

## PM calls for global efforts for strong, disaster-resilient future for world

**New Delhi, June 7 (UNI)** Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday called for global efforts to build a strong and disaster-resilient future for the world, stressing the need for construction of infrastructure that remains steadfast against time and tide.

Addressing the International Conference on Disaster Resilient Infrastructure 2025 via video conferencing, the Prime Minister outlined five key global priorities to strengthen disaster resilience.

These are: The importance of integrating disaster resilience courses, modules and skill development programmes in higher education; a global digital repository to document best practices and learnings from



countries that have faced disasters and rebuilt with resilience; innovative financing for creation of actionable programmes; necessity of strengthening early warning systems and

coordination and special attention to vulnerabilities of small island developing states.

Pointing out that India had established a tsunami warning system benefiting

29 countries, the Prime Minister said India recognizes the small island developing states as large ocean countries and the need for special attention to their vulnerabilities.

'Strengthening Early warning systems and coordination is crucial,' he said, adding that a global digital repository of learnings and best practices of building back from disasters would be beneficial for the entire world. Highlighting the theme of the conference, 'Shaping a Resilient Future for Coastal Regions,' Modi underscored the vulnerability of coastal regions and islands to natural disasters and climate change.

He cited recent disasters including Cyclone Remal in India and Bangladesh, Hurricane

Beryl in the Caribbean, Typhoon Yagi in South-east Asia, Hurricane Helene in the United States, Typhoon Usagi in the Philippines, and Cyclone Chido in parts of Africa and emphasized that these disasters had caused significant damage to lives and property, reinforcing the need for resilient infrastructure and proactive disaster management.

Recalling India's past experiences with devastating disasters, including the super-cyclone of 1999 and the tsunami of 2004, the Prime Minister emphasized how India adapted and rebuilt with resilience, constructing cyclone shelters across vulnerable areas and contributing to the establishment of a tsunami warning system benefiting 29 countries.

## Govt issues advisory for curbing unfair trade practices on e-commerce, online platforms

**New Delhi, June 7 (UNI)**

As part of the government's broader strategy to strengthen consumer protection in digital era and curb unfair practices in e-commerce and online services, the Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA) has asked all e-commerce platforms to take necessary steps to ensure that their platforms do not engage in deceptive and unfair trade practice which are in the nature of dark patterns. The CCPA issued an advisory to bolster ongoing efforts to 'strengthen consumer protection in the digital era and curb unfair practices in e-commerce and online services,' an official statement said on Saturday.

All e-commerce platforms have been advised to conduct self-audits to identify dark patterns, within three months of the issue of the advisory and take necessary steps to ensure that their platforms are free from such dark patterns. The e-commerce

platforms, based on self-audit reports, have also encouraged to give self-declarations that their platform is not indulging in any dark patterns.

The self-declarations by the platforms will enable fair digital ecosystem along with building trust between consumers and e-commerce platforms. The CCPA also issued notices to e-commerce platforms in some cases that have been found violating the Guidelines for Prevention and Regulation of Dark Patterns. 'All e-commerce platforms are, therefore, advised to refrain from deploying deceptive design interfaces that mislead consumers or manipulate their decision-making,' the statement said. The CCPA has been keeping a close watch on the violation of the Guidelines issued for Prevention and Regulation of Dark Patterns. Instances of dark patterns have been noticed on e-commerce platforms. The Department of Consumers

Affairs also constituted a Joint Working Group (JWG) comprising representatives from Ministries, regulators, voluntary consumer organizations and NLUs. The mandate of this JWG is to examine and undertake measures to identify violations of dark patterns on e-commerce platforms and share the information with the Department of Consumer Affairs on regular intervals. The JWG shall also suggest appropriate awareness programmes for creating awareness amongst the consumers.

The Department of Consumer Affairs had notified Guidelines for Prevention and Regulation of Dark Patterns in 2023 and specified 13 dark patterns including False urgency, Basket Sneaking, Confirm shaming, forced action, Subscription trap, Interface Interference, Bait and switch, Drip Pricing, Disguised Advertisements and Nagging, Trick Wording and Rogue Malwares.

## IMD issues yellow alert as rain and thunderstorms loom over Mumbai

**Mumbai, June 7 (UNI)** A yellow alert has been issued for Mumbai due to expected rain and thunderstorms, the Meteorological Department said on Saturday. The Regional Meteorological Department attributed the weather to oligocyclonic conditions affecting the region, along with weak southwest monsoon winds. Mumbai witnessed significant rainfall at several locations on Friday, while other parts of Maharashtra remained under cloudy skies. Temperatures held steady without much increase, but the combination of humidity and intermittent rain created a muggy and uncomfortable atmosphere for residents. Meteorologists



predict that this pattern will continue through the weekend, with light to moderate rainfall and the possibility of thunderstorms.

Since the onset of the monsoon, rainfall has been moderate, with Colaba recording 30 mm and Santa Cruz 47.1 mm over the past six days. Despite temperatures being slightly below average—32.2°C in Colaba and 31.7°C in Santa Cruz—the high humidity contributed to a warm sensation. Notably, Santa Cruz received 14 mm of rain on Friday, while Colaba

remained dry. Similar weather is forecast for districts including Jalgaon, Nashik, Pune, and Nagpur, where isolated thunderstorms are also anticipated. This weather pattern extends from Madhya Maharashtra to Coastal Andhra Pradesh, as well as parts of Karnataka and Telangana, where cloudy conditions prevail. Despite the challenges posed by the monsoon, farmers are reporting success, exemplified by a local grower cultivating Iranian dates organically and earning notable profits. Rain is expected to continue over the weekend, although thunderstorm activity may decrease if conditions change.

## Three arrested for demanding Rs 1L extortion from meat seller

**New Delhi, June 7 :** The Faridabad police have arrested three men for allegedly demanding Rs 1 lakh in extortion from a local meat seller. An FIR in the matter was registered at the Mujesar police station. According to police, the complainant, Anil, a resident of Rajiv Colony in Faridabad and owner of a meat shop at Hardware Chowk reported that he received a WhatsApp call from an unknown number on May 30. During the call, the caller threatened him and demanded Rs 1 lakh as extortion. On the night of June 4, three men identified as Akshay, Salman and Sumit arrived at Anil's shop in a black Scorpio.

They allegedly took Rs 10,000 from him by force, claiming it was on behalf of two individuals named Rohit and Vicky. They further threatened to kill him if the full extortion amount was not paid. Following the incident, Anil approached the police, and an FIR was filed. During the investigation, a team from the Border Crime Branch arrested the three



accused on Friday.

They have been identified as Sumit (30), a resident of Fatehpur Chandila village and Mohammad Akshay (28) and Mohammad

Salman (28), both residents of Dabua Colony, Faridabad. "During interrogation, the accused confessed that they are close friends and had demanded the extortion on the instructions of a man named Vicky to establish their dominance in the area," said a Faridabad police spokesperson. "The accused have been taken into police remand for further questioning."

## Day after giving death threats to Delhi CM Rekha Gupta, 25-year-old man held

**New Delhi, June 7 :** A 25-year-old man was apprehended on Saturday for allegedly giving a death threat to Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta, police said. Though he has been identified as Shlok Tripathi, a police source said the accused is a fraudster and frequently changes his identity. He was arrested by the Delhi Police and is being interrogated in the office of the force's Special Cell in northwest Delhi, an official said. The accused made the threat on the emergency helpline 112 in neighbouring Ghaziabad in Uttar Pradesh on the intervening night of Thursday and Friday.



The Ghaziabad police alerted their Delhi counterparts and also dispatched a team to Panchwati Colony, from where the call was reportedly made, the caller managed to evade getting caught, Assistant Commissioner of Police, Ghaziabad, Ritesh Tripathi said.

## India urges global collaboration on heat-humidity index amid rising heatwaves

**New Delhi, June 7 (UNI)** India has called for enhanced global collaboration to develop a real-time, localised heat-humidity index tailored to regional vulnerabilities as it noted that such climate extremes are trans-boundary and systemic threats. "India has taken a proactive and forward-thinking approach to extreme heat risk management under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi," said Dr PK Mishra, principal secretary to the Prime Minister.

Delivering the keynote address during the special session on Extreme Heat Risk Governance in Geneva, he stressed that rising temperatures pose a systemic risk to public health, economic stability, and ecological resilience. "Heatwaves are trans-boundary and systemic risks, particularly for densely populated urban areas," Mishra said as he welcomed the UN body's efforts to advance a Common Framework for Extreme Heat Risk Governance, describing it as a vital platform for shared learning, guidance, and global collaboration, said a statement here. While urging global stakeholders to invest in technology exchange, joint research, and accessible knowledge platforms through the Common Framework for Extreme Heat Risk Governance, Mishra called for a global focus on developing a localized heat-humidity index based on real-time data to enhance early warning systems, advancing building technologies and passive cooling innovations that are affordable and culturally appropriate. Under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the country has adopted a proactive and integrated strategy to confront extreme heat, he said adding, "India



has moved beyond reactive disaster response to forward-looking preparedness and long-term mitigation.

"He cited the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA)'s guidelines on heatwave management, first issued in 2016 and revised in 2019, as foundational in enabling localised Heat Action Plans (HAPs), the statement added.

He also applauded the pioneering Ahmedabad Heat Action Plan, which demonstrated how early warnings, institutional coordination, and grassroots outreach can significantly reduce heat-related deaths. India's approach, Mishra noted, is a whole-of-government and whole-of-society effort, involving ministries of health, agriculture, labour, urban development, water, power, and education. "More than 250 cities and districts across 23 heat-prone states have implemented HAPs with the NDMA's support. These plans have resulted in improved surveillance, hospital readiness, and awareness campaigns, contributing to a marked reduction in heatwave mortality," he added. Mishra highlighted the role of public health institutions, civil society, academic partners, and local governments, stressing the value of traditional knowledge and local experience in shaping effective interventions. "Extreme heat deeply impacts communities," he said, "and India has made schools and health centers central to its strategy of climate resilience."

