for a distance, and his right leg was severed. The attackers then stabbed him over a dozen times before fleeing the scene. Initial investigation indicates a family dispute may have led to the murder. The same vehicle involved in the attack

was found with a printed FIR from a previous family altercation dated June 21. Two individuals have been arrested in the case. ASI Kalam had previously served at City Kotwali and Rajapeth police stations and was respected for his cooperative and balanced nature. Just hours earlier, Kalam had distributed

sweets at home after learning that his younger daughter passed her medical entrance. The family's joy quickly turned into sorrow. **Wounds on the body confirm it was a deliberate, planned murder. Investigation is proceeding accordingly, said Arvind Chawaria, Commissioner of Police.**

Nagpur 29 June: In a bold and visionary step against drug abuse, the Nagpur City Police launched Operation Thunder 2025 — a city-wide anti-narcotics campaign that united citizens, law enforcement, civil society, and national-level stakeholders in a week-long mission from June 20 to 26. Spearheaded by Commissioner of Police Ravinder Singal the campaign coincided with the International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking. With the theme "Evidence is Clear: Invest in Prevention", the initiative marked a transformative moment in Nagpur's public safety narrative. Meticulous Planning and Multi-Stakeholder Engagement The scale and impact of Operation Thunder 2025 were unprecedented. Planning began weeks in advance, involving coordination between police departments, NGOs, educational institutions, civic bodies, religious leaders, and elected representatives. Dedicated teams were formed under the leadership of senior officers to manage logistics, event execution, volunteer mobilization, and digital outreach. Over 50 major events were meticulously organized across the city. Strategic planning ensured seamless integration of awareness, enforcement, education, and rehabilitation under a single coordinated platform.

Key Highlights of Operation Thunder 2025

■ Mass Participation: More than 50,000 citizens participated in

physical events, including Union Minister Nitin Gadkari, Guardian Minister Chandrashekhar Bawankule, and Minister of State Ashish Jaiswal.

■ Offender Counseling: 123 repeat offenders underwent structured counseling; their data is now integrated with the SIMBA app for continued monitoring and rehabilitation.

Nagpur RPF rescues 61 children, contributes to Central Railway's total of 235 under Operation Nanhe Farishte

Nagpur 29 June: The Railway Protection Force (RPF) of Central Railway has once again proven its commitment to public service, emerging as a true guardian for vulnerable passengers and lost children across its divisions. Through dedicated efforts under Operation Nanhe Farishte and Operation Jeevan Raksha, the RPF has not only saved lives but also helped reunite hundreds of children with their families. Between April and May 2025, RPF personnel from the Nagpur division rescued 61 lost or runaway children, contributing significantly to the total of 235 children rescued across Central Railway during this two-month period. This marks a substantial rise from the 36 children rescued by Nagpur RPF in the same period last year. The initiative, Operation Nanhe Farishte, aims at identifying and assisting children who arrive at railway stations due to family conflicts, aspirations for a better life, or the allure of urban environments.

These children are approached with sensitivity by trained RPF personnel, counseled, and reunited with their families — often resulting in emotional reunions and heartfelt gratitude from parents. Overall, the comparative division-wise figures show the impact: Mumbai (53), Bhusaval (62), Nagpur (61), Pune (51), and Solapur (8) — totaling 235 children in April-May 2025, as opposed to 149 during the same period in 2024. In addition to



child rescue operations, Central Railway's RPF has played a critical role in saving lives through Operation Jeevan Raksha. Between April and May 2025, alert RPF teams saved 12 passengers (9 men and 3 women) who were at risk while boarding or deboarding moving trains. This is a notable increase from the 7 lives saved in the corresponding period last year.

These acts of bravery and empathy exemplify the RPF's core values — Suraksha (Security), Satarkta (Alertness), and Seva (Service). Whether protecting railway property or preventing tragedies, RPF personnel continue to demonstrate heroism, compassion, and unwavering dedication across every division of Central Railway.

