The mystery behind 25 percent tariff

We call US President Donald Trump a Tughlag like ruler. He has attacked India yet again. He claims that it is a grave crime to buy crude oil from Russia, and according to him, it may be true to a certain extent as well. According to his own opinion, he has claimed that he stopped India-Pakistan war more than three dozen times. Now, he alleges that the crude oil we buy from Russia means that we are helping warmongering Russia achieve its nefarious designs, and he claims that he has imposed a 25% penalty due to the same reason. Whatever this creature called Donald Trump may be, let us now think about how much India benefits from the Indian policy of buying crude oil from Russia. That is, many exporters in the country will be affected by Trump's 25% tarrif hike, so they will also face difficult times. Thousands of employees may end up becoming unemployed. Our Prime Minister says that I can bear my personal loss for sake of benefit of the people of our country. What this personal loss means should also be clarified in the relevant context. The war between Russia and Ukraine that has been going on since February 25, 2022 is still going on unabated. Before thewar, we were importing crude oil from Russia at the same price as per the global oil prices. Our imports from Russia were 0.22% of our total imports. After that, Russia gave us a concessional facility to import at a lower rate of 20 % to 30%. Russia may have given such a concession because it needed funds for sake of running its military operations. Till then, we were buying oil in large quantities only from oil-rich Muslim countries. Nowlook at the irony of this purchase, our government owns three companies. One of them is Indian Oil Corporation, the second is BPCL and the third is another important company, along with which it is said that one company still does this work. These companies were importing only 25% of the total crude oil imports. Out of these two companies were important from the point of view of importing 75% of crude oil from Russia. One of them is Naira and the other is Reliance. These two Gujarati companies bought 75% of the crude oil and refined it and supplied it in turn to European companies and countries. Afew days ago America banned Naira because some Russian directors were involved in it. Ambani's Reliance had a free run until now. Whatever the current situation may be, Ambani's companies alone have benefited from these exports to the tune of Rs 600 billion. We do not have detailed figures for the other Gujarati company. That is, a 25% tariff has been imposed on our entire country for the so called fault of merely two Gujarati companies. Now Gujarat is also a part and parcel our country. The prosperity of these four Gujarati companies should be considered as the prosperity of the country and we should be happy therefore. Because these three poor government companies have not given a single penny to any class of the country, whether it is the super rich. the rich middle class or the common people, that is, they have only increased their own profits and that of their kin. As we said above, it is better not to guess how many companies will be adversely affected by this move in the near future. This is the crude story of the mysterious import of Russian crude oil. Jai Gujarat! Jai Bharat!!

In India, Trump's tariffs spark calls to boycott US goods

New Delhi 11 August: From McDonald's and Coca-Colato Amazon and Apple, US-based multinationals are facing calls for a boycott in India as business executives and Prime Minister Narendra Modi's supporters stoke anti-American sentiment to protest against US tariffs. India, the world's most populous nation, is a key market for American brands that have rapidly expanded to target a growing base of affluent consumers, many of whom remain infatuated with international labels seen as symbols of moving up in life. India, for example, is the biggest market by users for Meta's WhatsApp and Domino's has more restaurants than any other brand in the country. Beverages like Pepsi and Coca-Cola often dominate store shelves, and people still queue up when a new Apple store opens or a Starbucks cafe doles out discounts. Although there was no immediate indication of sales being hit, there's a growing chorus both on social media and offline to buy local and ditch American products after Donald Trump imposed a 50% tariff on goods from India, rattling exporters and damaging ties between New Delhi and Washington. McDonald's, Coca-Cola, Amazon and Apple did not immediately respond to Reuters queries. Manish Chowdhary, co-founder of India's Wow Skin Science, took to LinkedIn with a video message urging support for farmers and startups to make "Made in India" a "global obsession," and to learn from South Korea whose food and beauty products are famous worldwide."We have lined up for products from thousands of miles away. Kendras suspended

Bhandara 11 August (NAGPUR POST/DC): Fertiliser licenses of 4 Krushi Seva Kendras in Bhandara district have been temporarily suspended due to non-compliance of stocks during a surprise inspection carried out by the district flying squad of the agriculture department. The action was taken under the leadership of in-charge District Superintendent of Agriculture Officer Kishor Patrikar.

The newly appointed quality inspectors in Bhandara district have conducted an extensive inspection and have completed the inspection of 137 retailers and 13 wholesalers. At the taluka level of Bhandara district, notices have also been issued by the quality inspectors to 31 Krushi Kendras and further action will be taken against them after gathering of further evidence. According to information received from the Department of Agriculture, it was clarified that it is the responsibility of the sellers to follow the appropriate government guidelines, and strict action will be taken if any stocking related irregularities or malpractices are found.

License revoking period and Krushi Seva Kendras on which action has been taken are as follows: Jai Bharat Krushi Kendra, Ganeshpur - 15 days, RM Krushi Kendra, Navargaon - 30 days, Parmatma Ek Krushi Kendra, Mohadura – 10 days, Pawan Krushi Kendra, Khapa - 15 days. After selling fertiliser, it is necessary to update the information in the POS machine as per the guidelines. If this information is not updated and the concerned seller is found to have a large stock of fertiliser accumulated, then there could be a question about how the demand came from the concerned district even after the central government also had provided fertilisers. Against this backdrop, appropriate action has been taken, said Kishor Patrikar, in-charge, District Superintendent Agriculture Officer, Bhandara.

Painful sighs of small street vendors forces one to do soul searching

Nagpur 11 August: Small street vendors often suffer significant losses. People frequently pick peanuts or other items from their carts without paying, causing a daily loss estimated at around Rs 20-Rs 30. For vendors surviving on minimal daily sales, this loss shatters their income

Many can't tolerate this and sigh in pain, but all they can utter is a helpless "Sir!" because what else can a poor and struggling person say?

From a moral perspective, no one has the

right to take even a small amount of food from these vendors' carts without paying-even if it's just a radish, cucumber, bitter gourd, brinjal, or green peas. Senior citizen Dr. M. A. Rasheed suggests that vendors selling simple items like coconuts, sesame laddoos, puffed rice snacks, or papdi don't make significant profits, nor do ordinary vegetable sellers earn much

Hence, we should never take any items from their stalls without paying, nor should we even ask for them for free.

However, all these 90 workers are ready to work as per old wages. These workers have performed their duty well even during the Coronavirus pandemic, risking their very lives. However, while implementing the new tender's guidelines, these old and experienced workers are being appointed without giving priority to these workers and new workers are being appointed.