## Mumbai police book filmmaker Manish Gupta for stabbing driver over salary dispute

**Mumbai, June 7 (UNI)** Bollywood filmmaker Manish Gupta has been booked for allegedly stabbing his driver with a kitchen knife following a salary dispute, police said on Saturday. According to Mumbai police, the incident occurred on Thursday night at Gupta's residence in the Sagar Sanjog building in Andheri area of a Mumbai suburb. Police sources said the victim, 38-year-old driver Mohammad Lashkar, had worked with Gupta for three years, earning a monthly salary of ₹23,000. However, Gupta reportedly never paid his salary on time, leading to frequent altercations between them. Gupta also failed to pay Lashkar's salary for the previous month and sacked

him. On June 5 when Lashkar demanded his pending salary, Gupta allegedly refused to pay and reportedly took a knife from the kitchen and stabbed him on the right side of his body. The Versova police station registered an FIR against Gupta on June 6 under Sections 118(1) (voluntarily causing hurt or grievous hurt by dangerous weapons or means), 115(2) and 115 (voluntarily causing hurt), and 352 (intentional insult with intent to provoke breach of peace) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita. Sources in Versova police said that so far Gupta has not been arrested, but police served him a summons directing him to appear in the police station.

## UK Foreign Secretary David Lammy in New Delhi, to meet PM Modi, EAM

**New Delhi, June 7 (UNI)** UK Foreign Secretary David Lammy is visiting New Delhi today, to further advance the India-UK relationship during talks with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar, besides other government officials. His visit comes after the two nations agreed on the Free Trade Agreement, which is set to increase trade by more than pounds 25 billion every year. Foreign Secretary Lammy will meet with Prime Minister Modi on his second visit to India to discuss ongoing economic and migration partnership, a statement from the British HC said. The Foreign Secretary will also welcome progress in the migration partnership, including ongoing work on safeguarding citizens and securing borders in both countries. Addressing migration remains a top priority for the government - the Foreign Secretary is focused on working internationally with global partners to secure the UK's



borders at home. Foreign Secretary David Lammy said: "Signing a free trade agreement is just the start of our ambitions - we're building a modern partnership with India for a new global era. We want to go even further to foster an even closer relationship and cooperate when it comes to delivering growth, fostering innovative technology, tackling the climate crisis and delivering our migration priorities, and providing greater security for our people."

The Foreign Secretary will also meet with leading figures in Indian business to discuss how we can unlock even greater investment by Indian business in the UK. Our investment relationship supports over 600,000 jobs across both countries, with over 950 Indian-owned companies in

the UK and over 650 UK companies in India. In 2023-24, India was the UK's second largest source of investments in terms of number of projects for the fifth consecutive year.

Talks will also take stock of progress, following a commitment by the UK and Indian Prime Ministers to take forward an ambitious UK-India Comprehensive Strategic Partnership.

The trade deal is a key example of the progress being made since the last meeting between the Foreign Secretary and his Indian counterpart. It follows the signing of the UK-India Programme of Cultural Cooperation Agreement in May and pounds 400 million of trade and investment wins boosting the British and the Indian economy at the Economic and Financial Dialogue in April. The Foreign Secretary is also expected to address the recent escalation in tensions following the Pahalgam terrorist attack and how the welcomed sustained period of peace can be best

supported in the interests of stability in the region. On May 2, the UK and India signed a new UK-India Programme of Cultural Cooperation to boost collaboration across the arts and culture, creative industries, tourism and sport sectors. The agreement will open the door for increased UK creative exports to India and enable more partnerships between UK and Indian museums and cultural institutions, helping to grow UK soft power.

At the 13th UK-India Economic and Financial Dialogue (EFD) in April, Chancellor Rachel Reeves welcomed pounds 400 million of trade and investment wins set to boost the British and the Indian economy and deliver economic growth and security for working people. David Lammy travelled to India on his first official visit as Foreign Secretary in July last year, when he announced the landmark UK-India Technology Security Initiative.

Those who test positive are strongly advised to isolate immediately to prevent further spread.

## Bank Employee Steals Rs. 4.58 Crore from 41 FD Accounts, Loses It All in Stock Market Investments

**Kota 7 June:** A former ICICI Bank employee, Sakshi Gupta, was arrested for allegedly siphoning off ₹4.58 crore from 41 customer accounts over two years.

As a relationship manager in Kota, she reportedly misused the funds hoping for high returns but lost it all. According to a media report, Sakshi Gupta worked at ICICI Bank's Shriram Nagar branch in Kota from 2020 to 2023. She was arrested by Udhayog Nagar police on May 31 after a detailed investigation. Investigators revealed that Sakshi Gupta accessed over 110 accounts of 41 customers between 2020 and 2023 by misusing the 'User ID' system and carried out multiple illegal transactions. She allegedly invested the siphoned funds in the stock market, hoping for quick profits.

The fraud continued for over two years without customers realising that their money was being withdrawn. However, Gupta's plan backfired as she incurred heavy losses in the stock market and couldn't return the money to the customers' accounts.

To hide the fraud, she

reportedly changed the contact numbers linked to the accounts, preventing customers from receiving transaction alerts.

According to a media report, sub-inspector Ibrahim Khan of Udhayog Nagar police station said, "She linked the phone numbers of her family members to these accounts and withdrew more than ₹4 crore. She even devised a system to receive the OTPs on her system so that the account holders wouldn't get a whiff of the fraud." Khan further said that Gupta used the account of an elderly woman and passed ₹3 crore through it without her knowledge. "She systematically transferred funds, sometimes using the account of an elderly woman who had no knowledge of the activity as a pool account. By mid-February 2023, over ₹3 crore had passed through that single account," the police officer was quoted as saying by TOI.

The case came into light only when a customer came to the bank to ask about his FD account.



The bank then filed a report with the police on February 18.

ICICI Bank acted quickly after uncovering the fraud, filing an FIR immediately.

"The interest of our customers are of paramount importance to us. Immediately upon discovering the fraudulent activity, we filed an FIR with the police," a spokesperson told LiveMint.

The bank has suspended Sakshi Gupta and settled claims of affected customers, adding, "We have a zero-tolerance policy against any fraudulent activity and thus suspended the employee involved. We would like to reassure that genuine claims of impacted customers have been settled."

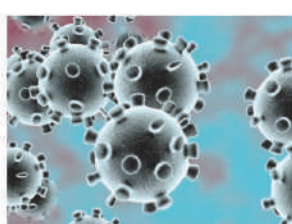
## 22 new Coronavirus positive cases reported in Maharashtra on Friday, 5364 in India

**Nagpur 7 June :** Maharashtra reported 22 new coronavirus-positive cases on Friday. With the fast spread of the new variant of Coronavirus, the total number of active cases in India has gone up to 5364 on Friday, which includes 764 new cases.

Four Corona deaths have also been reported, two in Kerala, and one each in Punjab and Karnataka. The

maximum number of coronavirus-positive cases has been reported from Kerala.

The number of new cases has risen to 192. Gujarat with 107, West Bengal with 58, Delhi with 30, and Maharashtra with 22 come next. The Centre has directed all the government hospitals to be prepared to meet the challenges if the mild coronavirus infection spreads



fast. The preliminary symptoms are cough, cold, fever, exhaustion, headache, muscular pain, gastrointestinal problems etc.

## Woman in Amravati duped of Rs 25.53 lakh via online investment

**Nagpur 7 June :** A 26-year-old woman was duped of over Rs 25 lakhs, assuring good returns on investment by a person who identified himself as Jasmit Singh, as a representative of New Zealand Gold Merchants Limited. An online account in the name of Vaishnavi Sonar was opened through which the complainant transferred Rs 25,53,478. Initially, she was given the returns to gain confidence. Later, she realized that the money could not be withdrawn from the account. She later lodged a complaint with Amravati's Benoda Police Station. Police have registered an offence against the unidentified person and are investigating.



## Vedanta's Nand Ghar to Transform 100 Anganwadis in Gadchiroli, Maharashtra through Public-Private Partnership

It also advances UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) 4 (Quality Education), 2 (Zero Hunger), and 5 (Gender Equality) placing children and women at the center of inclusive progress.

## Man Found Dead in Locked House in Vihirgaon; Hudkeshwar Police Launch Manhunt for Accused Friend

**Nagpur 7 June :** A murder investigation is underway after the body of a man was discovered inside a locked house in Vihirgaon late Friday night, under the jurisdiction of Hudkeshwar Police Station. The deceased has been identified as Anil Madhukar Pawar. Preliminary findings suggest that Pawar was



killed by a friend following a heated argument. The accused allegedly attacked

him on the head with a gas cylinder and a sigdi (traditional coal stove), resulting in fatal injuries. Police suspect personal enmity as the motive, though further investigation is ongoing to

establish the exact cause. The accused fled the scene after the incident and remains at large.

Hudkeshwar police have registered a case of murder and launched a manhunt to track down the suspect. Efforts are being made to gather more evidence and statements from those close to the victim.

## Assam police ban procession, rallies in Guwahati city

**Guwahati, June 7 (UNI) :** There would be no more rallies, marathon or walkathon in Assam capital town Guwahati. The city police commissionerate through an order has prohibited holding and organizing rallies and procession in Guwahati in order to ensure smooth traffic flow in the city. Deputy Commissioner of Police (Administration) Guwahati Imdad Ali in an order issued stated: "To ensure smooth traffic flow in Guwahati, it is essential to manage road usage

efficiently. Processions/ rallies often leads to significant traffic congestion, affecting the free movement of vehicles and causing inconvenience to commuters and other citizens." Such events, Ali made it clear, create challenges for citizens and lead to crowding and congestion. They may also delay emergency services, thereby impacting public safety. "The order said to minimise inconvenience and prevent anticipated traffic congestion all types of procession, rally, run, marathon and



walkathon within Guwahati city shall be restricted," said the order. "The order has been issued under Section 163 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Samhita, 2023 and comes into effect immediately," he said, adding that violation of this order shall be punishable under Section 223 of BNS.