Man in Khaki uniform caught performing stunts on e-bike, video goes viral

Nagpur 29 June: A video of a man wearing a khaki uniform performing risky stunts on an e-bike in Nagpur has gone viral on social media, sparking outrage and speculation among netizens.

The video shows the man sitting cross-legged on the seat of the moving e-bike and riding completely hands-free. The incident reportedly took place on the Wardhaman Nagar flyover. The individual, dressed in a khaki uniform and wearing a helmet, is seen violating multiple traffic rules in broad daylight. Following the video's circulation, social media users were quick to react. Many questioned whether the man was a police officer, home guard, or a municipal employee. There is still no official confirmation about the man's identity or whether any disciplinary action has been initiated. However, the incident has raised concerns about road safety and



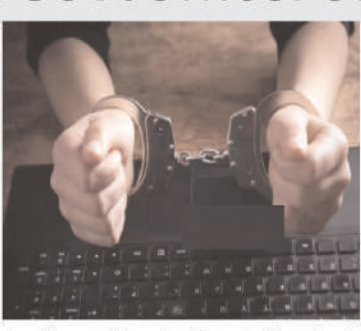
accountability of those seen as public role models.

The stunt, which could have endangered lives, has led to widespread calls for action and stricter enforcement of traffic regulations especially when it involves individuals in positions of public responsibility.

Digital arrest threat: Cyber thugs rob retired Govt officer of Rs 26 lakh

Nagpur 29 June: In yet another alarming case of cyber fraud, an 82-year-old retired government officer from Nagpur was conned out of Rs 26 lakh by fraudsters who threatened him with a fabricated 'digital arrest'. Cyber Police have registered an offence and launched a probe. According to police, the victim had retired from a government department 24 years ago. On April 30, he received a call from an unknown number.

The caller, posing as an official from the Cyber Crime Department, falsely claimed that the victim's ATM card had been found linked to the money laundering case involving Jet



trouble, the elderly victim believed the claims. Taking advantage of his panic, the cybercriminals tricked him into sharing details of his investments and bank accounts. Following their instructions, the victim prematurely broke his fixed deposits and transferred Rs 26 lakh to various bank accounts provided by the fraudsters. Realising he had been duped, the victim approached the Cyber Police Station and lodged a complaint against unidentified persons. Police have launched an investigation and appealed to citizens, especially senior citizens, to remain vigilant and not fall prey to such tactics.

Accident at NMC's 'B Park' project, safety norms violated, 3 injured



Nagpur 29 June: A major accident was narrowly averted on Saturday at the under-construction 'B Park' project of the Nagpur Municipal Corporation, located at Budhwar Bazaar on Kelibagh Road. A portion of the boundary wall, along with the beams and support columns, collapsed during ongoing excavation work, injuring three workers on site. Preliminary information suggests that the mishap occurred due to non-compliance with standard construction safety protocols. The incident took place while soil was being excavated using a poclain machine. During the process, a section of the external wall gave way, causing the soil to collapse onto the machinery. The injured have been identified as Ajit Parmanik, Chintu Kumar (poclain operator), and Manish Nageshwar (helper). All three were immediately rushed to Mayo Hospital for medical attention. Senior Engineer Sunil Kathe confirmed the incident and stated that, fortunately, there was no loss of life. Upon receiving the alert, the Fire Department promptly dispatched two fire tenders from Ganjipeeth and Cotton Market fire stations to the scene. The incident has raised serious concerns regarding the implementation of safety standards at municipal construction sites. An investigation into the matter is expected.