## Delhi Airport to Cancel Over 100 Flights Daily During Three-Month Runway Upgrade; DIAL Prepares for Smooth Operations

**Delhi, 7 June :** GMR group-led Delhi International Airport Ltd (DIAL) expects minimal flight disruptions during the closure of Runway 10/28 for upgradation between June 15 and September 15. According to a media report, to prevent a repeat of April's delays and cancellations—caused by sudden wind pattern changes and limited runway availability—DIAL has worked closely with airlines and aviation authorities over the past few weeks to adjust flight slots and ensure smoother operations during the three-month period. According to DIAL CEO Videsh Kumar Jaipuriar, airlines will cancel a total of 114 flights per day—both arrivals and departures—during the runway closure, amounting to around 8% of the daily 1,450 flights. He noted that the usual cancellation rate is around 3–3.5%, so 8% is still manageable. In addition, 43 flights will be shifted from peak to non-peak hours to reduce congestion. Jaipuriar emphasized that, unlike in April, DIAL and the airlines are better prepared this time to handle the situation effectively. Runway 10/28—one of the four runways at Delhi's Indira Gandhi International Airport—is set to be upgraded to CAT 3B standards, including enhancements to its



Instrument Landing System (ILS). Once completed, the runway will support low-visibility landings from both ends, unlike the current setup where only one end is equipped. With this upgrade, Delhi airport will have three runways capable of handling low-visibility operations, significantly improving its ability to manage flight movements during North India's dense winter fog—often a cause of major disruptions at the country's busiest airport. DIAL initially began upgrading the runway in April-May and closed it in April. However, poor coordination with airlines—who did not reduce flights sufficiently—combined with sudden changes in wind patterns, caused widespread

delays and cancellations for several days. As India's largest and busiest airport, disruptions at IGIA have a ripple effect on flights nationwide. Following public outcry, the Ministry of Civil Aviation (MoCA) stepped in, directing DIAL to reopen the runway and postpone the upgrade to avoid impacting the peak summer travel season. Airlines were also instructed to adjust flight slots to match the reduced runway capacity and minimize passenger inconvenience. DIAL wants to finish the runway upgrade before the busy festival season from October to December, which is followed by winter when fog often disrupts flights at Delhi airport. The three-month

period ending on September 15 is a good time for the airport and airlines to do the work. According to Jaipuriar, when fog causes delays during westerly runway operations, it usually takes about three hours to get back to normal. But during easterly operations, it can take up to six hours. After the upgrade, Runway 10/28 will allow low-visibility landings from both ends, so the time needed to recover from fog delays will be the same for both directions. In simple terms, westerly and easterly runway operations mean the direction planes land and take off, which depends on the wind. Planes usually take off and land against the wind. During westerly operations, the wind blows from west to east, so planes land from the east and take off towards the west. During easterly operations, the wind blows from east to west, so planes land from the west and take off towards the east. According to data from DIAL, during low visibility at IGIA, the airport can handle 30 flight arrivals per hour when operating in the westerly direction. But during easterly operations, this capacity drops to just 15 flights per hour. After Runway 10/28 is upgraded, the arrival capacity during easterly low-visibility conditions will improve to match that of westerly operations.

## RBI Repo Rate Cut to 5.50%: How It Will Impact Your Home Loan EMIs and FD Returns

**Nagpur 7 June :** In an unexpected move on Friday, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) announced a 50 basis points reduction in the repo rate, bringing it down to 5.50 percent. Following the three-day Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) meeting, RBI Governor Sanjay Malhotra revealed a larger-than-anticipated rate cut. Experts say this decision will impact bank fixed deposit holders and new home loan borrowers.

### What Are Experts Saying?

Experts say that if banks pass on the benefits, the RBI's decision to reduce the repo rate is expected to help new home loan borrowers by lowering their monthly EMIs. For example, a borrower with a loan of ₹7.5 crore over 20 years could see their monthly EMI decrease by around ₹2,000, according to home loan EMI calculators. However, analysts also warn that fixed deposit (FD) investors may face lower returns across different tenors following the repo rate cut by the RBI.

### Cut RBI Repo Rate Impact on Home Loan

Annuj Goel, Managing Director at Goel Ganga Developments, explained how the RBI's repo rate cut would impact monthly home loan EMIs. According to a media report, he said, "Although the RBI's 50 bps repo rate cut has been bold and visually striking in terms of allowing savings for its lenders, the repo rate N/O is at 5.5%, so home loan borrowers can save from the increase."

Here's how the deal works: if you took a loan of ₹50 lakh for 20 years, you could save nearly ₹4.7 lakh over the entire loan tenure, which translates to roughly ₹1,960 less in your monthly EMI. Aman Gupta, Director of RPS Group, explained the relief for home loan borrowers with a ₹30 lakh loan over 20 years.

He said, "Home loan borrowers with a 30 lakh loan of 20 years will see decrease in their EMIS of about 1,176 per month, and the best part is borrowers then have the choice they can either reduce their EMIS or as being discussed here, retain their current EMI repayments to reduce the length of tenure and hence earn a greater interest saving," as per media report.

### New House Loan with New Interest Rate

"The RBI has cut the repo rate by 25 bps in February and April also," stated Pankaj Mathpal, MD & CEO of Optima Money Managers, regarding the total benefit that a new house loan borrower would receive following the RBI's repo rate cut in 2025. Since the RBI has reduced the repo rate by 100 basis points (25+25+50) in 2025, those who have put off purchasing a home in recent quarters now have a fantastic chance to do so because they will receive a monthly EMI reduction of approximately 3,800 to 74,000 on a home loan of 50 lakh for 20 years.

### Negative Impact on FD Returns

Pankaj Mathpal of Optima Money Managers highlighted the potential downside of the repo rate cut on bank FD returns. He noted that banks are likely to lower FD rates across all tenors after notifying their customers, as per media report. Therefore, senior citizens and other FD investors are advised to lock in their deposits now, as existing FDs will remain unaffected by the rate change. Those who miss this opportunity can also consider small savings schemes or time deposits offered by the post office.

## Monsoon's Return Expected to Lower Temperatures Across Central and Southern India Soon

**Nagpur 7 June :** The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has forecast a possible revival of the southwest monsoon between June 12 and 18, after its progress stalled on May 29.

A weather system is expected to form over the Bay of Bengal around June 12–13, though its development is still uncertain due to conflicting signals from

various forecast models. The extended-range forecast indicates a likely revival of the southwest monsoon between June 12 and 18, even if a weather system does not develop over the Bay of Bengal. After this revival, widespread rainfall is expected over central India, parts of Maharashtra, and areas of the southern peninsula where the monsoon has already

arrived. According to a media report, the overall progress of the monsoon will mainly depend on how evenly the rainfall is distributed. Hope returns for dry regions as the southwest monsoon is expected to revive between June 12 and 18, advancing into central and eastern India. Widespread rainfall, including some heavy showers, is likely over the southern peninsula and

adjoining areas. This is due to stronger westerly winds and a possible off-shore trough along the west coast. The monsoon's progress will depend on rainfall distribution and the strength of monsoon winds.

Skymet Weather forecasts the formation of a precursor cyclonic circulation over the west-central Bay of Bengal by June 10, which is expected to strengthen over

the next 48 hours. This system is likely to bring weather activity to the eastern coast starting June 11 and may follow a slightly southern path through Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Karnataka, and Maharashtra.

Skymet also predicts the monsoon will revive between June 12 and 17, covering most of the southern peninsula

## Dayanand Arya School Principal faces backlash as teachers, management refute harassment allegations



**Nagpur 7 June:** The Arya Vidya Sabha, which manages Dayanand Arya Kanya Vidyalaya in Nagpur, has firmly denied the allegations made by the school's suspended principal, Geeta Vikas Harwani. The organization has described her accusations as "baseless, misleading, and an attempt to divert attention from an official inquiry initiated against her." In a strong rebuttal issued on Wednesday, the Sabha clarified that the charges of mental harassment allegedly caused by Secretary Rajesh Lalvani and Executive Member Vedprakash Arya are "entirely false." Supporting the Sabha's

stance, over 30 staff members have reportedly raised concerns about Harwani's behavior during her tenure. In a video statement, 25 teachers have also spoken out against her, describing the work environment under her leadership as "challenging and distressing."

The controversy began after Mrs. Harwani's suspension, following which an inquiry committee was constituted. Instead of cooperating with the investigation, the Sabha claims she approached the Minority Commission with misleading complaints and filed two FIRs, which they

allege are part of a "calculated strategy." "We stand by the integrity of our inquiry process and will not succumb to external pressure," said Arya Vidya Sabha in its statement. "We urge Mrs Harwani to present her evidence before the inquiry panel instead of resorting to public defamation and legal tactics."

The Sabha reiterated its commitment to transparency and fairness, stating that it welcomes any evidence that could assist in a thorough investigation. This case has stirred significant attention within the city's educational circles, with many now awaiting the findings of the internal probe.

## Sewage makeover for Nagpur region: 15 towns to get STPs, city set to benefit

**Nagpur 7 June:** In a major step toward cleaner cities and healthier water bodies, Nagpur and 15 surrounding towns are on track to receive a significant sewage infrastructure upgrade under the Swachh Bharat Mission (Urban) 2.0. The Maharashtra Urban Development Mission has approved the construction of modern Sewage Treatment Plants (STPs) across smaller urban areas, with Nagpur city also set to benefit from improved regional wastewater management. The 15 Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) in the Nagpur division — including towns like Kamptee, Katol, Saoner, Ramtek, and Kalmeshwar — will see new STPs capable of treating a total of 54 million litres of wastewater



per day. While these facilities will be built in smaller towns, Nagpur city will see indirect relief, with reduced sewage inflow into its already overburdened rivers, Nag and Pili. Part of a wider state plan covering 358 ULBs, the project aims to create a total sewage treatment capacity of 1,654 MLD using CPHEEO-approved technology and following strict environmental norms. Notably, treated water from the STPs will be reused for non-potable purposes like gardening and construction — helping conserve fresh water.

## Repeat offenders externed for cattle smuggling in Sadar

**Nagpur 7 June:** In a strong crackdown on the growing menace of cattle smuggling, Sadar Police have issued externment orders against seven habitual offenders, banning them from entering city limits for a period of 15 days. The move comes amid increasing concerns over illegal cattle transportation in Nagpur. The externed individuals have been identified as Tanveer Salim Haji Qureshi (34), Mohd. Irshad Abdul Wahab alias Badshah Qureshi (44), Saheb alias Shobi Noor Qureshi (35), Mohd. Imran Zaheer Qureshi (36), Raheel alias Chhotu Qureshi (36), Aasib Ajeeb Qureshi (36), and Sarfaraz Abdul Haq (35) — all residents of the Gaddigodam area. Despite facing multiple criminal cases in the past, the accused reportedly continued their involvement in cattle smuggling. Based on their persistent activities, Police Inspector Manish Thakre of Sadar Police Station took proactive legal action and issued externment notices. Citizens have been urged to immediately alert police if any of these individuals are seen within city limits during the restriction



period. In a parallel operation, Sadar Police conducted a raid near the railway tracks in Gaddigodam and rescued eight cattle that were allegedly confined for illegal transport. In another incident,

Tehsil Police freed 12 cattle from the possession of Ayub Aslam Qureshi, a resident of Ansar Nagar, Mominpura. He was arrested on the spot, and the rescued animals were shifted to a local shelter for

rehabilitation. Police authorities have reiterated their commitment to taking strict action against cattle smugglers and protecting animal welfare in the region.

## Bhagwat hails unity after Operation Sindoor, urges continued resolve

**Nagpur 7 June:** RSS chief Mohan Bhagwat on Thursday addressed the concluding event of the Karyakarta Vikas Varg for Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh volunteers in Nagpur and said the political class showed mutual understanding and the society gave a message of unity after Operation Sindoor. Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) chief Mohan Bhagwat has praised the Indian political leadership and civil society for demonstrating rare unity and mutual understanding in the aftermath of the deadly Pahalgam terror attack and India's subsequent military response. Operation Sindoor. Speaking on June 5, Bhagwat underscored the need to make such cohesive action a permanent fixture in India's approach to national security. strengthens our internal resolve." The Pahalgam attack on April 22 had left 26 civilians dead, triggering widespread outrage across the country. Operation Sindoor was carried out with precision by Indian armed forces, garnering praise from across the political spectrum, including leaders from the BJP, Congress, AAP, and various regional parties. "The government acted swiftly and decisively, and the armed

forces delivered a powerful message to our enemies," said a joint statement from multiple political parties, which also extended unconditional support to the security forces. Bhagwat, however, used the moment to stress the importance of ongoing vigilance. "Unity during crisis must not be episodic. We must maintain this alignment going forward, not just for security but for social cohesion," he said. He

also raised concerns about rising instances of forced religious conversions, emphasizing that freedom of belief must be protected and respected. "Faith should be a matter of individual conviction, not coercion," Bhagwat added. This is not the first time Bhagwat has advocated for political and societal unity. However, his remarks following Operation Sindoor have added weight, given the strong bipartisan and public support the operation received. Operation Sindoor has since been widely regarded as a benchmark in India's counter-terror strategy, blending military precision with political consensus.

Analysts say that such synergy is rare and must be institutionalized to effectively respond to future threats. Bhagwat's statement reflects a growing sentiment in the country — that national security is a collective responsibility, transcending political rivalries and societal divisions. As India continues to face complex security challenges, the unity showcased during Operation Sindoor may serve as a model for future responses.

## Violation of RTE norms in ZP school: High Court orders Status Quo

**Nagpur 7 June:** The Nagpur Bench of the Bombay High Court has issued a notice and status quo order in response to a petition filed by Nalanda Meshram, alleging that a Zilla Parishad (ZP) school in Hingna is in violation of the Right to Education (RTE) Act norms. As per the RTE Act, one teacher is required for every 35 students in each subject category. However, this guideline has not been followed at the said school. Hearing the petition, Justice Abhay Mantri directed the Chief Executive Officer of Zilla Parishad Nagpur, the Primary Education Officer, and the Headmistress of the ZP school to submit written responses. The petitioner was represented by Advocate Rigved Dhore, who informed the court that despite being notified, none of the respondents were present during the hearing.



the transfer order issued by the ZP CEO violates Sections 19 and 25 of the Right to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009.

As per Schedule 1(B) of the Act, for every class with more than 35 students, at least one teacher per subject is required — specifically for Science & Mathematics, Social Studies, and Language. The school had over 35 students enrolled by September 30, 2023, for the academic year 2023–24, justifying the need for three teachers.

The petition also challenges an order passed based on Notification dated March 15, 2024 (Section 1.7, Table 3), which allegedly ignored the applicable provisions under the RTE Act. As per this order, the petitioner was relieved from duty effective May 29, 2025, and was instructed to report to ZP school at Pardasinga. The court was informed that the Government Resolution (GR) on which the order is based is already under challenge in the High Court, which had earlier granted a status quo order in that case as well.

During the hearing, the court observed that the school had 41 students enrolled in 2023–24 and more than 36 enrolled for 2024–25 on the student portal — both exceeding the 35-student threshold.

The petitioner, being the third teacher, was essential under the staffing pattern, and had not yet been formally relieved by the headmistress.

## Nameless in death: Over 90 unclaimed bodies found across Nagpur in just 5 months

**Nagpur 7 June:** In a haunting reminder of growing urban apathy, Nagpur has recorded over 96 unclaimed and unidentified dead bodies across the city in just five months — a stark indicator of society's increasing disconnect with its most vulnerable. Discovered near government hospitals like Mayo, Medical College, and AIIMS, or lying along footpaths, markets, and roadsides in bustling areas like Sitabuldi and Itwari, these bodies tell a silent story of lives lived and lost in the shadows — away from care, dignity, or recognition.

**Unnatural deaths, exposure crisis** Of the 96 cases reported between January and May this year, 66 were found to have died of natural causes. However, a staggering 30 deaths were classified as unnatural — involving substance abuse, heatstroke, accidents, or unclear causes. Without any identity documents, family contact, or medical history, the police struggle to determine the exact circumstances of these deaths. Behind these grim statistics are individuals — mostly homeless — battling poverty, addiction, mental health issues, or estrangement from their families.

These are people who once walked the same roads, now lying lifeless by them, their stories untold and unheard. "The number is worrying," admitted a senior police officer.

"We're seeing a pattern of people slipping through the cracks — no support, no family, no help. And in death, there's no one to even ask their name."

**Final journey in silence** The process after discovery is painfully procedural. The

body is shifted to the morgue, and a five-day window is kept open for identification or claims. In most cases, no one comes. The police then complete the legal formalities and carry out the cremation or burial through municipal agencies.

When decomposition sets in or the face is unrecognizable, chances of identification are virtually nil. At times, tattoos or scars offer clues, but rarely do they lead to closure. The cycle of anonymity continues.

**A growing humanitarian concern** The rise in unclaimed bodies is more than a statistic — it's a human tragedy unfolding quietly on the city's streets. Experts and activists warn that this is the consequence of inadequate shelter homes, insufficient mental health support, lack of addiction treatment facilities, and sheer indifference.

Elon Musk's Starlink has finally secured a crucial licence from the Department of Telecommunications (DoT) to provide satellite-based internet services in India, marking a transformative moment in the country's digital journey. With this move, Starlink becomes the third company—after Eutelsat OneWeb and Jio Satellite Communications—to gain official entry into the Indian satellite internet space. Amazon's Project Kuiper, a formidable competitor, remains in limbo as it awaits regulatory approvals. The approval for Starlink comes after prolonged delays and negotiations, but its timing—coinciding with a dramatic public spat between Musk and U.S. President Donald Trump—has added another layer of global intrigue to what is essentially a major domestic milestone. The licence allows Starlink to soon apply for trial spectrum, which, according to DoT sources, may be granted within the next 15 to 20 days. This is a necessary step before commercial deployment, as the trial spectrum will enable the company to test its systems, processes, and compliance with India's security requirements. Importantly, Starlink must now adhere to stringent Indian regulations, including provisions for lawful interception of communications, data localisation, and partial indigenisation of its network infrastructure.

These rules reflect India's evolving security and data protection posture, especially at a time when digital infrastructure has become as critical as physical infrastructure. Starlink's business model is built on a constellation of low Earth orbit (LEO) satellites—currently numbering around 7,000, with ambitions to scale up to over 40,000. Unlike traditional satellite internet that relies on geostationary satellites located far above the Earth, Starlink's LEO satellites orbit just 550 kilometres from the surface, allowing for low-latency, high-speed internet access. The system has already proven its worth in difficult terrains and conflict zones, such as in Ukraine, where Starlink kept communication channels alive amidst the fog of war. In the Indian context, this technology could be a game changer for rural, hilly, and border areas where laying fibre optics is prohibitively expensive or logistically unfeasible. Starlink's entry into India has not occurred in isolation. Over the past few months, the company has been busy forging strategic partnerships with Indian telecom giants such as Reliance Jio and Bharti Airtel, which together control over 70% of the country's mobile market. These alliances will be essential for Starlink to navigate India's complex regulatory and market environment. While the technology and ambition are impressive, success will ultimately depend on ground-level execution, pricing models, and the ability to deliver consistent service across geographies. However, the broader satellite communication landscape in India is still in flux. The Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) recently submitted its recommendations to the government regarding pricing and conditions for satellite spectrum allocation. Only after these recommendations are accepted and the radio waves officially allocated can companies like Starlink begin commercial operations. TRAI has suggested a 4% adjusted gross revenue (AGR) levy as spectrum charges for satcom providers—a rate much higher than what industry players had lobbied for. Moreover, for urban users, an additional charge of ₹500 per subscriber annually has been proposed, though no such surcharge would apply in rural areas, thereby creating a natural incentive for rural expansion.

Road to justice for the Bengaluru XI

They were just enough to form a cricket team. The youngest was 13 and not a single one of the Bengaluru XI—those who had their lives snatched from them outside the M Chinnaswamy Stadium on Wednesday—was older than 40. They were of the city and beyond, some from other states. Girls, boys, students, dancers, software developers. Some were hardcore fans of the Royal Challengers Bangalore, who had, in last year, won their maiden Indian Premier League title. One did not even care about cricket, but was convinced by friends that a selfie at the venue would be worth the visit. All of them had one thing in common: they were drawn to a single location to be part of a celebration. It was to be an "I was there" moment. Not one of them could have imagined that the price to pay would be the ultimate one. When you enlist in the army, go bungee jumping, attempt to climb Mount Everest, or run with the bulls in Pamplona, you know that there is a real chance that death could come close. It's a risk you take knowing what you are getting into.

But when you go to a cricket stadium to feel like you are part of something bigger, to share in the celebration of an achievement that has been nearly two decades in the making, the biggest worry is not the chance you have of returning alive. To blame any of the victims would be perverse beyond belief, dealing the unkindest of cuts to the families of those who lost their lives. Yet, it is with deepest sadness that it must be recorded that what happened was not the city's 'defect' or a sporting negligence—it was an Indian tragedy. Repeatedly, when crowds gather, for one cause or another, tragedy unfolds; yet, as a collective, we learn nothing.

There is no doubt that the events of Wednesday afternoon have shaken Indian society's consciousness, but not so much that it will act as a deterrent. Not so much that there will be any changes of consequence when it comes to developing infrastructure that can safely handle large crowds, spontaneous surges of people or exuberant gatherings. Not thoroughly enough to force people in power to pause and get to the bottom of why something that should never have happened occurred. A probe has been ordered, arrests may be made, officials suspended and monetary compensation promised. This is a



templated response. You can transpose the name of the team or sport, the venue, or the occasion with a religious gathering, a clamour to board a train—and the story would remain depressingly the same. They dare not say it aloud, but there will be a few who will look at the episode and think that only 11 people died. In India, it's not a number of fatalities that triggers righteous outrage.

In 2005, at least 258 died in Satara, Maharashtra during a pilgrimage. In 2013, more than 115 were killed in a bridge collapse in over the Godavari in Andhra Pradesh. In 2024, the official count in Hathras, Uttar Pradesh was 121; the trigger was a tent collapse. In sports, globally, the numbers are equally

terrifying: 300 in Peru at a football game in 1964, 93 in Nepal in 1988, and 126 in Ghana in 2001. In terms of numbers, the Hillsborough tragedy of 1989 where 97 people lost their lives at the FA Cup semi-final between Liverpool and Nottingham Forest in Sheffield is probably the most high-profile, not least because the victims' families banded together to mount a protracted campaign for justice. It took 27 years for the UK courts to charge those responsible.