CM Fadnavis launches 'MahaStride' with World Bank officials

Sets 35 trillion target for Maharashtra in 5 years

Nagpur 29 June: The launch was held at the Indian Institute of Management (IIM) in Mihan in Nagpur district of Maharashtra, in the presence of top officials and representatives from the World Bank, an official statement said on Saturday. Maharashtra CM Devendra Fadnavis (above) said that Maharashtra's Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) has grown significantly. Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis on Friday launched 'MahaStride', a new initiative aimed at making Maharashtra a Rs 35 trillion economy in the next five years. The launch was held at the Indian Institute of

Management (IIM) in Mihan in Nagpur district of Maharashtra, in the presence of top officials and representatives from the World Bank, an official statement said on Saturday. Speaking at the event, CM Fadnavis said that the state's newly-formed MITRA (Maharashtra Institution for Transformation) will play a key role in guiding this transformation. CM Fadnavis called MahaStride a landmark initiative that will ensure data-driven and outcome-oriented planning across all districts. "Maharashtra Government is an institution; when its capacity and structure are



built correctly, transformational change is inevitable. With this thought, we first rolled out a 100-day administrative-reform drive, followed by a 150-day programme. Today, we have symbolically launched MahaStride—an initiative that will become a landmark effort

directing Maharashtra's development," Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis said. "We don't lack funds. What we need is well-planned, data-led execution," he said. CM Fadnavis said that Maharashtra's Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) has grown significantly—from Rs 15 trillion in 2013-14 to Rs 45 trillion in 2024. He said that he aims that the state reaches Rs 35 trillion more in the next five years, with equal contribution from every

district, not just the top seven. CM Fadnavis urged the District Collectors in the state to assess their economic output and actively plan for growth in their areas. Fadnavis said that MITRA would act as a think-tank and provide strategic guidance for development. "It will become a key institution in shaping Maharashtra's future," he said. Deputy Minister Eknath Shinde echoed this view, calling MITRA "the chariot that will take Maharashtra forward" and emphasised the importance of inclusive growth—ensuring development in backward districts and talukas as well, the official statement said.

CJI inaugurates new bar room at High Court

Nagpur 29 June: Chief Justice of India Bhushan Gavai inaugurated the newly constructed bar room and the office of the deputy solicitor general at the High Court Bar Association (HCBA) premises on Saturday. The event, held at bar room No. 6 on the second floor of the high court building, marked a significant step in enhancing working facilities for legal professionals. Justice Gavai interacted with members of the HCBA and appreciated the legal fraternity's contribution to the justice system. Several senior judges were present at the function, including Supreme Court Justices Dipankar Datta, Prasanna Varale, and Atul Chandurkar. Artist who made live portrait of President, conceptualised Preamble Park design



Nagpur 29 June: At 82, his hands and head tremble involuntarily, but renowned oil painter Pramodbabu Ramteke's spirit remains steady, much like his vision of art that now defines the iconic entrance gate of the country's first Constitution Preamble Park at Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar School of Law off Amravati Road in Nagpur. The park and a full-length statue of Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar were inaugurated by CJI Bhushan Gavai on Saturday. "The finely sculpted piece has profuse iconography of the Constitution which one must attempt to absorb while looking at it," said Ramteke. A seasoned sculptor and former faculty member at JJ School of Art in Mumbai, Ramteke led the team of artists who brought the deeply symbolic and intricately designed Preamble Park—a tribute to the philosophy enshrined in India's Constitution—to life. The beautiful golden gate is inspired by India's oldest stone sculpture, Sanchi Stupa, said Gondwana University registrar Anil Hirekar, who first proposed the Park as Nagpur University (NU) deputy registrar in 2015. Ramteke and other key contributors were felicitated during the inauguration of the park on Saturday. Among them were mural experts Prajna Murti, artists Sanjay More and Ashok Sonkusare, park collaborator Sandeep Kamble, and entrance gate designer Mahesh Gadewar. NU management council member, Ajay Chavan, too gave valuable support for the project. The idea was conceived on Nov 23, 2015,