In India, with the judicial system so overburdened that even the simplest of disputes can take decades to resolve, who knows when, if ever, those responsible for the events of Bengaluru 2025 will be brought to book. "If we are not ready to hold a

roadshow, we should not have [it]. As simple as it can get. I know fans do get excited, everyone gets excited; but it's nothing compared to what happened yesterday," Gautam Gambhir, India's head coach, said. "I was never a believer that we need to have roadshows—never. We need to be responsible. We need to be responsible citizens and responsible in every aspect because every life matters," he said. He is right, of course, in saying that no single life is worth more than another, and that we the people should be more responsible. But the human mind is such that it rarely lingers long enough to persevere towards a transformation. As individuals and a collective, as a populace and as those who govern, we move on, because if we stopped to actually take stock of each horrific incident, we might lose the will to wake up the next day. We forget not because we are callous, but because the alternative is too painful. We forgive not because we want to, but because we would otherwise be consumed. The long road to justice for the Bengaluru XI has just begun. What shape it will take, what timeline it will follow, and what price it will extract is impossible to predict.

Only one thing is likely: before there is closure in this case, many more similarly avoidable tragedies may well unfold.

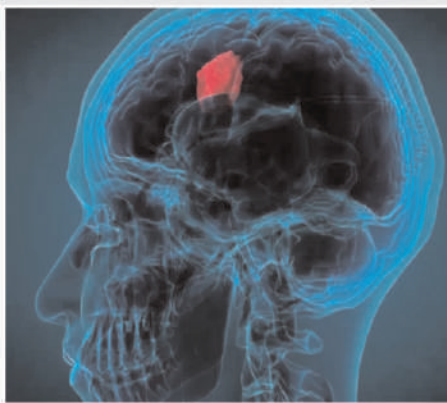

The recent signing of four Production Transfer Agreements between Dassault Aviation and Tata Advanced Systems Limited (TASL) marks a pivotal moment in India's aerospace ambitions. For the first time, complete Rafale fighter aircraft fuselages will be manufactured outside France—and that too, in Hyderabad. It is more than a business deal; it is a powerful affirmation of India's growing credibility in high-precision defence manufacturing and an important stride toward strategic autonomy. Under the agreement, TASL will manufacture key structural components of the Rafale fighter jet, including the front, central, and rear fuselage sections, in a new, state-of-the-art facility in Hyderabad. The facility is expected to begin delivering fuselage sections by FY2028, eventually ramping up to producing up to two complete fuselages per month. While India's acquisition of Rafale jets has long been a topic of political and strategic discourse, this manufacturing partnership shifts the narrative from procurement to production—from dependence to participation. For Dassault Aviation to transfer the production of the Rafale's core fuselage components—a critical part of any fighter aircraft's structure—to India speaks volumes about India's emergence as a reliable industrial partner in global defence supply chains. The Rafale is a fourth-generation multirole fighter, and its fuselage demands high levels of precision, quality assurance, and technological sophistication. The fact that this responsibility has been entrusted to TASL reflects the competence and credibility India's private aerospace players have earned over the last



decade. This move also underscores the gradual, but steady, realisation of the "Make in India" and Atma Nirbhar Bharat visions. For years, India's defence procurement has been plagued by import dependency. Over 60 per cent of India's defence needs are still met by foreign suppliers, which creates strategic vulnerabilities, especially in times of global disruption. Shifting from being a buyer to becoming a builder is not a semantic shift—it is a transformative one. Indigenous production of key aircraft components, such as the Rafale fuselage, helps India gain mastery over critical manufacturing processes, reduces long-term costs, and provides an impetus to the local aerospace ecosystem. The significance of this development is multifaceted. First, it demonstrates the success of India's private sector in carving a niche in a domain traditionally dominated by the public sector. TASL, in collaboration with global defence majors like Lockheed Martin and Boeing in the past, has consistently proven its capability to deliver aerospace components with world-class precision. With this new partnership, Tata moves a notch higher—from component manufacturer to structural integration—bringing India a step closer to full-spectrum aircraft manufacturing. avionics support, quality certification, .

When diseases cross borders, so must solidarity

Even as the US, led by President Donald Trump, withdrew from global health engagements through a petulant exit from the World Health Organization (WHO) and the evicseration of its international aid agency, two events in Geneva on May 19 unfurled the flag of global solidarity. One, international negotiations on the Pandemic Treaty ended, with all participating WHO members agreeing on the final text. The treaty was cheered by an anxious world badly bruised by Covid's devastation and wary of more zoonotic pandemics on the horizon. It is the second-ever global health treaty to be concluded under auspices of the WHO, after the Framework Convention for Tobacco Control adopted in 2003.

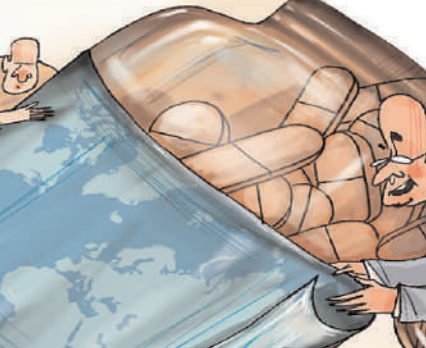
Thesecond was the convening of a forum—Digital Health Without Borders—to advance digital health applications across the world with impact, efficiency and equity. The event, organised by Dr Rajendra Gupta from India, was addressed by WHO's Director General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus and leading digital technology experts as well as prominent representatives from the domains of medicine, nursing and public health. They advocated universal access to impactful digital health technologies to prevent pandemics and promote primary care-led universal health coverage.

These affirmations of a 'one world' approach are reassuring in a polarised political environment where the US and some other countries are retreating from adherence to principles of global solidarity. While the US and Argentina have quit the WHO, western European nations like the Netherlands and Germany have reduced their commitments to global aid. Trump and Musk have eviscerated USAID, which was a major contributor to global health programmes aimed at tackling infectious diseases like HIV-AIDS and tuberculosis, as well as maternal and child health protection. Scientific agencies like the National Institutes of Health have been disconnected from global research.

Global health, as a policy and practice domain, evolved through stages. Initially, colonial powers like Britain and Belgium invested in establishing institutes for 'tropical medicine' to protect their soldiers, traders, administrators and local labourers from infectious diseases like malaria and cholera. After decolonisation, western nations talked of 'international health' while engaging with developing countries. The HIV-AIDS pandemic triggered a scare and made western nations direct resources for its control across the globe. In this era, aid came with many strings attached. It enabled researchers from high-income countries to design and direct research in other countries, while gaining publications and patents. It provided an opportunity for western funders to mandate use of medical technologies supplied by their companies and impose their 'experts' and consultancy firms. UN agencies such as WHO, UNICEF, UNFPA and UNDP also shaped and supported global health initiatives, but high-income countries often influenced their agendas and millions.

After the adoption of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) by the UN in 2000, funding for international health came not only from government aid agencies but also from rich private foundations like Gates, Rockefeller and Bloomberg, as well as charities like the Wellcome Trust.

Recently, the Novo Foundation has emerged as a major global health funder. Multilateral lenders like the World Bank and



continental banks in Asia and Africa support countries with soft loans for strengthening national health programmes. These channels of global health financing continued after adoption of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). High-income western countries have (SDGs), high-income western countries programmes, abiding by their commitments to global development assistance and as 'soft diplomacy' instruments to advance their geopolitical and trade interests. Later, China and rich west Asian countries also started supporting global health programmes for similar reasons. Apart from bilateral channels, donor countries have also channelled funds through UN agencies to advance their strategic interests. Amid this economic and political power play, moral motivation of the global health enterprise dimmed and global solidarity became a shibboleth. In the era of international health, donors posed the question "what can we do for you?" In the era of global health, the question should have been reframed as "what can we do together?"

The world faces many common threats, from pandemics and anti-microbial resistance to climate change and commercial forces propelling the global epidemics of non-communicable diseases and obesity. Global health votaries must utilise both multilateral forums and bilateral channels to address such common threats. Simultaneously, high and upper-middle-income countries must help in strengthening health systems of low and lower-middle-income countries as their frailty will endanger global health security and economic stability. This was taught by Covid pandemic. "No one is safe till everyone is safe" should not be a vacuous platitude. Access to essential drugs, vaccines and technologies must be universal, while co-investments in development of a multi-layered, multi-skilled health workforce will benefit the whole world.

Espousal of global health by high income countries drew impetus from their evangelical advocacy of economic globalisation as the mantra for global prosperity. While access to global financial and labour markets boosted economic growth around the world, dice were loaded in favour of rich countries. Even as Thomas Friedman exulted that the 'world is flat' due to globalisation, rich countries used restrictive patent protection practices to show that even a flat surface can be tilted in their favour.

But Western enthusiasm for globalisation vanished when non-western economies started growing fast. As countries like China, India, Brazil and South Africa gained economic muscle and unbundled capitalism triggered a financial crisis in the West, fear of becoming 'submerging economies' led western economies to pursue protectionist policies and abandon multilateralism.

e 'slash and burn' retreat of western capitalism from globalisation is typified by the Trump administration's assault on global trade and health through tariffs and tirades. As the song on a Disney World ride goes, "It is a small world after all".

## Joyful Eid-ul-Adha celebrations across Kashmir shadowed by prayer ban at Jamia Masjid Srinagar

**Srinagar, June 7 (UNI)** Eid-ul-Adha, the festival of sacrifice, is being celebrated with religious fervor and traditional gaiety across Kashmir on Saturday. The largest congregation of worshippers gathered at the iconic Hazratbal Shrine on the banks of the Dal Lake, where thousands offered Eid prayers. However, the spirit of the festival was somewhat marred as authorities did not allow congregational prayers at the Eidgah and the historic Jamia Masjid in the old city. The move drew sharp criticism from J&K Chief Minister Omar Abdullah, Kashmir's chief cleric Mirwaiz Umar Farooq, and Peoples Democratic Party President Mehbooba Mufti. Despite this, Eid spirit was visible across the Valley. Dressed in their festive best, worshippers thronged mosques and designated Eidgahs early in the morning to participate in the special prayers. The gatherings passed off peacefully, with no untoward incidents reported. Prominent political leaders, including CM Omar Abdullah, former Chief Ministers Farooq Abdullah and Mehbooba Mufti, were among those who offered prayers at Hazratbal, the holiest shrine in Kashmir, where the mood was both solemn and celebratory. Soon after the Eid prayers, many families across the region performed the symbolic sacrifice of goats and sheep to

commemorate the "sacrifice" of Prophet Ibrahim. Kashmir's homes bustled with the colors of festivity. Children, dressed in new clothes, visited relatives to seek blessings, while elders exchanged warm Eid hugs and heartfelt greetings. "Eid-ul-Adha is about attending congregational prayer, offering sacrifices, and spending time with family and visiting relatives," said Adil Ahmed, a Srinagar resident. The celebrations are set to continue till Monday, with families planning visits, feasts, and charitable acts over the next two days. Meanwhile, Anjuman Auqaf Jama Masjid on Saturday said that authorities disallowed Eid prayers at the historic Jama Masjid in the old city and also put Mirwaiz Umar Farooq under house arrest. The managing committee of the Jama Masjid mosque affairs said the authorities once again disallowed Eid-ul-Adha prayers at Eidgah Srinagar, as well as at the historic Jama Masjid Srinagar, by closing the gates of the mosque and deploying police personnel outside. Traditionally, the congregational Eid prayers are offered at Eidgah. "Even the Fajr prayers this morning were not permitted at Jama Masjid as the gates remained locked," the statement said, adding "Mirwaiz has also been placed under house arrest." In a post on X, Mirwaiz, who is also the Hurriyat



chairman, said it is for the seventh year in a row that Eid prayers were disallowed at Jamia. The Eid prayers have been barred at the Jama Masjid and Eidgah by the authorities since 2019. "Eid Mubarak! Yet again, Kashmir wakes up to the sad reality: no Eid prayers at Eidgah, and Jama Masjid locked down — for the 7th straight year. I, too, have been detained at my home," Mirwaiz said. "In a Muslim-majority region, Muslims are deprived of their fundamental right to pray—even on their most important religious occasion celebrated across the world! What a shame on those who rule over us, and on those elected by the people who choose to remain silent as our rights are trampled over, again and again," he added. The Lt Governor administration, which is in charge of law and order in J&K, didn't respond to the claims made by the

Anjuman. J&K Chief Minister Omar Abdullah said he was deeply concerned about the denial of Eid prayers at Jamia Masjid. He questioned the authority of those making this decision. "I have no information on what basis such a decision is taken. But one day we will have to trust our people. They are the same people who, after the April 22 (Pahalgam terror attack) came out and expressed their anger and said they are not with the attack and condemned the act.... But today, once again, the Eid prayers were not allowed at historic Jama Masjid... I feel that the government should think again at some point," Omar told reporters in Srinagar. PDP Chief Mehbooba said the locking of Jamia Masjid on Eid and house arrest of Mirwaiz is highly condemnable and is an "interference in our religious affairs."

## Congress attacks MP govt for 'not paying salary' to 50K employees

**Bhopal, June 7 (UNI)** The Madhya Pradesh government's reported instruction to all treasury officers concerning the non-payment of salaries to 50,000 state employees over the past few months has prompted the Congress to hit out at the government over the issue. Sources said a State Financial Intelligence Cell (SFIC) is operating under the Commissioner of Treasury and Accounts Office, which analyses the treasury data at regular intervals and also monitors the salary withdrawal of employees. This cell analysed the data of employee codes of approximately 50,000 individuals whose salaries have not been withdrawn from the treasury software for the past four months, sources



added. The cell, after testing data for December 2024, found that there are employees whose code has been allotted, yet their salary has not been withdrawn for four months. The Office of Commissioner of Treasury and Accounts has now reportedly directed all treasury officers to confirm withdrawal within 15 days as to why the salaries are not being withdrawn by employees. State Congress president Jeetu Patwari told media that 50 thousand employees have "gone

missing" in the state. Their salary of about Rs 250 crore has not been withdrawn. The government has formed an inquiry committee tasked with finding out such employees. Patwari alleged that in a state with four lakh 50 thousand employees, if 50 thousand of them have to be searched, "then what a big economic and administrative anomaly it should be". Leader of the Opposition in the Assembly Umang Singh also raised the issue on the social media platform X. He asked whether these employees are on 'unpaid leave' or they have been suspended. "Are all these only on paper? If the salary of an employee has not been withdrawn for months, then this points to a big scam," he stated.

## Punjab Minister Sindh alleges play by Congress leader Ashu to gain political sympathy

**Ludhiana, June 6 (UNI)** Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) Punjab Minister Tarunpreet Singh Sindh today alleged a conspiracy orchestrated by Congress leader Bharat Bhushan Ashu to gain political sympathy ahead of the Ludhiana West by-election. Addressing a press conference, accompanied by AAP Punjab Working President Amansher Singh Shery Kalsi, Minister Sindh highlighted that a vigilance notice purportedly issued against Ashu was "part of a deceitful play devised by Ashu himself". Upon investigation, it was uncovered that the vigilance SSP who issued the notice was a former classmate and close friend of Ashu. He revealed that Ashu manipulated his connections to fabricate the notice, aiming to portray himself as a victim and divert public attention from his alleged multi-crore corruption in a school land scam. "This is possibly the first time in India's political history that a politician has stooped so low and fabricated summons to play a victim card. Ashu's intent was clear—to garner sympathy by portraying himself as a target of the current government," said Sindh. He added that the fabricated notice aimed to shift focus away

from the multi-crore school land scam, in which Ashu and his associates, including his brother, have been accused of misappropriating prime land meant for a school. The scam has deeply impacted parents, students, and alumni of the school, who are now demanding justice and action against those responsible. The AAP leader that the Congress party is "resorting to desperate and unethical tactics out of fear of imminent defeat in Ludhiana West". "This level of dishonesty and manipulation reflects the crumbling moral fabric of Congress leadership," he stated. Sindh assured the public that strict action has been taken against the vigilance officer involved in this conspiracy. "The officer who misused his position to favour Ashu has been suspended. The AAP government is committed to ensuring a corruption-free administration and will take all necessary steps to expose and punish those who exploit public trust," he affirmed.

## Single level promotion scheme for ashram school teachers launched

### MLC Sudhakar Adbale's efforts bear fruit

**Wadi 7 June (NAGPUR POST/TC):** MLC Sudhakar Adbale had put forth a demand during the budget session through a starred question for starting single-tier promotion scheme and incentive allowance for teachers and non-teaching staff in the aided VJNT ashram schools run by the Other Backward Bahujan Welfare Department in the state. Finally, the government took cognisance of the demand and approved it and issued a government directive in this regard on June 4. As a result of this, there is an atmosphere of happiness among the employees of the aided VJNT ashram schools across the state. The scheme of single-tier promotion for VJNT ashram school employees working in tribal Naxal-affected areas was launched as per the government directive of the Social Justice Department on December 3, 2007. However, on March 13, 2020, the department issued



a government directive and ordered the closure of this scheme and recovery of the benefits received as these employees are not eligible for this benefit. Employees from across the state expressed their anger against this directive and filed writ petitions in the Nagpur/Aurangabad bench of the High Court against this directive. The decision of the petition was in favour of the employees and the departmental officers were directed to take a decision within 6 months and provide benefits to the employees. However, after realising that

the government was not approving this benefit even after a period of two years, the office bearers of the Shikshak Sangh were upset and met legislator Sudhakar Adbale and demanded justice. They followed up on this matter from the district level to the ministry level. However, after realising the chaotic management of this department, MLC Sudhakar Adbale drew attention to this issue in the budget session of the state legislature. The department's minister Atul Save gave an enthusiastic response and instructed the officials to issue orders immediately.

Finally, the government issued a directive and approved the benefits of a single level promotion scheme to all the eligible VJNT Ashram school employees working in tribal Naxal-affected areas. Due to this, an atmosphere of happiness is seen to be prevailing among the ashram school employees.

Many students encountered technical glitches while registering on the department's official software platform, causing



widespread difficulties and delays. Thousands were affected, prompting the Secondary and Higher Secondary Education Department to initiate urgent troubleshooting measures. Officials stated that as of the night of June 4, over 900 pending complaints had been successfully resolved. The department has assured that students who still face issues will be allowed to complete their registrations during a

## Shift to organic practices paying Wardha farmers rich dividends

**Wardha 7 June:** In the heart of Maharashtra's Wardha district, an agricultural revolution is occurring, one whose golden opportunities for sustainable farming and rural wealth must be shared. At its core is Shri Prabhakarao Deotale, a Nandora village farmer who transitioned from conventional to organic farming, both increasing revenue and environmental health, largely because of inspired by Patanjali Ayurved's farm extension work. Deotale, an owner of 1.5 hectares of land who grew a variety of vegetables conventionally for years, received his wake-up call in May-June 2019 when he attended an organic farming training program conducted by the Patanjali Bio Research Institute (PBRI) at Nandora. The workshop was under the Farmer Samruddhi Programme of Patanjali, an initiative to empower farmers through ancient Indian knowledge systems blended with modern organic principles. During his training, Deotale was introduced to a wide variety of natural farming inputs and philosophies,

including Jeevamrut, Beejamrut, cow dung-based composts, and vermish— all staples in organic farming protocol. He also learned the advantages of using straight (non-hybrid) seed varieties and natural pest deterrents over chemical fertilizers and insecticides. Armed with such knowledge, Deotale took a dramatic turn. In July 2019, he set aside 0.50 acres (0.20 hectares) of his land for chemical-free cultivation of brinjal (Ankur) variety.

His initial results were promising enough for him to harvest in September of the same year. The shift to organic practices resulted in drastic reductions in the cost of inputs and sustained improvements in soil health. On the advice of Patanjali, Deotale made homemade Panchgavya and Dasharni—a mixture of natural plant products and other things to manage pests. Panchgavya and Dasharni was applied to the field as remedies recommended in Patanjali's farmer manuals, and they helped keep plants healthy and minimised the need for



commercial chemicals. The integrative organic system reduced pesticide costs and enhanced plant health. Notably, field observations showed healthier, stronger plant growth and immunity, an important parameter of crop and soil health under organic conditions.

Deotale initially sold his crop twice a week on the campus of a local medical and engineering college in Sewagram. Despite the limited exposure, the higher price of organic brinjal ensured a superior income. His success has drawn attention and imitation from other farmers in the district. Deotale's commitment extends beyond his field. A poet and singer, he composed Marathi songs detailing the health hazards of chemical farming—lessons he absorbed during Patanjali's RPL (Recognition

of Prior Learning) training. By performing these songs locally, he has become an organic ambassador, sensitizing other farmers and villagers to the dangers of pesticides and the promise of natural methods. What makes Deotale's journey remarkable is the blend of tradition and innovation. Patanjali's approach—rooted in Vedic agriculture and fortified by modern training—has given farmers like Deotale the tools to achieve profitability without compromising the environment or health. As awareness of food safety and sustainable farming grows, Deotale's success is more than an individual achievement. It is a potential model for rural transformation, where local know-how, sustainable technologies, and strategic placement of the market coalesce to create strong farm systems.