during the tenure of NU vice-chancellor SP Kane and registrar Puran Meshram. Hirekar prepared a detailed proposal and ensured its execution. Meshram said Ramteke was entrusted with supervision and finalising the aesthetics of the park. "Kamble prepared the master plan of the entire park. More designed the murals and sculpture on them, Sonkusare crafted them in Wani town. State PWD appointed Gadewar for designing the gate," he said. Ramteke initially rejected the initial designs and recommended a new team, including More and Sonkusare, to develop the park. Meshram said the design finalised by Ramteke was then approved by the park committee after a few suggestions. "This was not just about making a gate," Ramteke said, "it was about translating the values of the Constitution into form and feeling." Ramteke's dedication to art goes back to his childhood, a passion that only grew stronger with age. In 1999, Ramteke was selected to make a portrait of then President KR Narayanan. For four hours, Narayanan sat for the portrait, which still holds a place of honour at the London School of Arts. Ramteke also created a portrait of Ramkrishna Gavai, father of CJI Bhushan Gavai. The CJI himself visited an art exhibition to view the painting and appreciated it personally in 2015. "I will continue working till my last breath," Ramteke said. The Constitution Preamble Park gate stands as one of Ramteke's most profound contributions to public art.

Embrace ideas, values of Constitution from Preamble Park: Fadnavis, Gadkari

Nagpur 29 June: Bharat Ratna Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar crafted the Indian Constitution by blending global and timeless Indian values, with the Preamble being its core. If citizens embrace the values enshrined in the Preamble, 90% of the country's issues could be resolved permanently, said chief minister Devendra Fadnavis on Saturday. Fadnavis was speaking during the inauguration of the Constitution Preamble Park and a full-length statue of Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar by CJI Bhushan Gavai on the premises of Dr Babasaheb

Ambedkar School of Law. Union minister for road transport and highways, Nitin Gadkari, said the park will spread the Constitution's fundamental ideas among students and the public. Fadnavis stated that it is a matter of great pride and satisfaction for him that the Constitution Preamble Park and Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar's statue are being unveiled at the same law college where he studied constitutional principles and put them into practice. The CM stressed that completion and public opening of this park during the Amrit Mahotsav year of the Constitution is particularly significant. "The



Indian Constitution has established a robust democracy, ensuring freedom of expression, fundamental rights, equal opportunities, and a system for delivering justice. This has

enabled India to become the world's fourth-largest economy. The Preamble is the essence of the Constitution, and its values need to be embraced by all citizens," he said. Fadnavis

expressed confidence that the park will inspire everyone who visits it. He also announced that a new building for the School of Law would be constructed, and all necessary facilities would be provided for the park. Gadkari said Nagpur University took the initiative to establish the Constitution Preamble Park, which was realised with financial support from the state govt and public participation. He highlighted that the university has produced eminent personalities like a Prime Minister, while Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar Law College has given the country two CJIs. "The establishment of the park adds to this legacy," he said. Social justice minister Sanjay Shiras discussed the financial and other support provided by the social justice ministry for the park's establishment. Senior social activist and chairman of the Constitution Preamble Park Committee, Girish Gandhi, provided details of the park's development stages. Nagpur University acting VCM Madhavi Khode-Chaware, School of Law director Ravishankar Mor, Constitution Preamble Park Committee members and others were present on the occasion. Committee member Puran Meshram read out the Constitution's Preamble.

Guardian Minister Sanjay Rathod directs action against banks

YAVATMAL / NAGPUR POST: "There are clear instructions to the banks that the subsidy deposited in the accounts of beneficiaries of various schemes, including the farmers, should not be deducted under any circumstances. Despite this, there are complaints that banks are deducting amount and are reluctant to return it," pointed out Guardian Minister Sanjay Rathod and he directed that cases should be registered against banks in the district if found overruling the instructions. Rathod was addressing a meeting in the Nijojan Bhavan where he reviewed the expenditure incurred under the General District Annual Plan, Scheduled Caste Sub-Plan and Tribal Sub-Plan of the previous year as well as the expenditure incurred under these three schemes till the end of May in this financial year. The meeting was attended by Tribal Development Minister Dr Ashok Uike, Minister of State Indranil Naik, MP Sanjay Deshmukh, MP Pratibha Dhanolkar, MLA Dhiraj Lingade, MLA Raju Todsam, MLA Balasaheb Mangulkar, MLA Kisan Wankhede, MLA Sanjay Derkar, District Collector Vikas Meena, Chief Executive Officer of Zilla Parishad Mandar Patki, Assistant Collector Amit Ranjan, Additional SP Piyush Jagtap, District Planning Officer Sudhakar Ade and department heads. Initially, Vikas Meena presented information about expenditure of the previous year and expenditure incurred so far this year. Last year, a fund of Rs 680.81 crore was approved from all the three schemes. Out of which, Rs 678.96 crore was spent. The percentage of expenditure is 99.76. This year, Rs 528 crore has been approved in the general district annual plan, Rs 84 crore in the SC sub-plan