As chemical farming continues to brew as a cause of controversy, examples like that of Deotale show that maybe the future does lie in returning to our roots, with institutions like Patanjali in the lead.

## Our doors are open for Badgujar: Bawankule

**Nagpur 7 June:** Despite significant internal opposition, including from Nashik West MLA Seema Hiray and other BJP functionaries, state BJP president Chandrashekar Bawankule has indicated that the door remains open for Sudhakar Badgujar — the recently expelled Shiv Sena (UBT) deputy leader — to join the saffron party. Badgujar had been accused by the BJP of being anti-national after purported video clips surfaced showing him with 1993 Mumbai Bomb Blast convict Salim Kutta. However, Bawankule, speaking in Nashik at a workshop for over 550 party office-bearers from the Nashik division, asserted that an individual is not a criminal until proven so in a court of law. When asked about Badgujar potentially joining the party, Bawankule said, "The doors are open to all those who want to join the party." He acknowledged the existing "bitterness, misgivings, and misunderstandings" between Badgujar and current BJP leaders, citing their past electoral contest in the assembly elections. Bawankule added that he and Girish Mahajan



were "looking into the matter". He emphasized that no deadline had been set for a decision on Badgujar's inclusion. "It will take time. After all, the party is striving for the development of society and the country, and we want to increase the party bases. We will decide appropriately and accordingly if anybody wants to join us without any conditions," Bawankule said. In response to the question that party functionaries felt accepting Badgujar into the party fold would malign the party image, Bawankule said, "Making allegations against a person is one thing, and conviction by the court is another. I personally believe that no one should judge any person based on allegations." Regarding the Thackeray brothers coming together, Bawankule said the party has nothing to do with their decision, especially when the Mahayuti is stronger than ever

## Minority commission chief slams Nitesh Rane's comment on Eid

**Nagpur 7 June:** Pyare Khan, chairman of the Maharashtra State Minority Commission, has criticised the recent statements made by Minister Nitesh Rane, accusing him of sowing divisions and targeting Indian Muslims in the name of Pakistan. Rane had questioned the sacrifice of animals during Eid Al Adha, called for a celebration of a 'virtual Eid' and said India does not operate under Shariah law. "Nitesh Rane keeps making the same hurtful comments again and again," Khan said. "He taunts Indian Muslims by dragging in Pakistan, why? The truth is, those who chose to go to Pakistan did not believe in India. But those who stayed here, they are the honest ones. They believe in this country, and people admire them for that. Maybe that's what is bothering Nitesh Rane the most," Khan said. He was talking to the media in Nagpur on Tuesday. Khan expressed concern that Rane's statements are not just harmful to society, but also risk dragging his own



party. "By speaking like this, Nitesh Rane is damaging the image of the BJP. These are personal statements, but they reflect on everyone," he said. He also issued a firm warning. "If communal tensions rise because of such comments, the Minority Commission will act. We have the power under Section 10 to issue a notice. If a riot happens, and it is because of his words, we won't hesitate to hold him responsible." When contacted, Nitesh Rane said, "I was expecting a responsible person like him from the Muslim community to come out and support the stand of celebrating eco-friendly Bakrid. That will solve a lot of problems and stop this Hindu-Muslim divide for good."

## Govt clerk booked for threatening woman officer outside her residence in Pratapnagar

**Nagpur 7 June:** A clerk from the Social Welfare Department has been booked for allegedly threatening a female officer at her residence in Pratapnagar, after wrongly assuming that she was responsible for delaying his voluntary retirement application. The incident, which occurred around midnight on June 3, has triggered panic in the department. The accused has been identified as Sushil Shinde, a resident of Bhilgaon, Kamptee. According to police, Shinde had submitted a voluntary retirement application to the woman officer in March this year. The officer had forwarded the application to the government for approval. However, as no decision was



made on the file, Shinde grew frustrated and mistakenly assumed that the officer had deliberately stalled the process. In recent weeks, Shinde began creating a nuisance at the office and allegedly issued threats to the officer. The situation escalated dramatically on Tuesday, around 1 AM, when he arrived in a car outside the officer's residence in the Pratapnagar area. According to the complaint, Shinde

parked his vehicle in front of the gate and began honking continuously, forcing the officer and her family members to come outside. Allegedly under the influence of alcohol, he verbally abused the officer and threatened to kill her. He even tried to ram the gate with his car in an attempt to break it, creating panic among the family members. The family immediately informed the police control room, which alerted Pratapnagar Police. However, by the time the police arrived, Shinde had fled the scene. Based on the complaint filed by the woman officer, Pratapnagar Police have registered a case against Sushil Shinde. Further investigation is underway.

## Neglect by Pathrot Gram Panchayat Leads to Health Hazards

**Pathrot 7 June:** Despite government campaigns promoting "Clean Village, Beautiful Village," the Pathrot Gram Panchayat in Achalpur Taluka has turned a blind eye to sanitation. Widespread filth, blocked drains spilling foul water onto roads, and garbage piles have turned the village into a breeding ground for diseases.

The Vitthal Temple area is surrounded by waste, making even basic movement difficult for locals. The public toilet near the bus stand has remained unusable for five years. The increasing mosquito population is heightening the risk of vector-borne diseases, leading to widespread public outrage.

## Two calves killed in leopard attack

**Ramtek 7 June (NAGPUR POST/TC):** Incidents of attacks by wild animals like leopards and tigers in rural areas of Ramtek taluka do not seem to stop. On Wednesday morning, a leopard killed two calves tied together in a farm cowshed. This incident has created an atmosphere of panic in the area. A leopard attacked the animals tied in the farm of Damodar Kupale, a resident of Dongri in Ramtek forest area, on Tuesday-Wednesday night and killed two calves. According to the information received, farmer Damodar Kupale had tied his animals in the farm's cowshed

as usual on Tuesday evening and returned home. When he reached the farm on Wednesday morning, the two calves were found dead. Farmer Damodar Kupale informed the villagers and Ramtek forest circle officials about this development. On receiving information about the incident, the concerned forest officials reached the spot and conducted a panchnama of the incident site.

They informed that a report would be prepared soon and submitted to the senior officials and the farmer would be provided with government assistance.

## Rajapeth Police Solve Two Theft Cases; Two Accused Arrested and Property Worth Rs1.45 Lakh Recovered

**NP Amravati, June 7:** In a significant breakthrough, Rajapeth Police have successfully cracked two separate theft cases by arresting two accused involved in crimes of snatching and theft. The combined property recovered in both cases is valued at Rs1.45 lakh.

In the first case, complainant Vaishali Mahendrarav Chincholkar, a Recovery Officer at HDFC Bank, Dastur Nagar, Amravati, lodged a complaint at Rajapeth Police Station. According to her report, on June 3, 2025, at around 8:00

PM, while she was carrying Rs21,000 in a bag and boarding her vehicle, an unknown person snatched the bag containing the cash, removed the money, discarded the bag, and fled the scene.

Following the incident, Crime No. 273/2025 under Section 304(2) of the Indian Penal Code was registered. During the investigation, with the help of CCTV footage from the crime scene and reliable intelligence inputs, police detained one suspect identified as Akshay Kishor Meshram (30), a resident of Mahadeokhori, Amravati.

Upon interrogation, the accused confessed to the crime.

Out of the stolen Rs21,000, police found that Rs18,000 had already been deposited into the accused's bank account. The said account has since been frozen. Additionally, a Vespa moped (MH 27 DP 1452) valued at Rs80,000, used in the commission of the crime, was seized. The total seized property in this case amounts to Rs98,000.

In another theft case, complainant Sudhir Ravindra Kapse, a professional photographer, reported that

on June 3, 2025, between 10:00 PM and 10:30 PM, his camera equipment was stolen from Mahendra Lawn, Saturna, Amravati. According to the complaint, a camera gimbal (stand) belonging to DGI RONIN, model RS3, worth Rs47,000, which was kept on the stage during a photography assignment, went missing. An unidentified thief had made away with the equipment.

A case was registered as Crime No. 271/2025 under Section 305(A) of the IPC. Based on CCTV footage and tip-offs from informants, police detained the accused

identified as Akshay alias Golu Ghanshyam Dubey (27), a resident of Vilas Nagar, Amravati. He confessed to the theft during questioning. The stolen gimbal, black and red in color and valued at Rs47,000, was recovered from his possession.

Both operations were carried out under the guidance of Police Commissioner Arvind Chawariya, Deputy Commissioner of Police (Zone 2) Ganesh Shinde, and Assistant Commissioner of Police Jaydatt Bhavar. The investigation and arrests were executed by

Adani Group contributes Rs.74,945 crore tax in FY25

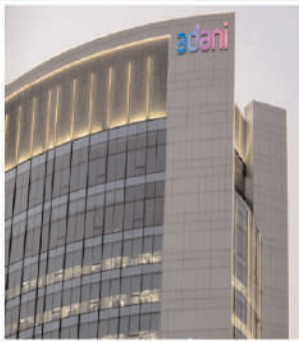
**Ahmedabad, June 07:**For fiscal year 2025, the Adani Group's total contribution to the exchequer increased by 29 percent to Rs.74,945 crore, from Rs.58,104 crore in FY 2023-24, through its portfolio of listed entities.

Of the total contribution of Rs.74,945 crore, direct contributions stood at Rs.28,720 crore, indirect contributions stood at Rs.45,407 crore, while other contributions added at ₹818 crore. Closing this chapter with gratitude: Piyush Chawla announces retirement from all forms of cricket

**NEW DELHI 7 June:** Veteran leg-spinner Piyush Chawla, who was part of India's two World Cup-winning campaigns, on Friday announced his retirement from all forms of cricket after a career spanning more than two decades to undertake a "new journey" that he did not specify. The 36-year-old made the announcement via an Instagram post."After more than two decades on the field, the time has come to bid adieu to the beautiful game," Chawla wrote.

"Though I step away from the crease, cricket will always live within me. I now look forward to embarking on a new journey, carrying with me the spirit and lessons of this beautiful game," he said. Chawla was a member of India's T20 and ODI World Cup-winning squads in 2007 and 2011 respectively. He represented India in three Tests, 25 ODIs, and seven T20Is, taking 43 wickets across the three formats of the game.

"From representing India at the highest level to being part of the victorious 2007 T20 World Cup and 2011 ODI World Cup squads, every moment in this incredible journey has been nothing short of abetting. These memories will forever remain etched in my heart," Chawla said in the post. "A heartfelt thank you to the IPL franchises who placed their trust in me - Punjab Kings, Kolkata Knight Riders, Chennai Super Kings, and Mumbai Indians.

The Indian Premier League has been a truly special chapter in my career, and I have cherished every moment playing in it. I owe my deepest gratitude to my coaches, Shri KK Gautam and Late Shri Pankaj Saraswat for nurturing and shaping me into the cricketer I became," he said. "Today is a deeply emotional day for me as I officially announce my retirement from all forms of international and domestic cricket," he added.

The leg-spinner was a part of KKR's 2014 IPL-winning team and hit the winning runs for the Gautam Gambhir-led side in the summit clash against the Punjab Kings in Bengaluru. "A special mention to my late father, whose belief in me lit the path I walked. Without him, this journey would never have been possible," he stated.

Chawla made his competitive cricket debut at 15, and also represented India Under-19 and Uttar Pradesh Under-22 sides. He burst onto the scene when he bowled Sachin Tendulkar with a googly in the Challenger Series 2005-06, and made his first-class debut at 17. Chawla has over 1000 wickets across formats in domestic cricket.



Junior wrestlers handed ban in fake birth-certificate scam; MCD admits lapse

**NEW DELHI 7, June:** In a major age-fraud case, the Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) announced a ban on nearly 30 junior wrestlers after they were found to have procured and submitted fake birth certificates, predominantly obtained from areas under the Municipal Corporation of Delhi's (MCD) Narela and Rohini jurisdictions among its 12 administrative zones. Fake birth certificates of the junior athletes procured from identical addresses came to light after an investigation revealed a network involving wrestlers, coaches and officials from the MCD, all working in collusion within the Capital's municipal zones that border neighbouring Haryana. Additionally, Yash Kumar, a reigning Khelo India Youth Games (KIYG) gold medalist in men's 80kg freestyle, has been directed to undergo a 'bone test' to determine his actual age following revelations of repeated tampering with his date of birth (DOB) on his Aadhar card. Until the medical verification process is concluded, Yash will not receive any Khelo India incentives. Yash, who according to the federation is physically over 20 years of age was recently disqualified from representing Delhi in an under-17 national wrestling competition on the grounds of being overage. The governing body is now scrutinising around 400 cases from Haryana alone in which young athletes are suspected of using fake certificates from Delhi to become eligible for younger age-group events.

The main objective appears to be securing college admissions and potential government jobs. Passports given to the WFI revealed residential addresses in Rohtak, Haryana, and Sonapat. The WFI made queries to several zones of the Municipal Corporation of Haryana (MCH), as well as the North Delhi



Municipal Corporation (NDMC) and Delhi Cantonment Board (DCB), exposing the extensive scale of the age-fraud case. It was revealed that nearly all wrestlers under review had secured fake birth certificates from identical place of registration - in Begumpur under the Narela jurisdiction and Mangolpuri in the Rohini zone. A detailed scrutiny of original birth certificates from Haryana municipal authorities, as well as passports, revealed actual birthplaces and addresses in Rohtak, Jhajjar, and Sonapat, in addition to differing DOBs. Most of the wrestlers were born between 2006-2009 but had birth certificates registered in 2021-2022, indicating a disparity of nearly 14-15 years. In one instance, Dipanshu cited his DOB as 26/10/2009, with a birth certificate registration date of 06/01/2021, obtained from one of the same addresses - Rajeev Nagar, Begumpur, North West Delhi 110086. The federation checks with the department of health services, Municipal Corporation Rohtak, revealed his true DOB as 16/10/2006, with his home in Rainak Pura village, Rohtak. Similarly, national-level wrestler Rohit Gulia was found to have manipulated

personal data repeatedly, including DOB changes and unauthorised Aadhar updates (seven times from 2013 to 2021). His official birth certificate from the Municipal Corporation of Rohtak documented his DOB as 17/10/1999, while he declared it as 17/10/2001 in national competitions. Both Dipanshu and Rohit have now been banned by WFI from all future tournaments. WFI president Sanjay Singh has written to Delhi chief minister Rekha Gupta to act against MCD officials. "What is particularly alarming is the frequency of such (false) certificates being issued after a considerable lapse of time.

This is contrary to the normal practice, wherein birth certificates are typically issued within one- or two-months following birth. The Narela zone, situated close to the Haryana border, has seen a disproportionately high number of such delayed issuances. I urge your office to kindly direct the concerned authorities in all MCD zones to exercise strict scrutiny and restraint in issuing birth certificates where the application is made after an unusually long delay," he added. MCD has admitted to the lapse and said it will probe this issue.

Monthly GST payment form 3B to become non-editable from July tax period



**New Delhi, 8 June:** GST Network (GSTN) on Saturday said the monthly GST payment form GSTR-3B will become non-editable from the July 2025 tax period. In an advisory, GSTN said taxpayers can make changes in declared outward supplies in GSTR-1A before filing their GSTR-3B in the same return period. Such changes will be auto-populated in tax payment form GSTR-3B. "From the July 2025 tax period for which form GSTR 3B will be furnished in August 2025, such auto populated liability will become non-editable. "Thus, taxpayers will be allowed to amend their auto-populated liability by making amendments through form GSTR 1A, which can be filed for the same tax period before filing of GSTR 3B," GSTN said.

GSTR-3B, a summary statement and monthly GST payment form, is filed in a staggered manner between the 20th, 22nd and 24th of every month for different categories of taxpayers. Currently, the GST portal provides a pre-filled GSTR-3B, where the tax liability gets auto-populated based on the outward supplies declared in GSTR-1/ GSTR-1A IFF. As of now, taxpayers can edit such auto-populated values in form GSTR 3B itself. AMRG & Associates Senior Partner Rajat Mohan said the move to make GSTR-3B non-editable aims to tighten data consistency between GSTR-1 and GSTR-3B and curb revenue leakages. However, the availability of GSTR-1A for corrections before filing GSTR-3B is a welcome safeguard. "Taxpayers must now ensure real-time reconciliation and error correction before the return is filed. This places greater responsibility on businesses to enhance internal controls and avoid last-minute adjustments," Mohan added.

## For 17 years, she moved mountains: Chenab bridge expert recalls challenges to 'century-old dream'

Gali Madhavi Latha has lost count of how often the mountain slopes flanking the Chenab river sprang hidden surprises, forcing her team into real-time redesigns as they wrestled to build the world's highest railway arch bridge. Through their 17 years on the project, Latha and her colleagues embraced a "design-as-you-go" philosophy to build the 1,315-metre steel bridge, 359 metres above the Chenab, that Prime Minister Narendra Modi is to inaugurate on Friday. The bridge — 35 metres taller than the Eiffel Tower — is part of the 272km Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla rail link that features 36 tunnels and 943 bridges and will fulfil a century-old idea to connect Jammu and Srinagar through a railway line. A Vande Bharat train will run between Jammu and Srinagar along this route. "We knew from the start this would be an intensely challenging project," said Latha, a rock mechanics specialist and professor of civil engineering at the Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore, and a consultant for the project.

"What we didn't know were the



secrets the Mountain would throw at us," she told The Telegraph on Thursday.

The challenge was clear from the terrain, the geology and the sheer difficulty of just reaching the site, Latha said. She had first surveyed the site in 2005 after a boat ride along the Chenab and a gruelling climb up the steep mountain slopes on foot. That was 17 years before the construction was completed in 2022, with the last few years spent on exercises such as trial runs. The bridge required some 28,660 tonnes of steel — equivalent to nearly four Eiffel Towers — plus 66,000 cubic metres of

concrete and 26km of motorable roads to bring in cranes, other equipment and workers. Designed to last 120 years and handle train speeds up to 100kmph, the bridge can remain operational at 30kmph even if one of its eight piers fails.

The bridge has been built to withstand the forces of the earthquakes typically expected in the Himalayan region. When engineers from Northern Railway and Afcons Infrastructure, the private entity engaged in the construction, began cutting into the slopes, they encountered several unexpected features in the rocks that required the engineers to revise the slope stability calculations. They discovered fragmented rocks held together by joints and hidden cavities — features that were not evident during the early ground surveillance ahead of construction but heightened the risk of rockslides. "Our objective was to design for worst-case scenarios to minimise the risk of rockslides," Latha said.

Once, an old aunty opened the door & was shocked when she saw me. She said, 'I never knew women deliver letters too!' She called me inside & gave me a glass of cold water! She even offered me food but I politely refused," she said. Further, Akanksha shared "one of the best moments of her life". "Once when I was coming back home after a tiring day at work, a young girl who lived close by came to me & said, 'Didi, I want to be a postwoman too!' I was so touched!" she wrote.

Akanksha revealed that in the past 3 years, she has delivered more than 1 lakh letters to people. She said that her parents are proud of her too.

At just seven years old, Samyuktha Narayanan isn't merely practicing Taekwondo—she's teaching it. Her journey from a toddler in a dobok (the traditional uniform worn by Taekwondo practitioners during training and



competitions) to becoming the world's youngest Taekwondo instructor is a tale of grit, passion, and a family legacy deeply rooted in martial arts. But Samyuktha's story isn't just about breaking records—it's about inspiring an entire generation to believe that no dream is too big, and no age too early, to start chasing it. At just seven years and 270 days old, Samyuktha Narayanan from Tamil Nadu's Madurai etched her name in history as the

world's youngest Taekwondo instructor, according to Guinness World Records. Samyuktha Narayanan achieved this remarkable feat on August 14, 2024. Samyuktha was practically raised on a dojo mat. Her parents, Shruthy and Narayanan, run the Madurai Taekwondo Academy, and their passion for martial arts naturally flowed into their daughter's life. She took her first martial arts steps at age

three. Inspiration runs deep in her family.

Her mother, Shruthy, once held a Guinness World Record for most elbow strikes in one minute, while her father, Narayanan, boasts records like breaking 29 flaming concrete blocks in 30 seconds. No surprise that Samyuktha aimed for greatness too. With Narayanan as her coach, Samyuktha began a disciplined journey—gradually advancing from a white belt to earning her black belt from the prestigious World Taekwondo Headquarters in Korea.

Her daily routine was nothing short of heroic. She trained like a pro—running 5 km, enduring intense workouts, and mastering complex Taekwondo techniques. Every drop of sweat pushed her closer to the black belt and her eventual world record.