and Rs 142.38 crore in the tribal sub-plan, totaling Rs 754.38 crore. Compared to last year, this year's plan has increased by Rs 73.57 crore. Under the Jaljevan Mission scheme, 1,539 works have been approved in the district. Rathod said that works for which ten per cent process is completed but work has not been started by the contractor, the earlier contract should be scrapped and new tendered should be floated. "Instructions should be given to the contractors to complete works which are in progress as soon as possible. If the contractors are delaying work, take action against them," he said. "Rs 3.5 crore have been allocated from the planning for the road mapping project."

All the roads should be included in this project and it should be presented," said the Guardian Minister. Expressing dissatisfaction over the CT scan machine in medical college, Rathod said the Collector should hold a separate meeting and inquire into the issue. The meeting discussed the distribution of assistance to affected farmers, frequent power outages, works under the PM Gram Sadak Yojana, illegal brick kilns, crematorium, new power stations.

Western Coalfield Patsansta scam, pre-arrest bail application rejected

WANI / NAGPUR POST: The pre-arrest bail application filed by the accused credit society president Dilip Tembhurde and secretary Ramesh Kanojia in the Additional District Sessions Court in Pandharkawada in the case of embezzlement of Rs 1 crore 25 lakh 9 thousand 801 in the Western Coalfield Employees' Cooperative Credit Society in Rajur Colliery has been rejected. Therefore, will the police now arrest the accused? The question is being raised. A case of fraud was registered at the Wani police station against four people, including the president of the credit society, Dilip



Tembhurde, two secretaries and a manager, in the case of embezzlement of Rs 1 crore 27 lakh 9 thousand 801 in the Western Coalfield Employees' Cooperative Credit Society in Rajur Colliery in March. The accused had filed an application in the Additional District Sessions Court in Pandharkawada to get pre-arrest bail. However, the court rejected the anticipatory bail application of the accused. Due to this, the accused are now in trouble. The deposits of many employees are stuck in this credit institution. Retired employees have deposited deposits in this credit institution as a last resort. But the employees are desperate as they are not getting them. The depositors of the credit institution are looking forward to when the police will take action to arrest the accused in this case.

UPSC, and carries out social activities such as tree conservation, help for chronic diseases, etc. In the financial year, a relief fund of Rs. 3 lakh 10 thousand has been given to members. Under the Sahasrad Kutumb Adhar Yojana, in the last financial year, Rs 90 lakh was distributed to the heirs of 15 deceased members, i.e. Rs 6 lakh each, and Rs 12 lakh to the heirs of DCPM holders, i.e. Rs 96 lakh to the heirs of 8 members, a total of Rs 1 crore 86 lakh. Similarly, the organization has taken out an accident insurance of Rs 30 lakh for members, and under this, a claim of Rs 50 lakh was given to the heirs of 2 members who died in accidents. In the current financial year, the organization has reduced the member accident insurance premium from Rs 980 to Rs 900, saving the members by Rs 80/-.



The organization has opened savings accounts for all members and from this year onwards, the amount of beneficiaries will be deposited in their savings accounts. The organization has also started RTGS, NEFT, net banking facilities to speed up the work of the members and members will get information

about their loan accounts and other deposits through their mobile phones at home. Also, members will be able to do financial transactions through mobile phones. Although locker facilities are available in the organization at a low cost, all citizens as well as members should benefit from them, and the board of directors are trying to come up with some innovative schemes in the future for the benefit of the members, informed Mahesh Sonekar, president of the organization.
